#### Sacred Consistorial Congregation Orders Obedience to the **Baltimore** Canon

Dances and balls for charity or other bious purposes may be forbidden to Catho-Res, following a pronouncement of the Sarred Consistorial Congregation, in Rome, in which a canon of the Third Plenary Council, of Baltimore, which ordered the ramoval of "that abuse in which entertaluments and balls are held for the purpose of promoting pious objects" is ordered to be obeyed.

No decision will be made, however, until the matter is submitted to the local church authorities for interpretation. The decision ii, this section rests entirely with Arch-bishop Prendergast, who will state it after further. Information has arrived from

The decree, dated March 3, of this year refers to the Baltimore canon ordering priorits to remove entirely the "abuse" in which dances and entertainments are used or charity and other plous purposes, and adds that "what was very wisely and just-ly ordered in the beginning, gradually com-menced to fall into oblivion, and the use of Bails again flourished and even apread into the neighboring Dominion of Canada."

The decree then orders that the decision The decree then orders that the decisions of the Baltimore Council we obeyed and that "all priests, secular and regular, and other clerics are absolutely forbidden to promote or foster the said balls, even though in aid of and in support of pious works or any other plous end: moreover, all clerics are forbidden to be present at these balls if they happen to be promoted by laymen."
