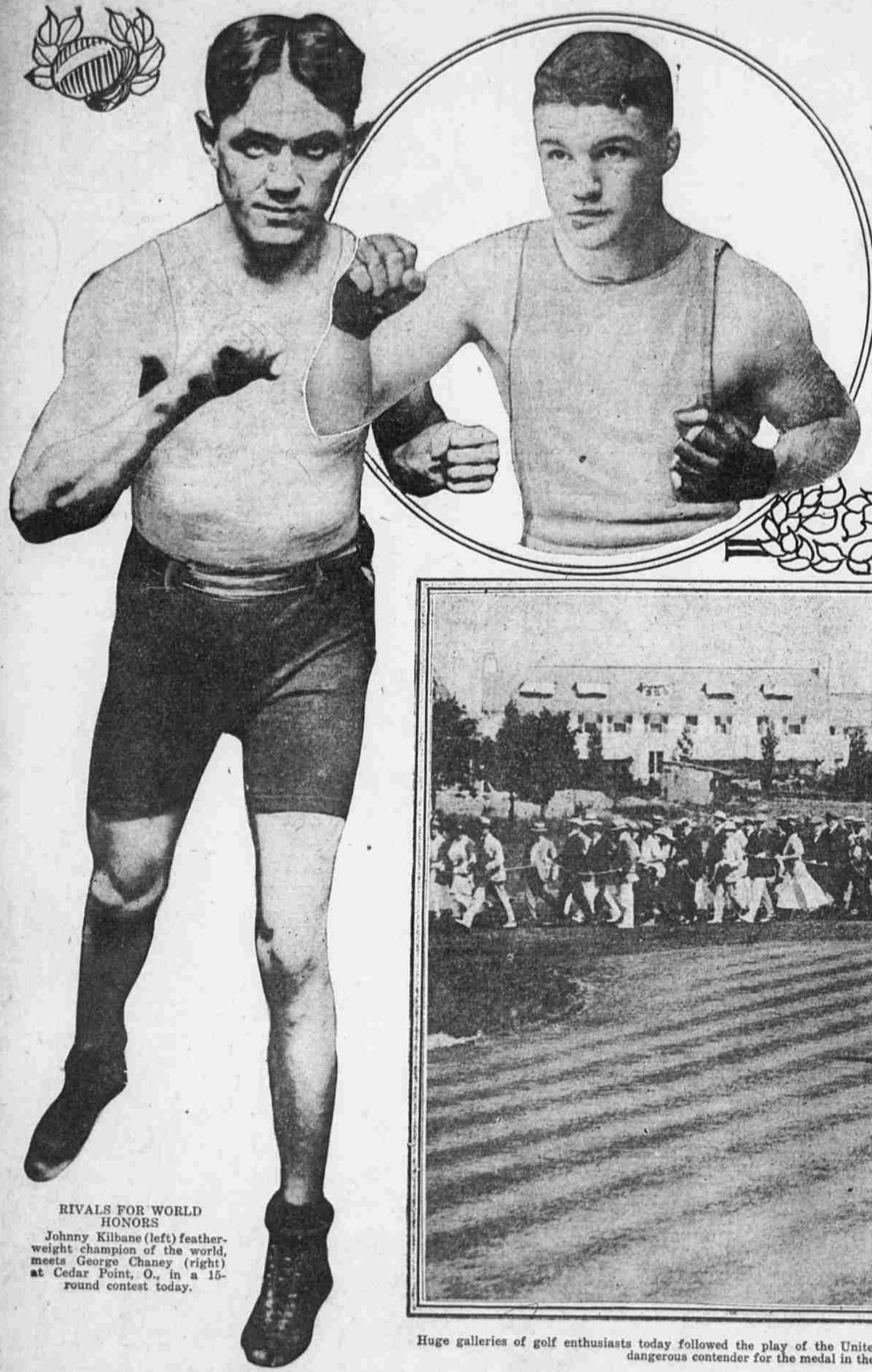
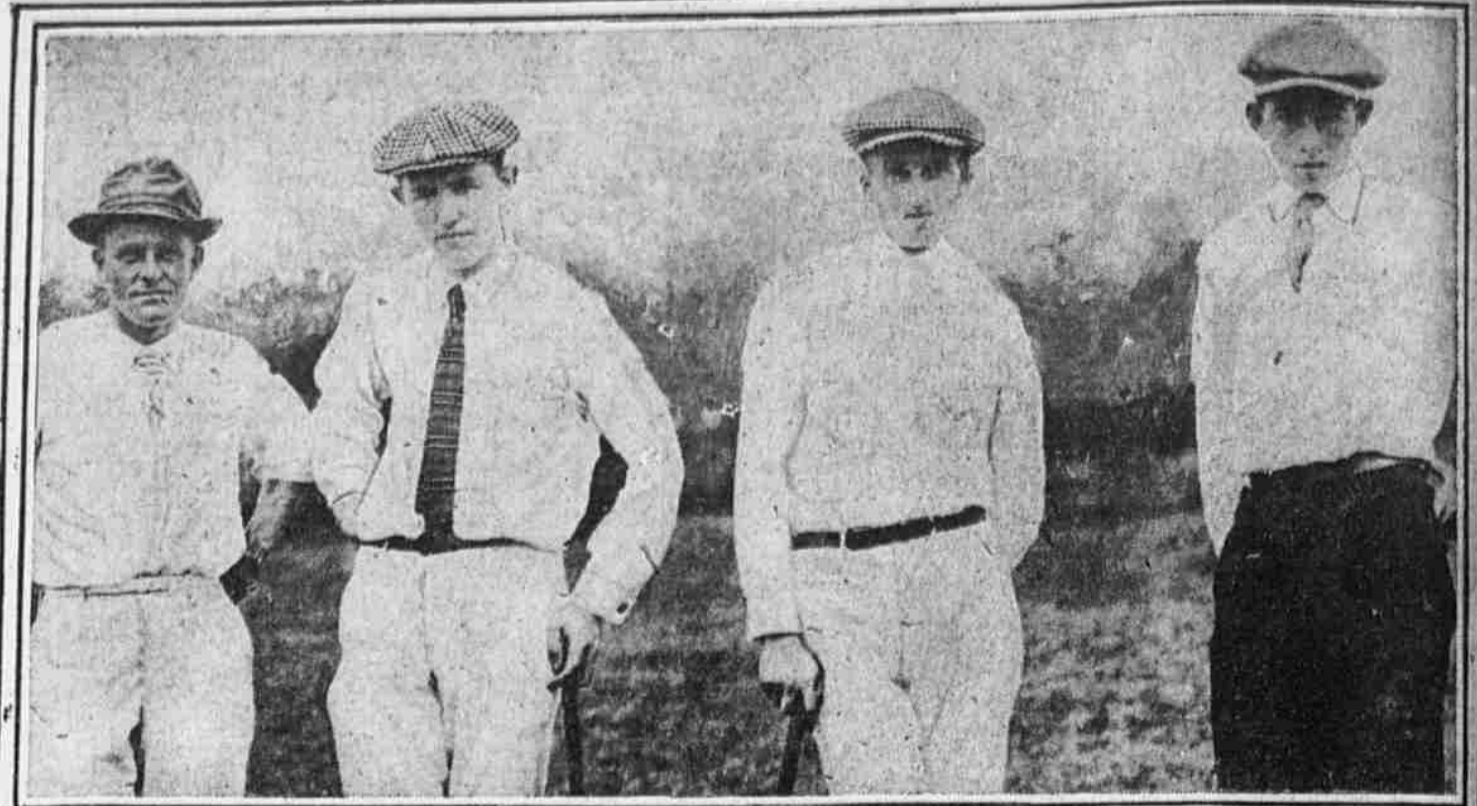


