

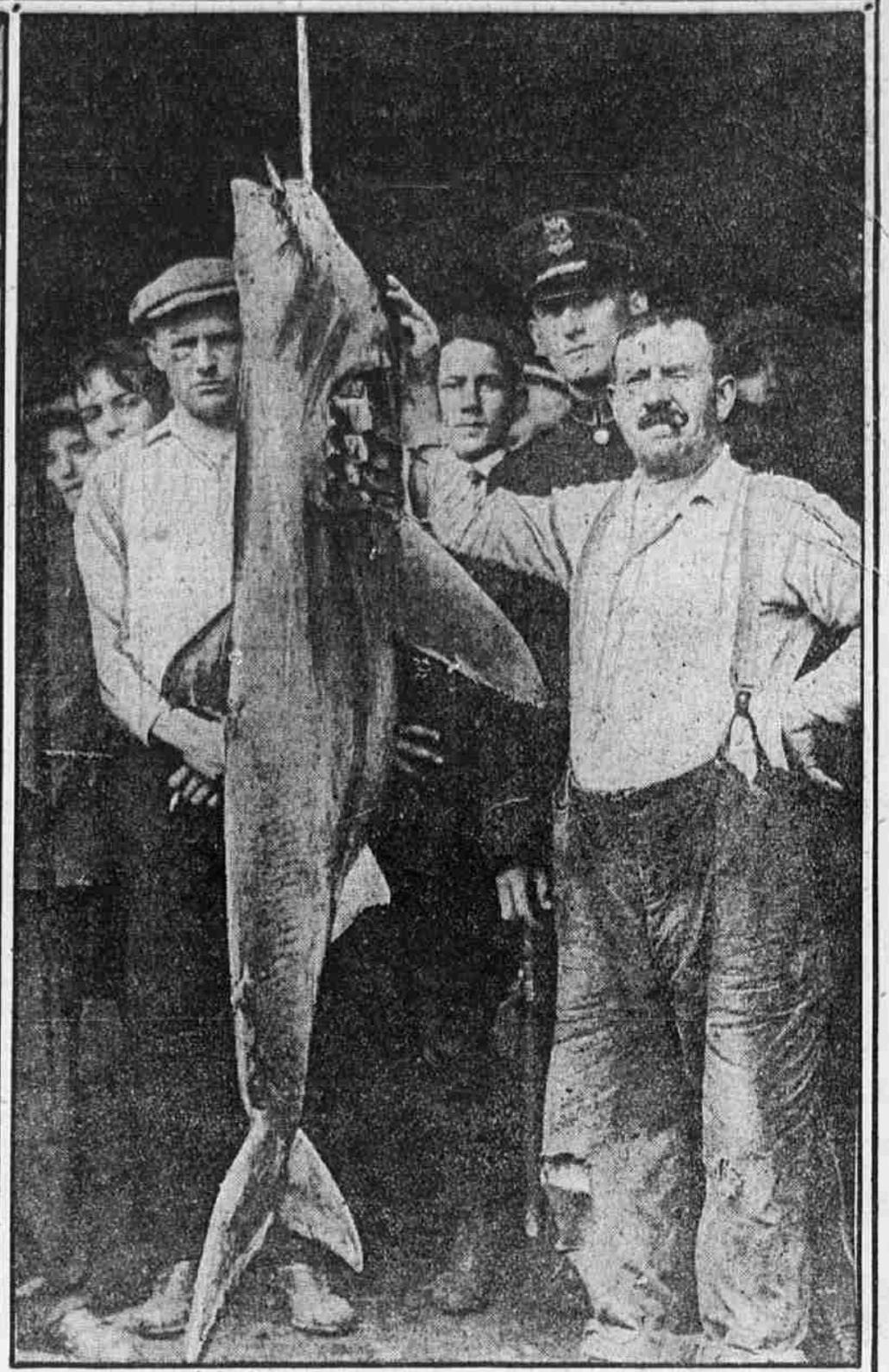

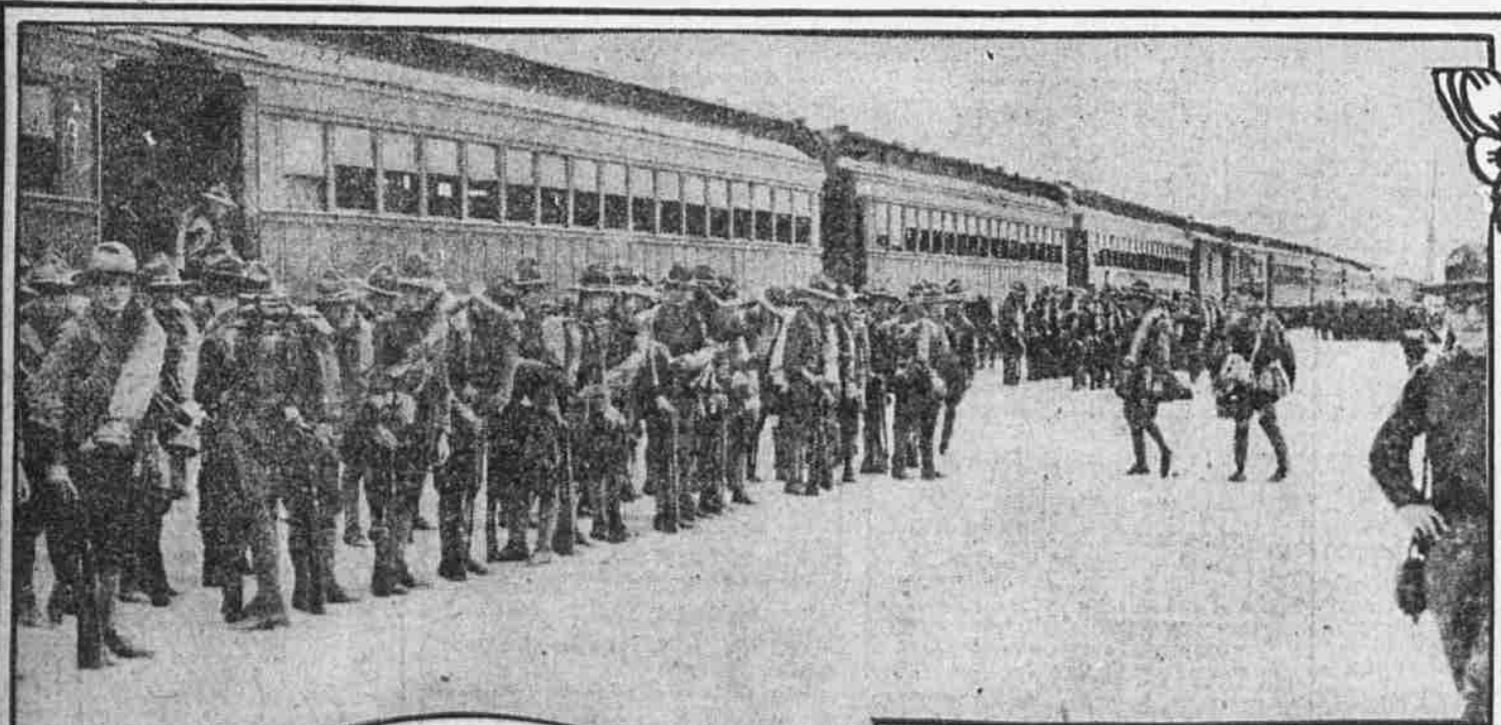

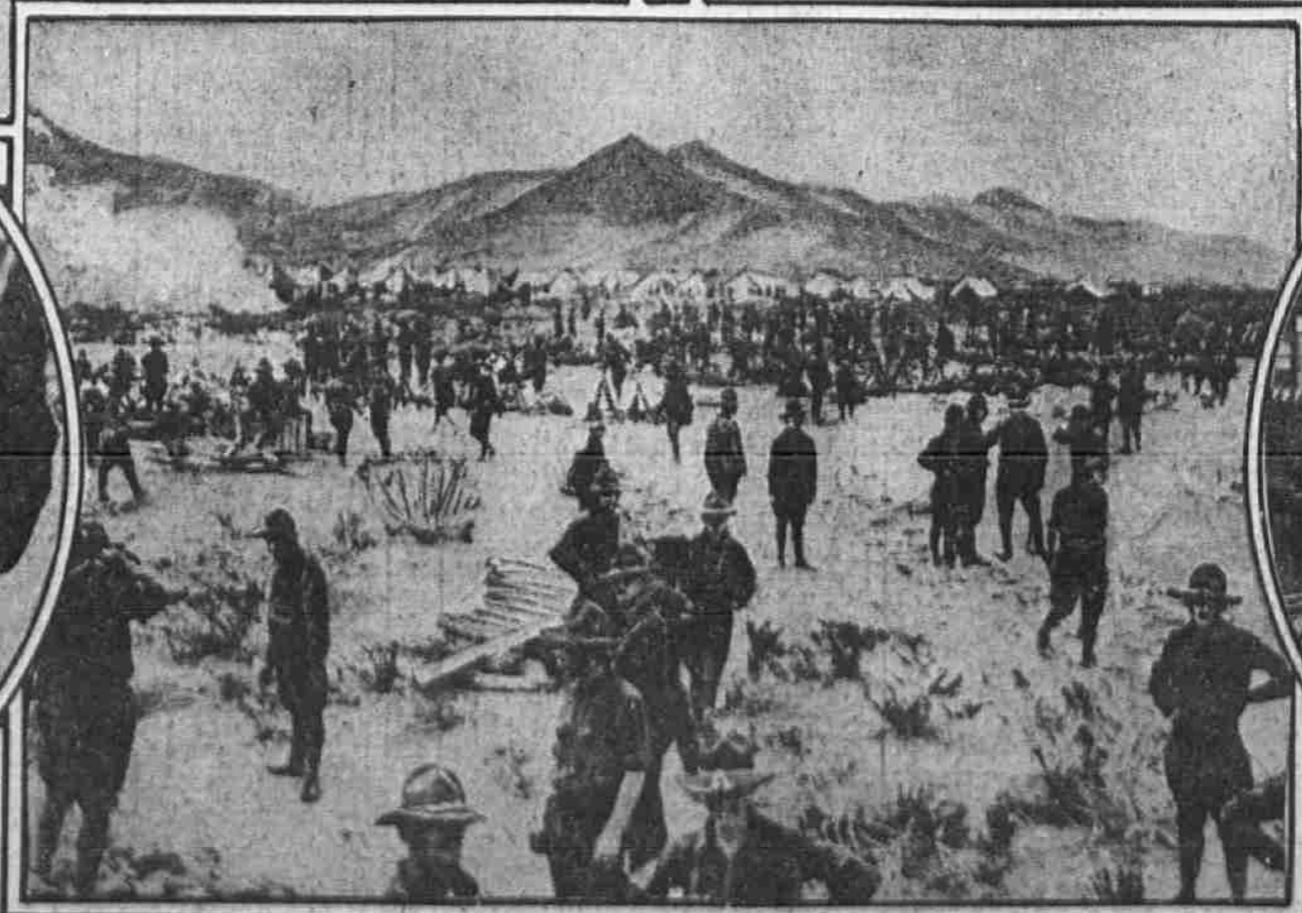
