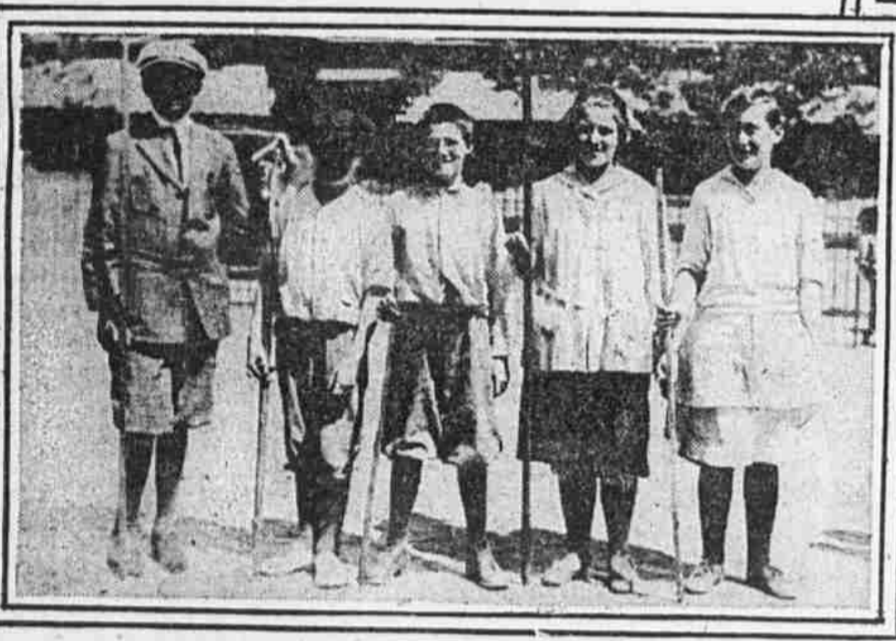


THE MODERN PAUL REVERE ASTRIDE HIS TRUSTY METAL STEED

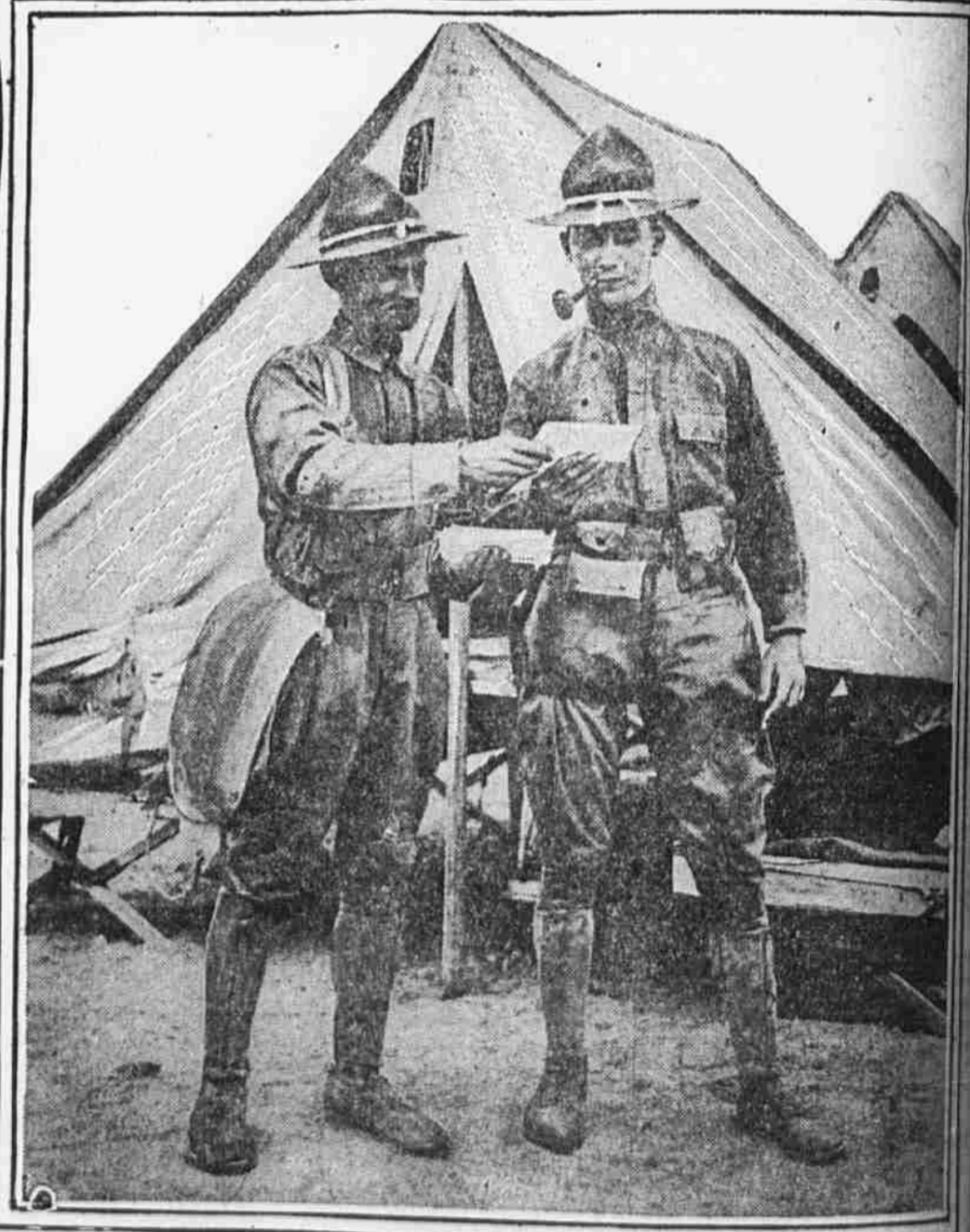
