Horse Show to Open Today With Large Attendance.  
Many Persons Will Come From Other  
Cities for Annual Affair

RAIN or shine every one will go out to Devon today for the Horse Show, which will be held during four days this week on the spacious grounds near the station which are used every year for this event. This year will be one of the biggest occasions, for literally every one is at home, either in town or the suburbs, and so the world and his wife will attend. There will be, of course, the usual number of box parties.

To spread the spirit of Americanism among their beneficiaries the women constituting the committee of the Southwark Neighborhood House have completed all plans for the big Festival and Procession which they are to give at 2:30 o'clock next Saturday at the new place, West School House Lane, Germantown.

The occasion has been widely advertised as the Festival of Apollo, which will consist of Pythian games, The Masque of Persephone and a procession of Greek youths and maidens. There will be a musical contest, athletic contests and the Delphic Oracle will prophesy the future.

The Masque of Persephone will be presented by the children of the Southwark Neighborhood House and the athletic contest will be under the direction of Michael Dorcas, the famous all-around athlete of the University of Pennsylvania.

The athletic contests will consist of running races, wrestling, competition in throwing the discus and javelin.

The many activities of the Southwark Neighborhood House, and the vast amount of good work that it yearly accomplishes, are shown in the annual report of the organization recently issued.

There are 421 pupils in classes for cooking, sewing, embroidery, carpentering, singing, dancing, dramatics and music. There are 539 members of different clubs.

Dental clinics are held twice a week, where hundreds of persons are treated.

There is a baby clinic, a library, a savings fund, a coal savings fund, story and playhouses for little children, moving pictures and open house dances.

The Southwark Neighborhood House works in co-operation with the Bureau of Health and Charities, The Child Federation, The Civic Club of Philadelphia and Drexel, Temple and Beechwood Domestic Science Schools, which provide cooking and sewing teachers.

Last year's disbursements were \$3,251.03, and because this budget is too small to carry on such important work this Festival of Apollo has been promoted to procure the needed added funds and bids fair to be an unqualified success.
