Atlantic City has been enjoying the sensation of seeing a five-part feature filmed in the city. The leading hotel on the beach itself has been utilized by Director Fred H. Johnston, of the Capital Film Company, in making "Tom Emerson, American," which will shortly be released on a State right basis.

The musical score for "The Yellow Menace," a sixteen episode serial produced by the Unity Sales Corporation, has been composed by Charles Fong, a native of Canton, China, and a graduate of Yale University. The "Yellow Menace" stars Edwin Stevens and features Florence Malone and Margaret Gale.

For many weeks Mr. Fong has spent much time in the studios where the picture is being filmed, studying the Oriental atmosphere; and the score resulting from his application, while typically Mongolian, is at the same time popular in character.

Fong is also author of a book which will be forwarded to exhibitors of "The Yellow Menace" telling them exactly how to produce the proper effects to bring out the value of his music. This is probably the first time that a score has especially been written for a serial by a composer whose nationality especially fitted him to compose the music.
