
Official Forecast

Fair weather has prevailed in the middle and north Atlantic States and in most of the cotton belt. There has been a slight tendency toward rising temperatures in the eastern half of the country and to cooler in far Northwest, although the changes have been somewhat irregular, and considered as a whole, the conditions are seasonable except for a slight deficiency from Lake Superior westward.
