

BUSHES TO "DADDY"; KILLED
 Michael Vaughan, 2 1/2 Years Old, Struck by Trolley
 Michael Vaughan, 2 1/2 years old, of 1454 North Hutchinson street, was instantly killed early last night as a result of being struck by a trolley car at Hutchinson and Jefferson streets.

The youngster was rushing from his home to meet his father upon the latter's return from work. In attempting to make a short cut he darted from behind a pile of bricks of a building operation and stepped in front of an eastbound car on Jefferson street. He was removed to the Children's Homeopathic Hospital, where it was said death had been instantaneous.

FIND BABY IN FLOWER BOX
 Infant, Five Hours Old, Discovered in Bed of Geraniums
 An infant, five hours old, was found early today nestled in a bed of geraniums in front of the home of Harold Simons, at 6149 Arch street.

About 4 o'clock this morning Simons heard a faint cry. He traced it to the flower box, where he found the little one wrapped in rags, its tiny face almost completely covered with the blooms. He notified the police, who will send the child to the Philadelphia Hospital, and meanwhile an effort will be made to find the little girl's mother.

CUSTER WIDOW FORESAW FIGHT
 Predicted Another Massacre of Americans in Mexico
 BILLINGS, Mont., June 27.—In a letter written before the Carrizal massacre in Mexico and read here yesterday at exercises commemorating General Custer's last stand, Mrs. George A. Custer, widow of the Indian fighter, foretold the slaughter of Amer-

ican troops by the Carranzistas. She referred to the description of conditions by newspaper correspondents with General Pershing's troops as similar to those that confronted General Custer.
 "It is scarcely realized," she wrote, "how little supported and how poorly equipped are our men on treacherous Mexican soil. Unless there is better equipment and more troops sent, there will be another sacrifice of precious human life in Mexico as there was at this spot."