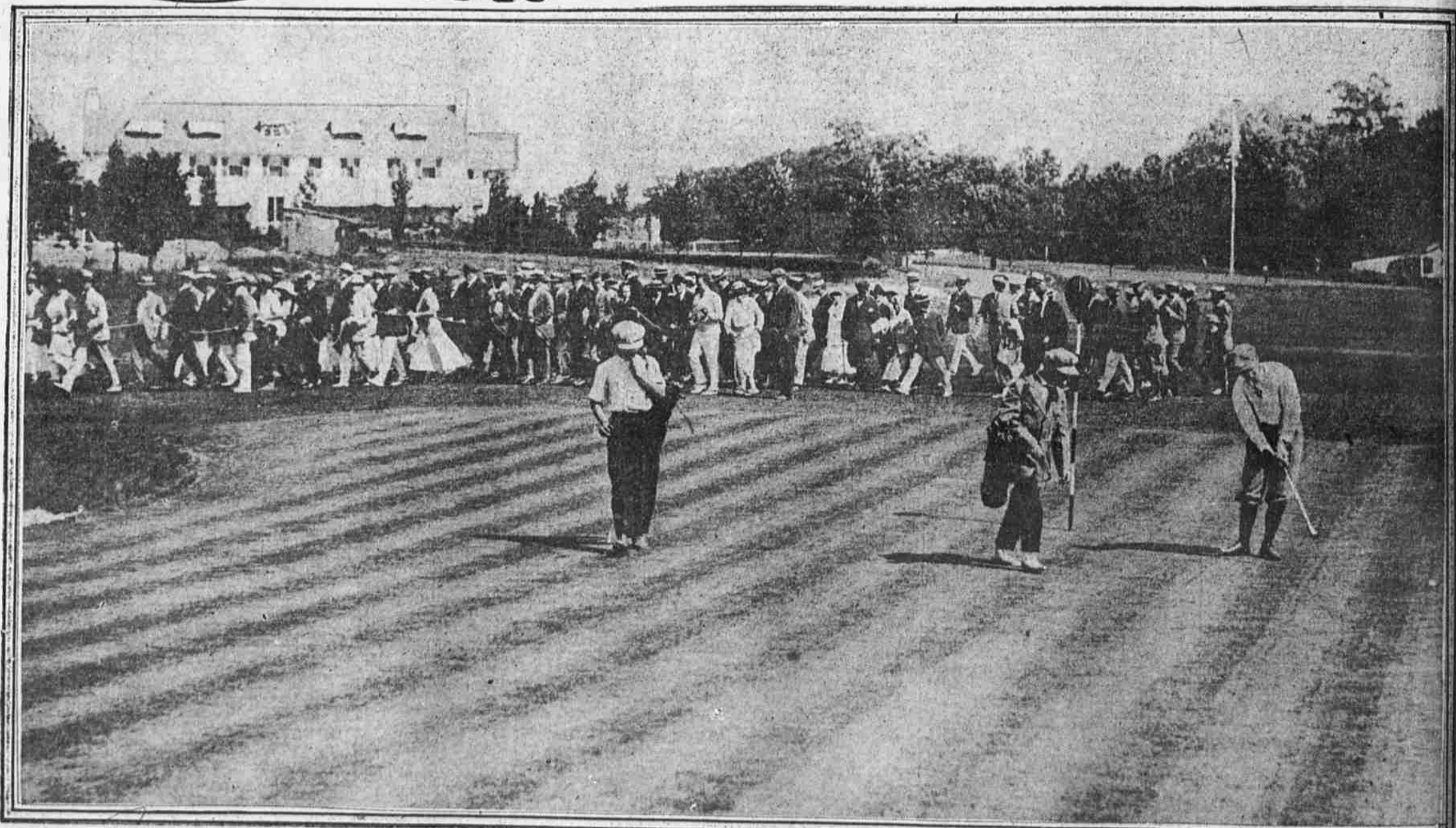
THE CAMERA MAN COULDN'T FIND A WORKER NOT DEVOTING LABOR'S HOLIDAY TO SPORTS
