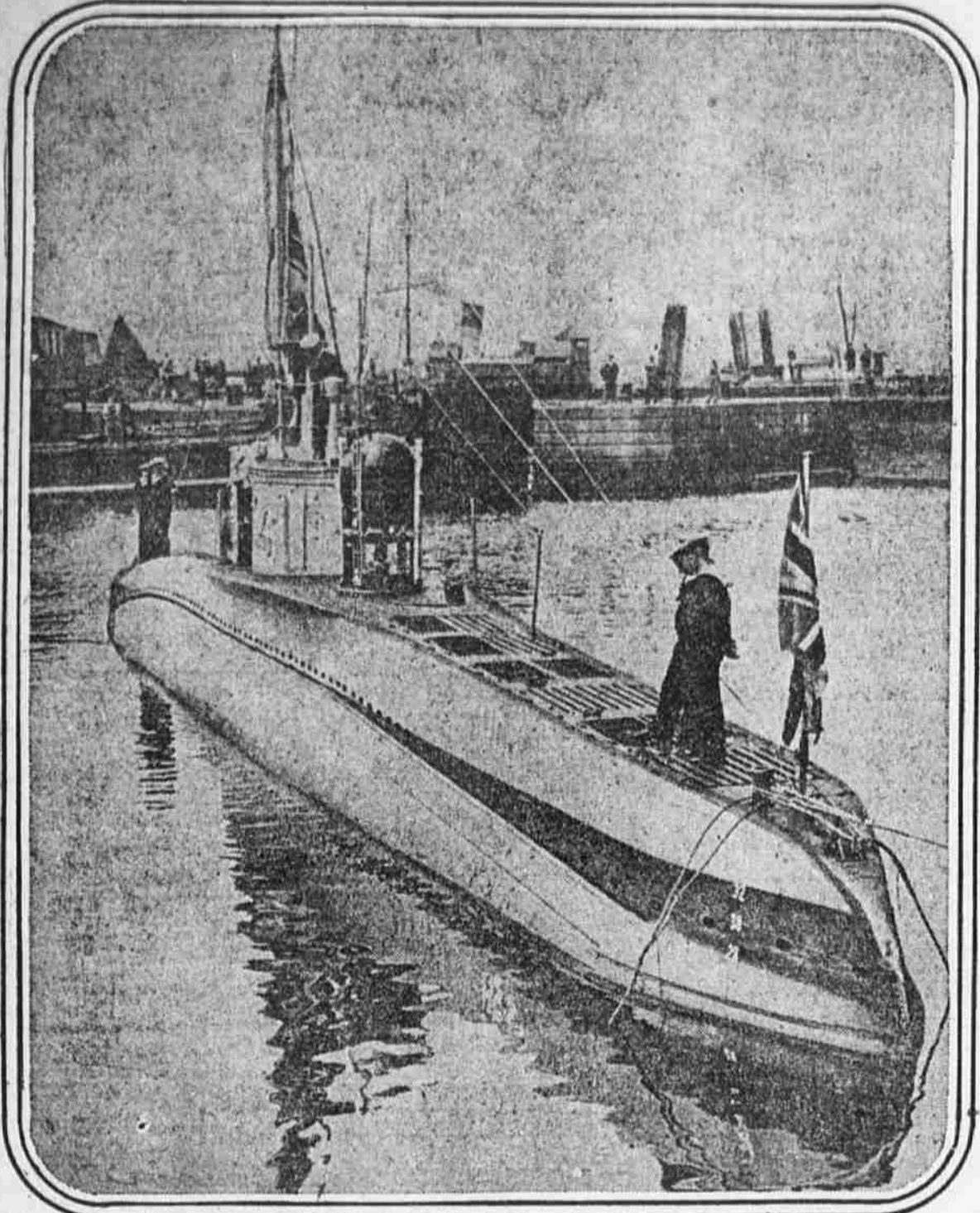
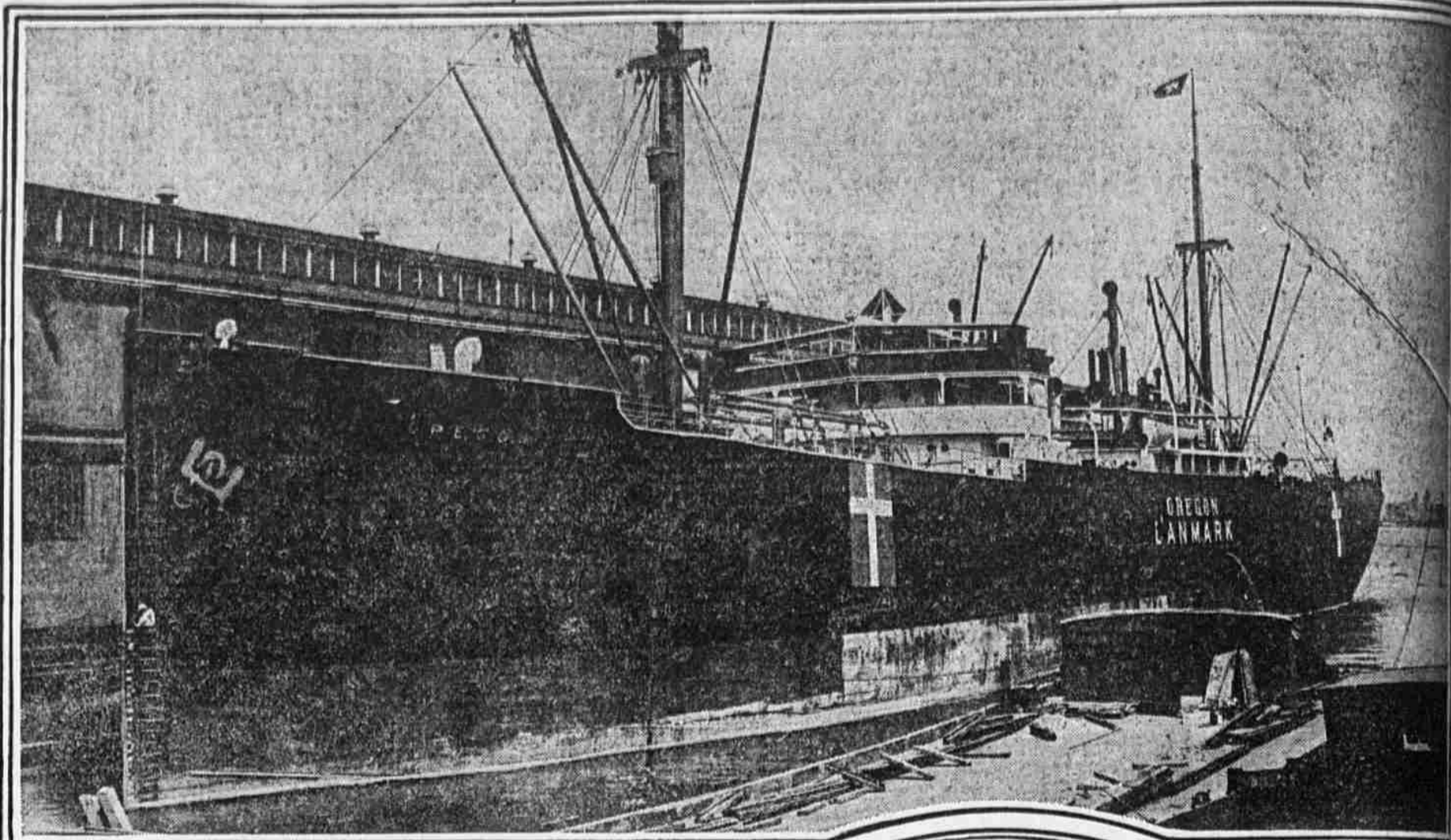

 The captive U-boat is now on exhibition on the Thames at London. A mine is shown in the casing just in front of the conning tower.



