CIVIC EXPOSITION GIVES "POINTERS" ON "PESTS" THAT MENACE HEALTH

"Pat the Rat, Flop the Fly and Mangle the Mosquito," Health Department Says

MANY VALUABLE TIPS

It being clean-up week, the Department of Public Health and Charities, one of the ex-hibitors, at the Philadelphia Today and To-morrow Civic Exposition, is distributing in the Commercial Museum, 34th and Appuce streets, circulars advising house eccupants to but the rat, flop the fly and mangle the mosquito.

Concerning the first the pamphlet states: The rat, besides causing loss amounting to millions of dollars yearly by its de-structive habits, is a menace to the public

And this about the fly: "House files are fifthy and dangerous to human life. Born in fifth, reared in fifth, they feed upon fifth and carry fith with them, not only causing annoyance but marking a trail of disease and death wherever they go."

In this fashion is the mosquito described "Mosquitos are pests. They annoy us and destroy our peace and happiness on pleasant summer evenings. They are a menace to health, not only Lecause they interfere with the rest we should have by undisturbed sleep, but also because they are arrivers of disease. carriers of disease.

Now for the fly. One of him has been known to be the central distributing agency for 350,000 germs. This does not include the number that was inside of him. Flies carry germs inside and outside. The fly is even more indifferent to his environment than the rat. If human beings were flies, there would be no need of reformers. They are happy any old place.

Clean-up week reformers might be in-torested in this bit of advice: "Keep gar-hage receptacles tightly covered and, if esible, protect these receptacles by cens, so that flies cannot reach the gar-ge. See that collections are made promptly and that no refuse remains upon the ground. If you live where garbage is not collected, then burn or bury it. Use chioride of lime freely in receptacles and about places where they are kept. Keep the stable clean. Screen all drainage structures. Pour kerosone into drains. Destroy cuspidors which are filled with or ashes. Screen windows and doors. Keep flies away from the sick. Kill the flies as wast as they appear in the spring. Keep everything clean and starve at least some of them to death."
