

ART JURY INDORSES COUNCILS PLAN FOR NEW BUILDING CODE

Tentative Suggestions to Control Size, Nature, Location and Height of Buildings, Public and Private

ZONES FOR RESIDENCES

Action of Councils yesterday in authorizing the mayor to appoint a commission to recommend to Councils new regulations for the erection of buildings in this city was described today by Andrew Wright Crawford, executive secretary of the Art Jury, as a highly important and splendid piece of legislation.

When the resolution was introduced in Councils it was unanimously adopted by both chambers, but there was apparently no understanding upon the part of the members of its real importance. The measure was introduced by Joseph P. Gaffney, Councilman, chairman of the Finance Committee, but Mr. Gaffney confessed that he did not know what it actually provided.

The resolution had been presented to him for introduction by Director George Deane, of the Department of Public Works, he said. The measure was introduced in accordance with the provisions of the act passed at its last session, giving Councils the power which they exercise.

According to Mr. Crawford, the commission will have power to draft new building regulations and present them to Councils for approval.

If action on the recommendation of the commission is delayed, buildings to be erected in this city in the future will not be permitted to rise above a specified height. The commission will attempt to regulate the size and nature of structures and to fix zones in which residences may be constructed exclusively. There will also be zones for office buildings, but the proposed regulations would not affect buildings already erected.

On the commission will be the Director of the Department of Public Works, the Director of the Department of Public Safety and representatives of the Housing Commission, the Art Jury, the Chamber of Commerce, the Philadelphia Operative Builders' Association and similar organizations.

The new plan would in no way conflict with the prerogatives of the Art Jury. "We are glad to hear that Councils took this action," he said. "We expect to cooperate with the commission in every possible way."
