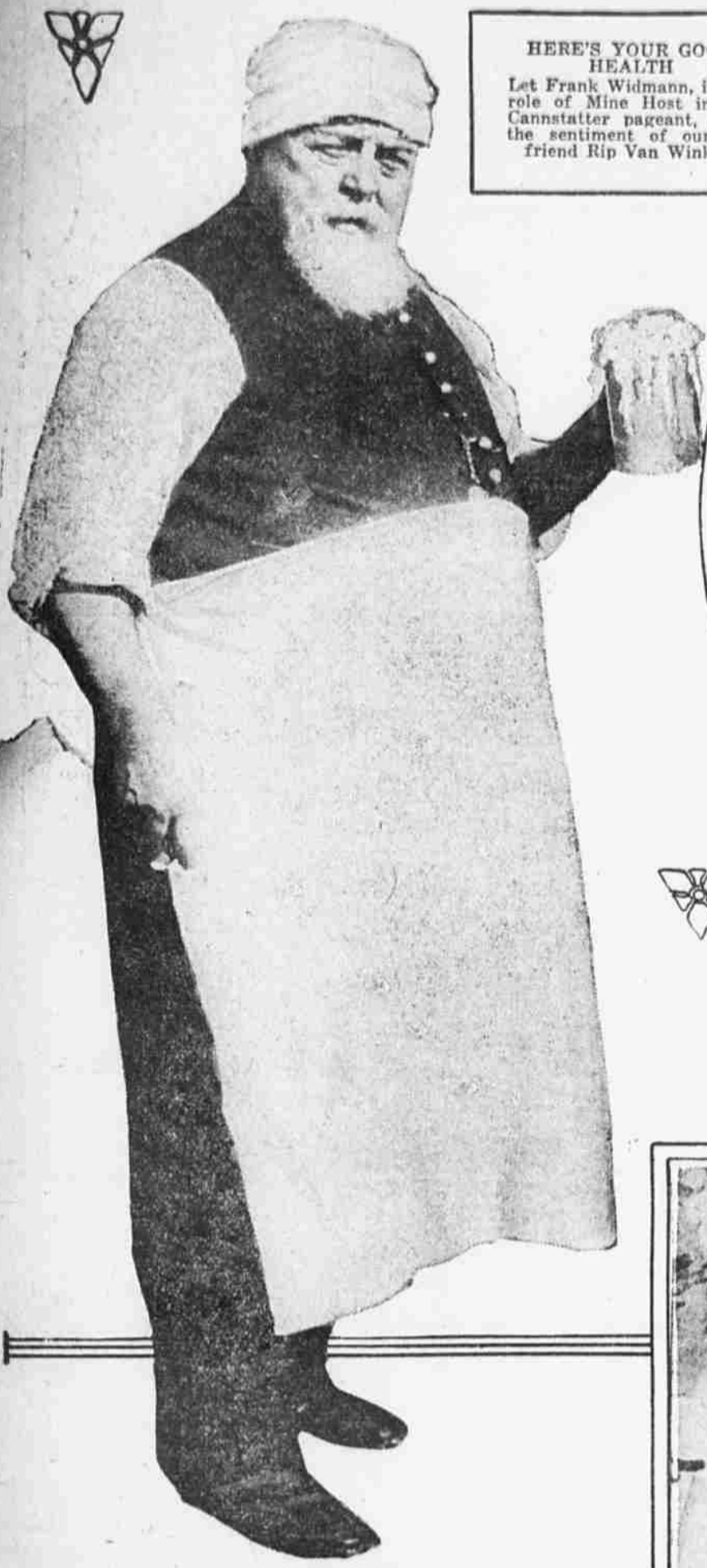


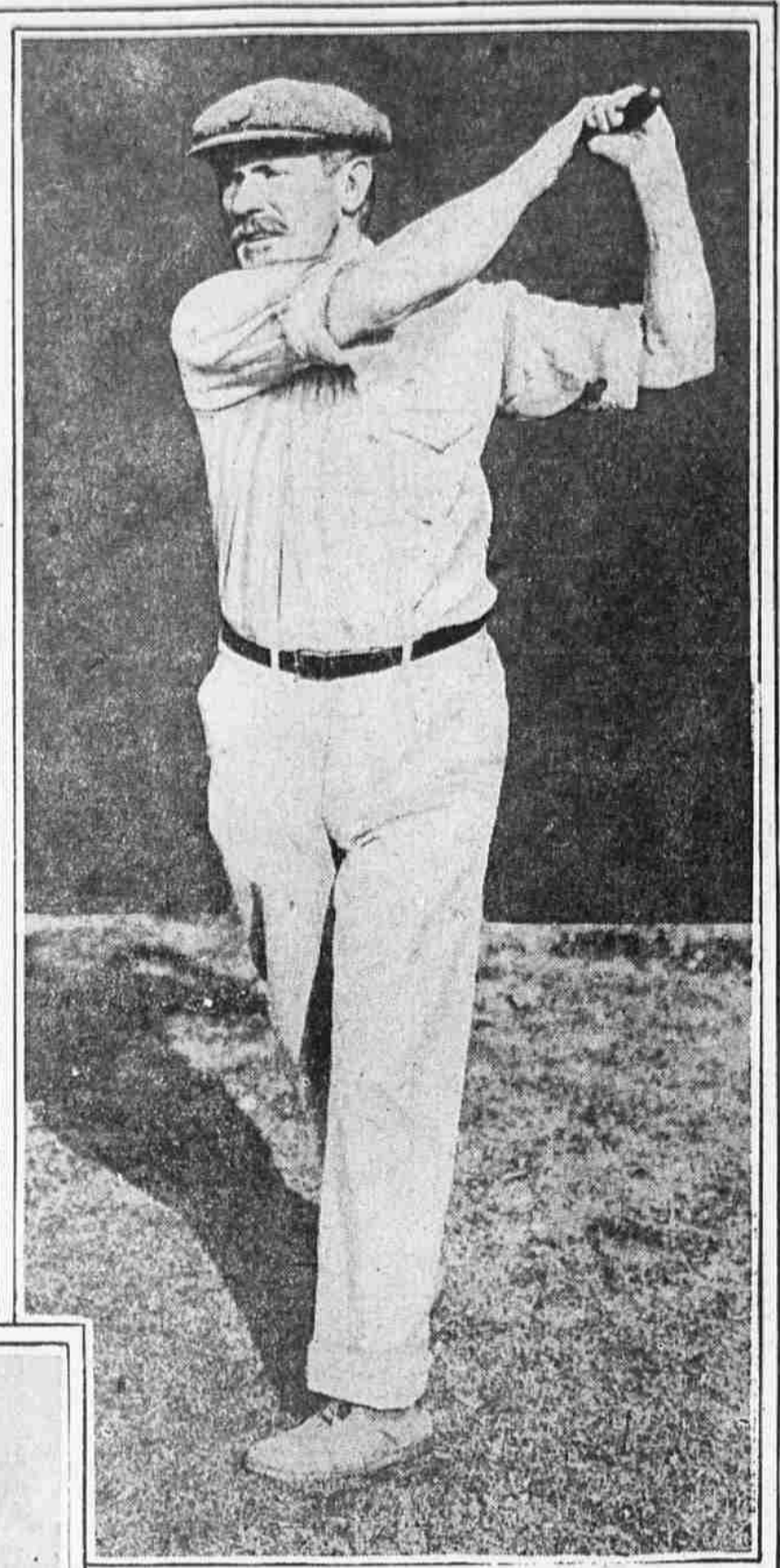