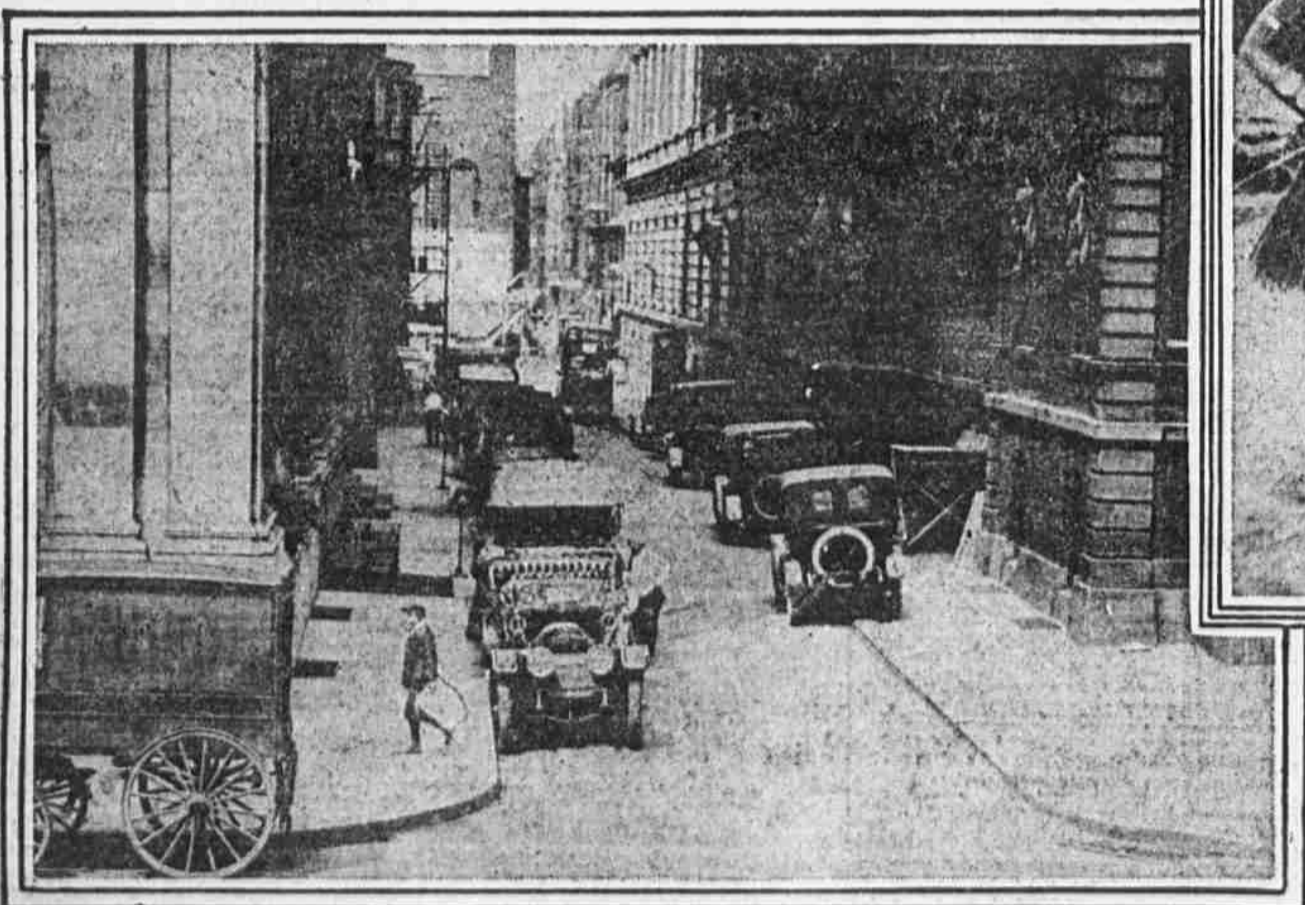
SMOKESTACKLESS LINER A CURIOSITY ON THE WATERFRONT
