WALLING FILES EXPENSE ITEMS

Justice of Supreme Court Spent Less Than \$50

HARRISBURG, May 24.—Campaign expense accounts filed at the State Department by candidates at the primaries show that Henry S. Ackerman, Democrat, delegate at large, spent \$90, and William E. Rice, Republican delegate at large, \$77. Emory A. Walling, Justice of the Supreme Court, whom politicians thought would be elected at the primaries and was prevented from winning an election by Charles Palmer, filed his account, showing he spent less than \$50.

'DELIBERATE FALSIFIER,' CRY PRIESTS IN DENIAL OF ATTACK ON MITCHELL

Didn't Conspire to Wreck New York Mayor's Administration. They Say—'He's Lost His Head'

ECHO OF WIRE TAPPING

NEW YORK, May 24.—Mayor Mitchell's charges before the Thompson Legislative Committee that certain priests of the New York Archdiocese had conspired to wreck his administration met with emphatic denial today from leading Catholic officials.

Father William Farrell, the tapping of whose telephone resulted in the indictment yesterday of Charles Commissioner John A. Kingsbury and the latter's attorney, declared the Mayor's statement before the Thompson Committee a succession of falsehoods.

Developments in the charities investigation, culminating in indictments by the Kings County Grand Jury and Mayor Mitchell's allegations, have caused one of the greatest sensations in the history of New York.

It became known today that District Attorney Swann, of New York County, would conduct a John Doe investigation of charges that the police have tapped 350 wires since January 1, 1915, and "listened in" on conversation.
