\$70,000,000 Loan to Canada

WINNIPEG, Manitoba, July 10.—It is stated here that through the efforts of Mayor Richard Waugh, of Winnipeg, and Edward Brown, secretary of Manitoba, a loan of \$70,000,000 will be loaned to the city of Winnipeg and the provinces of Manitoba and Saskatchewan to pay off British bondholders. The loan is to be repaid by the two provinces \$20,000,000 each.
