Stronger Cables and Lack of Rain in Southwest Are Responsible for Advance

The market became more irregular in the early afternoon under increased realizing sales and selling for a reaction based on the Washington advices relative to the rail road strike.

All deliveries were new high records and exports about 20 to 30 points higher during the early morning.

LAKE SUPERIOR CORPORATION ISSUES A GOOD EARNINGS REPORT FOR YEAR

Income Far Above Previous Twelve Months—Deficit Is Wiped Out and Company Shows Surplus—Trading Quieter on Philadelphia Stock Exchange

The reason for the recent strength of the stock of the Lake Superior Corporation on the Philadelphia Stock Exchange company's earnings report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1916, was made public.

For the twelve months the earnings of the subsidiary companies were \$3,859,471. This is an increase of \$1,171,241 as compared with the same period of the previous year.

The output of the chief subsidiary of the Lake Superior Corporation, the Algoma Steel Corporation, was 258,604 tons of pig iron.