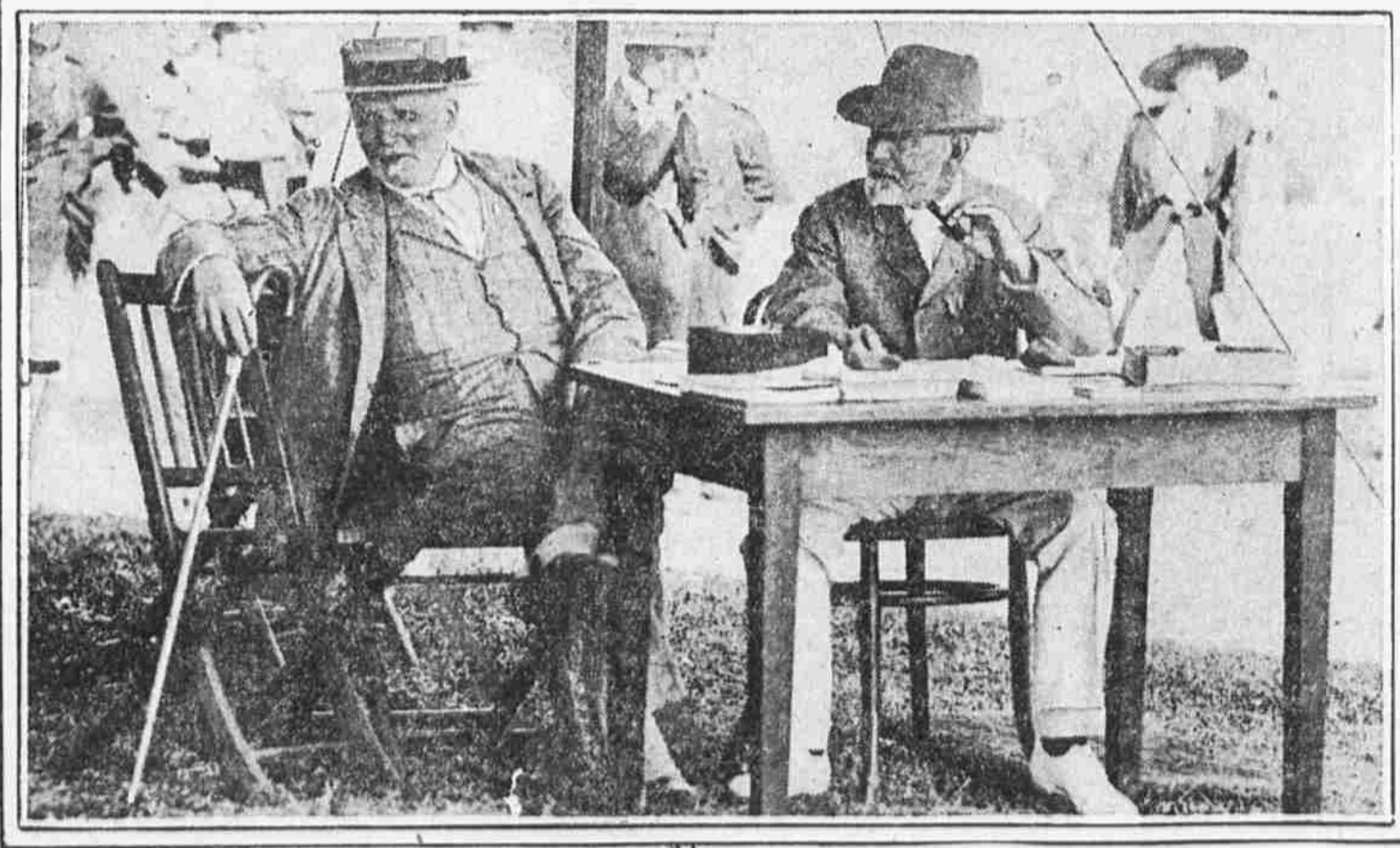
**HERE'S YOUR GOOD HEALTH**  
Let Frank Widmann, in the role of Mine Host in the Cannstatter pageant, voice the sentiment of our old friend Rip Van Winkle.