"VOTES FOR WOMEN" CAMPAIGN ENTERS FINANCIAL WORLD

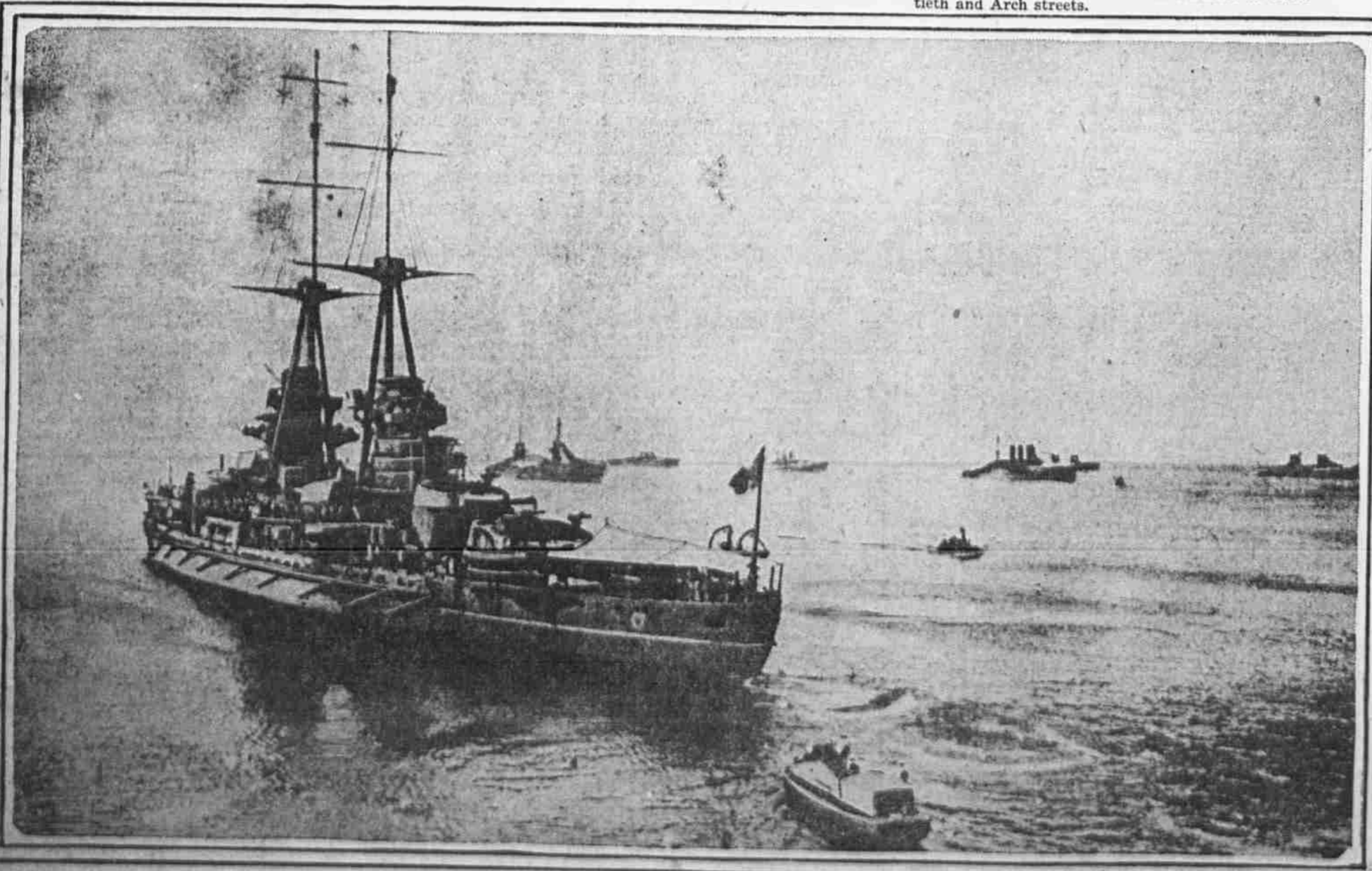
MONKEYS INOCULATED WITH "POLIO" GERMS BY STATE INVESTIGATOR
