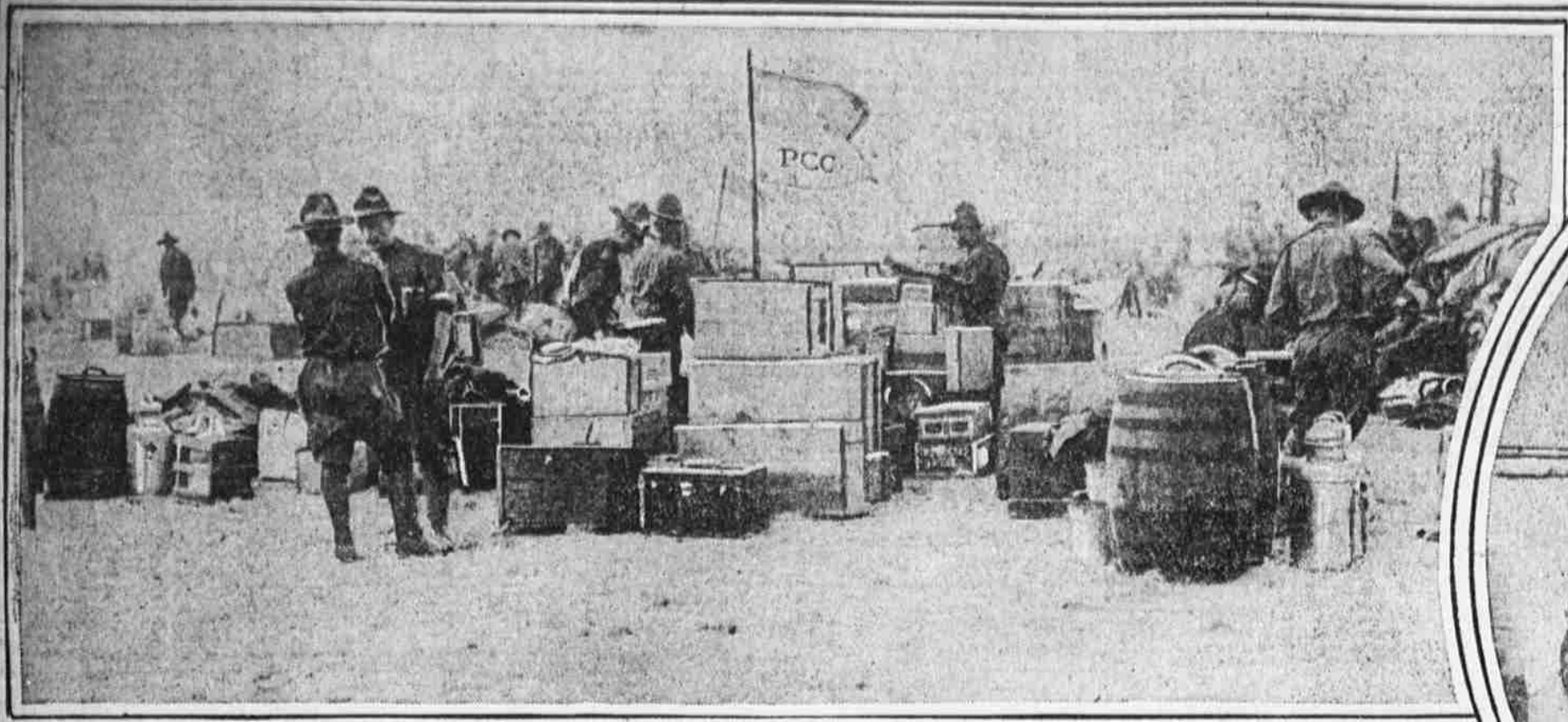
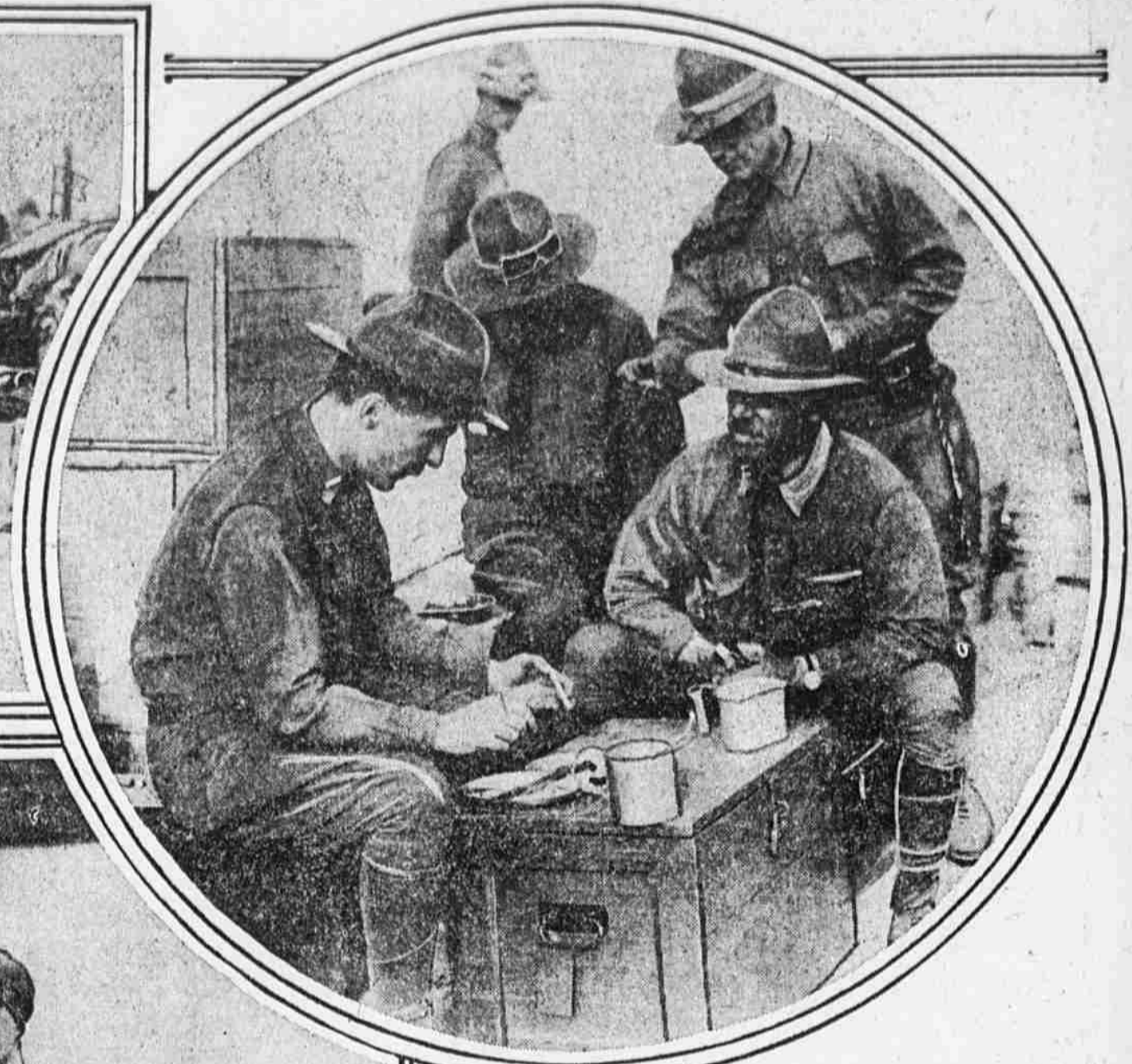

The young visitor to Atlantic City couldn't dream of Jocko missing his airing, so he is getting his constitutional in his own machine.

