

U. S. AVIATION CORPS READY TO AID ARMY

Propeller Troubles Righted and Machines Are Available for Mexico

WASHINGTON, June 29.—That the aviation branch of the Signal Corps is at last ready to play its part in the Mexican situation is the belief expressed by high army officials here as a result of several successful flights reported to have recently taken place on the border. One machine is now with General Pershing.

A solution of the propeller troubles has been found, and experts declare they will soon be able to use the 13 available machines on an especially hard wood. Experiments, which are so intensely arid as to warp and splinter the propeller blades, it has been necessary for army engineers to secure a particularly hard wood. Experiments with oak, Southern ash, birch and other woods were unsuccessful, and it was necessary to secure mahogany from Honduras of an extremely dry and tough fibrous. A rolled copper tip was used to protect the edges.

Aeroplanes in the border service are experiencing rough wear. Repairs are frequently necessary. It is estimated that every machine is practically rebuilt four or five times in a year.

They have been organized into a division of 13 planes, all of the same type, to make parts interchangeable and reduce the necessity of large repair supplies. The division is broken into three squadrons, each of which can be shifted from base to base.

An appropriation of \$3,000,000, it is estimated, would be necessary to equip an aviation corps large enough to serve an army of a half million men in case a campaign for volunteers to invade Mexico. This would provide for 21 divisions of 12 planes each for one year's service. No such appropriation has yet been asked of Congress. The estimate is based, however, on the present cost of maintaining a division—approximately \$500,000 a year.

ALLIED MUNITION STOCK AMPLE, HANOTAUX SAYS

Former Foreign Minister of France Declares Production Surpasses All Expectations

PARIS, June 29.—The Allies' production of munitions is at last in full swing. The French output surpasses all expectations. The British are going ahead without a hitch, while one of my friends who has returned from Petrograd tells me that the Russian factories give the impression of being ten times bigger than the Czecho-Slovak works. This production goes on simultaneously, so that an iron torrent may deluge the beleaguered Central Empires.

The Russian battle has scarcely begun. Italy is reaping the reward of her energetic resistance and Cetera's magnificent strategy. She knows that Austria has no more reserves to feed the Trentino front. In Macedonia Bulgaria is now thrown on her own resources. The Allies are in perfect condition and will play their role in the Balkan peninsula, which Austria has abandoned, perhaps forever.

While the foregoing is the European battle scene, Verdun remains the greatest of all combats. The civilization of the future will be decided there. We must hold on at all costs. Five great armies are now under way. Verdun—which was the first of the series—must render victorious the other four.