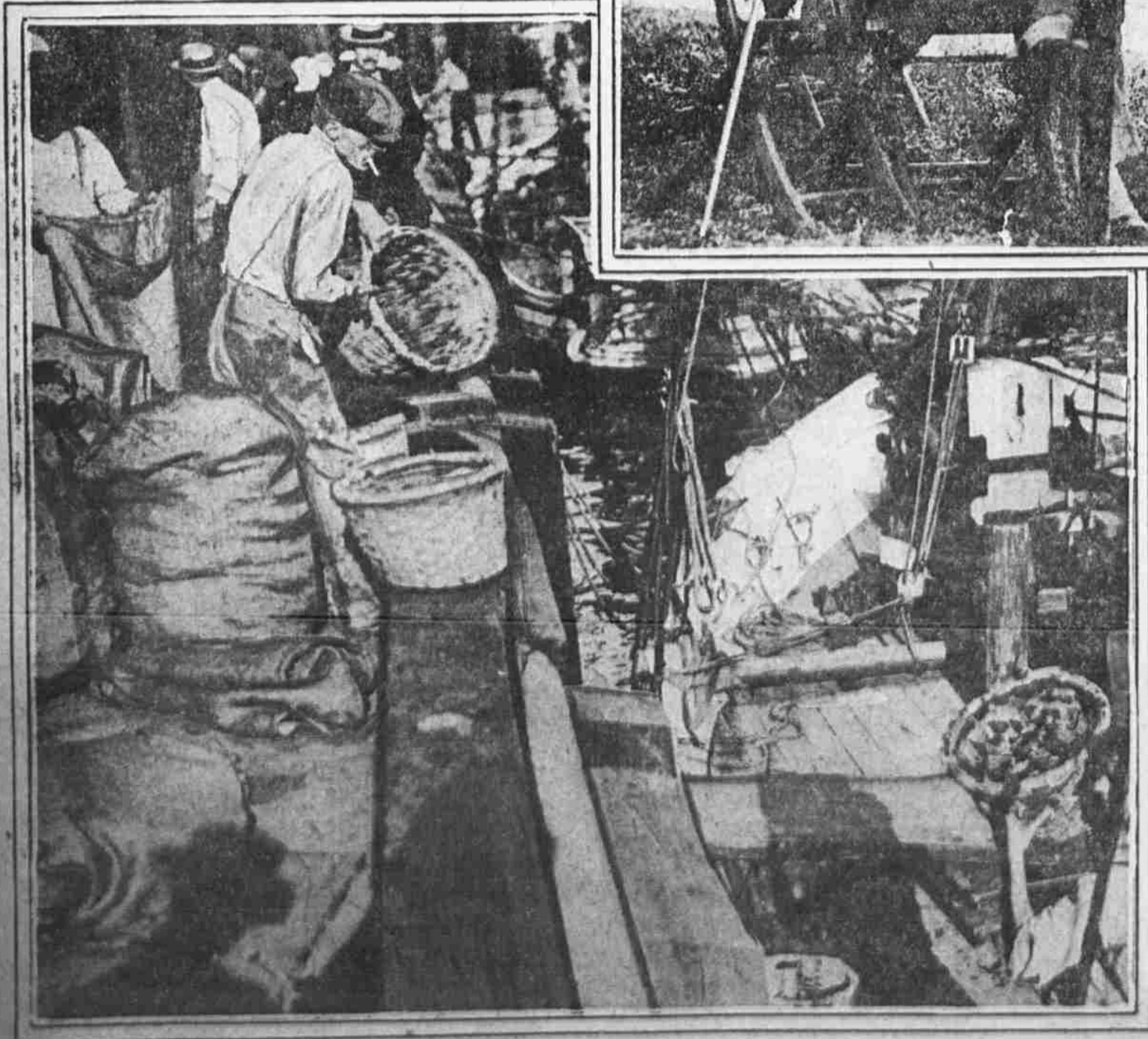
**WELL, YANKEE DOODLE RODE ONE**