GERMS OF INFANTILE PARALYSIS ASK NO BETTER BREEDING BED  
This is Pemberton street, looking east from South 4th street, a spot evidently overlooked during the recent clean-up week.



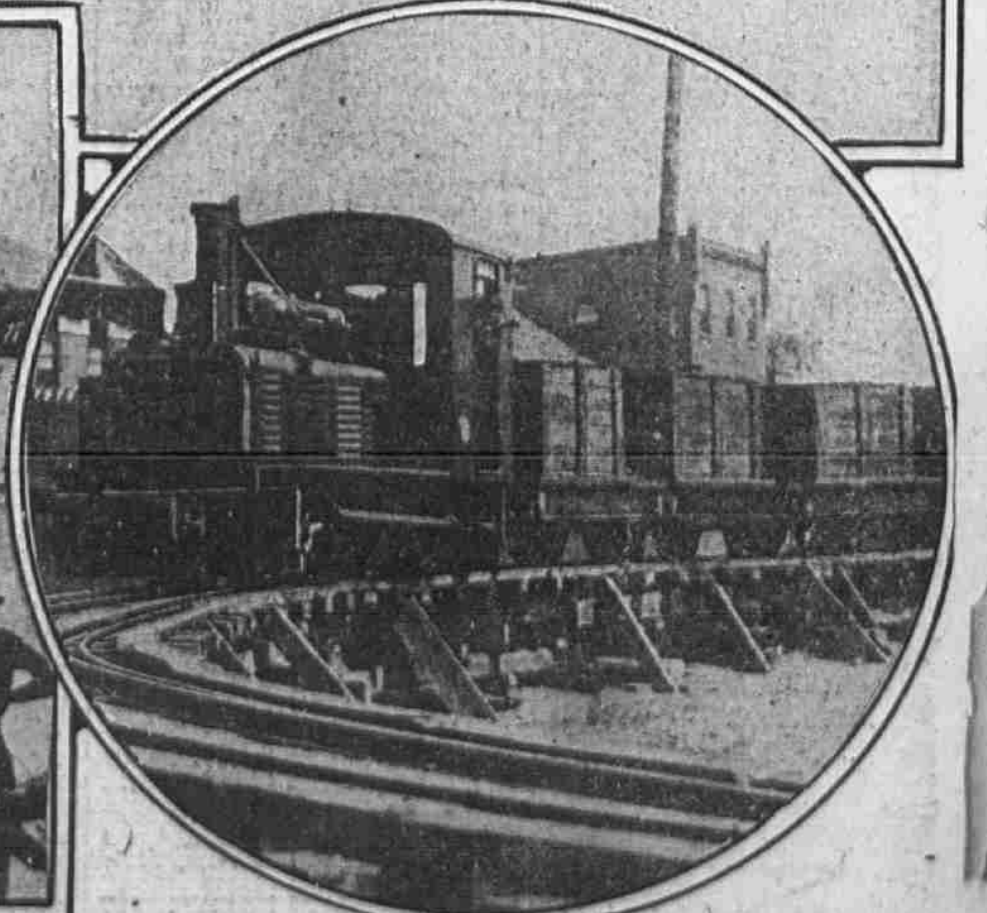
SHARKS GET NO MERCY NOWADAYS ON THE JERSEY COAST
