

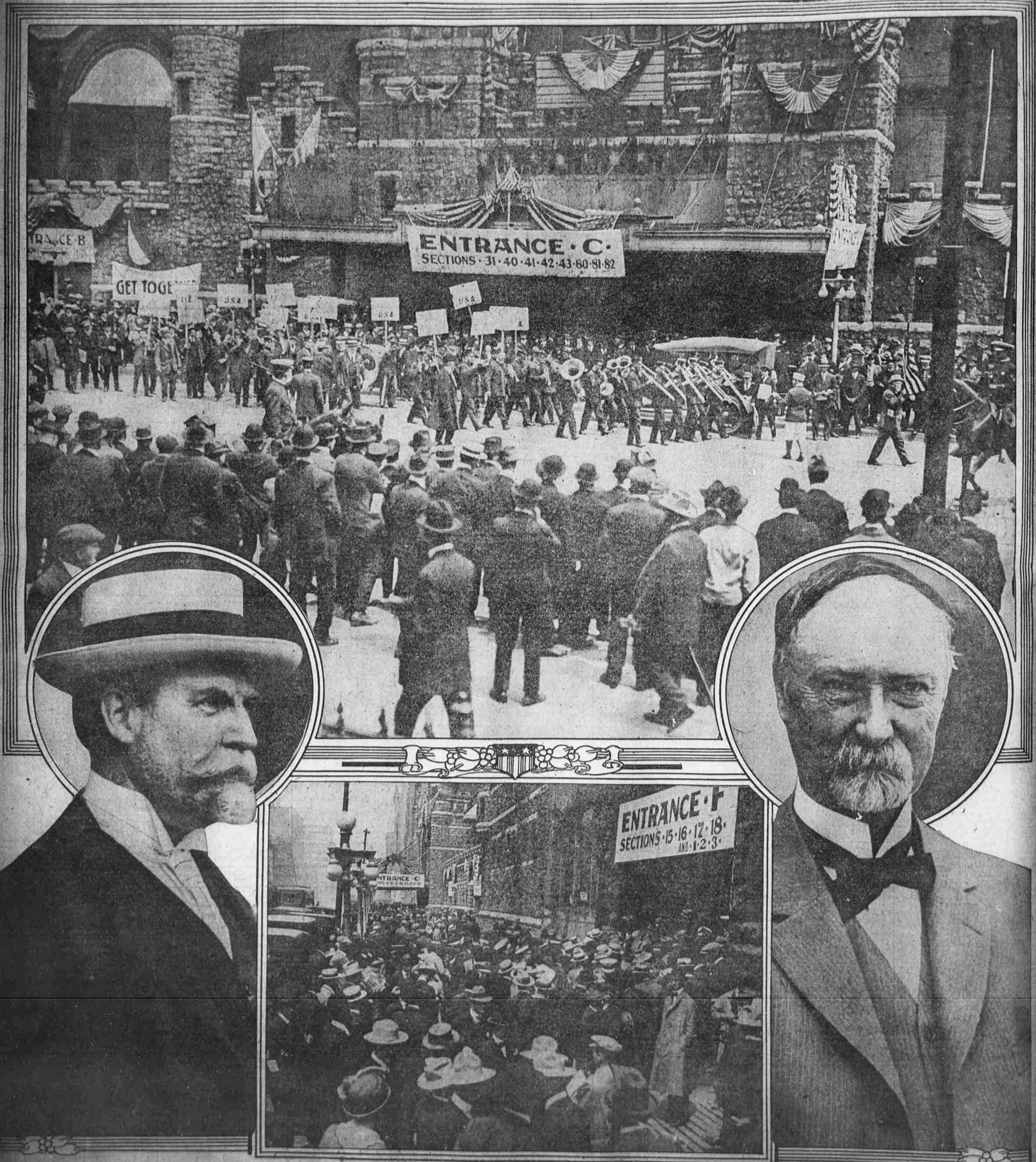

SIDELIGHTS AND SCENERY NOTED AROUND THE CORNERS OF THE CONVENTION HALL IN CHICAGO



The picture at the top of the page shows the final attempt of the Bull Moose to influence the Republican convention at Chicago. The Roosevelt boosters marched past the Coliseum with brass bands and other noise paraphernalia in an effort to get the delegates to vote for Roosevelt. At the left, below, is the latest photograph of Charles Evans Hughes, Republican candidate for President of the United States. The picture was taken after Mr. Hughes had sent his telegram to Chairman Harding, accepting the nomination. At the right is Charles Warren Fairbanks, Vice President during Roosevelt's term of office and chosen to be Hughes' running mate in the present campaign. The view in the centre shows the crowds trying to force an entrance into the Coliseum during the counting of the third ballot, upon which Hughes was nominated.
