RUSH TO ENLIST AMAZES OFFICERS OF GUARD; WILL LEAVE ON SATURDAY

Continued from Page One. The places in the National Guard left vacant when the present force goes out of the State.

Two hundred men, waiting at the 1st Regiment Army last night to be examined by surgeons preliminary to enlistment for service in Mexico, became excited when they heard a rumor that the maximum war strength had been nearly reached.

According to rumors from Washington today there is a belief that the National Guard details of Pennsylvania and New York are to be sent direct to Mexico and Vera Cruz instead of performing patrol duty along the Mexican border.

Colonel Charles C. Allen, commanding the 1st Regiment, who is also a Captain in the regular service, when apprised of these reports today, said: "Such a movement is altogether possible, I do not care to say that it is probable, but it is altogether possible that such a plan may be followed."

Other regimental commanders expressed cautious and similar views. They were themselves, while not in close touch as their officers with the army and change will be decided upon. They are anxious for active service, and heartily favor any proposition that tends to take them to the front as soon as possible.

MEXICO WAR PLAN AIMS AT PERSHING TROOPERS FIRST

Obregon Said to Have Entire Campaign Planned if Break Comes TO QUIT BORDER POSTS

EL PASO, June 21.—Information obtained by the Intelligence Department of the United States Army is understood to indicate that General Obregon, Carranza's Minister of War, and his subordinates have developed a plan of campaign in the event of war against the United States, substantially as follows:

First. The troops of Generals Gavira, Cavazos, Hertz and other commanders now hemming in General Pershing will make a general attack upon the American expeditionary force in western Chihuahua, at the same time cutting the line of communications with the border and striving to overwhelm the American army under Pershing before help can reach him.

Second. Matamoros, Piedras Negras, Nuevo Laredo, Juarez, Agua Prieta and Nogales, Sonora, will be immediately evacuated by their relatively small garrisons, after doing all damage possible to American cities and towns across the border by shell and rifle fire.

Third. In the event of too great pressure from the border the Mexican armies will gradually fall back along the railroad, which they will destroy, to converge on Chihuahua City, Torreon and in Sonora to Hermosillo and Guaymas.

Fourth. If the seaports of Tampico, Vera Cruz, Progreso, Guaymas, Matamoros and Manzanillo are bombarded, as is expected, they will be evacuated, their defenders taking up defensive positions inland.