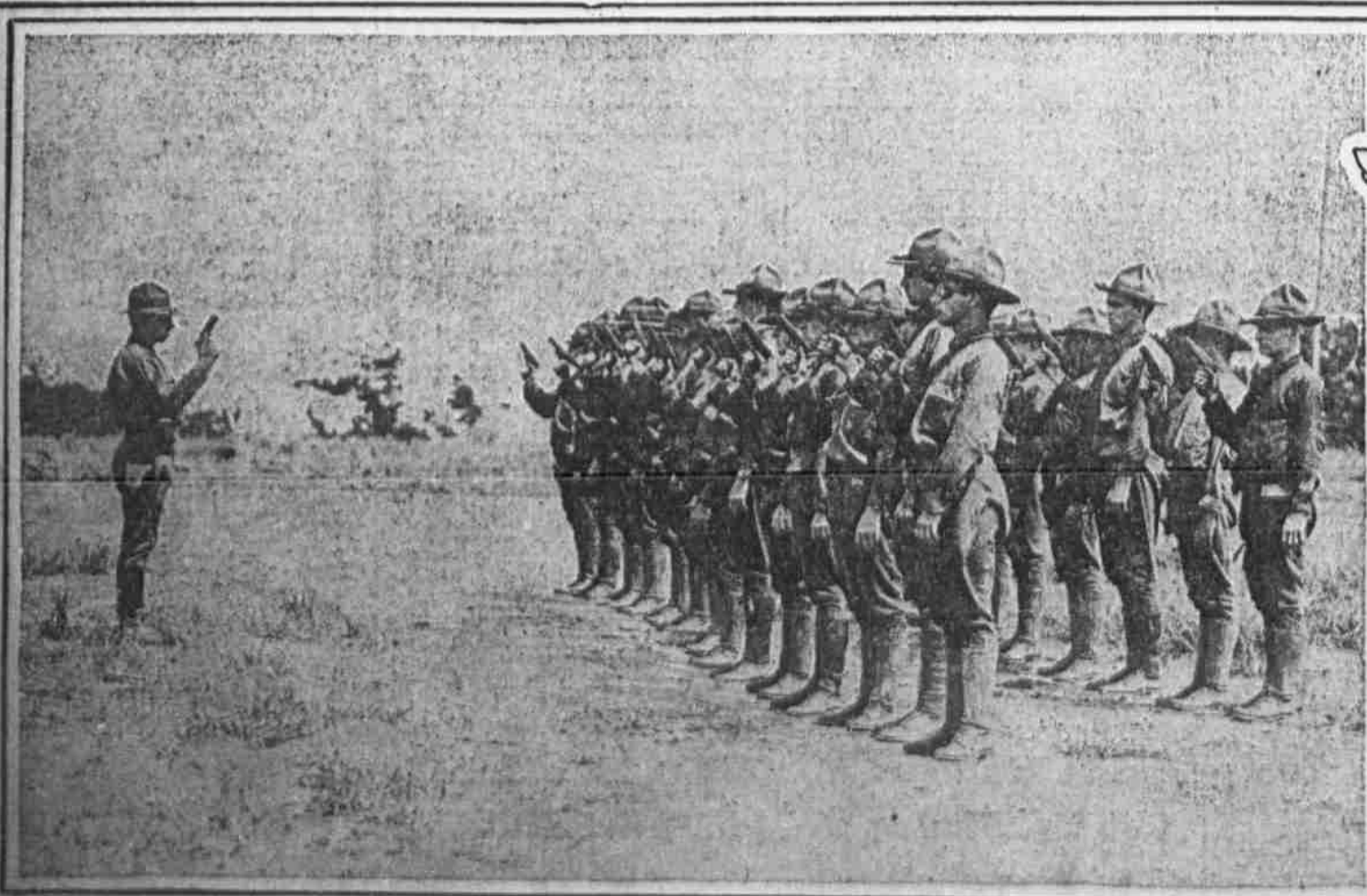


**WHAT SET CLEMENTON AGOG**
