FRENCH ENGAGE GERMANS IN 17 AIR FIGHTS IN ONE DAY ALONG THE SOMME FRONT

PARIS, Sept. 12. The following statement on aerial opera- tions was issued by the War Office this afternoon:

On the Somme front our aeroplanes engaged in seventeen fights yesterday. Two German machines were brought down, one toward Auvourt, the other in the environs of Montbassin, northeast of Peronne.

On the same night another group carried out the following operations: One hundred and five shells were thrown on the station at Thionville and six on the military factory at Haut Fourneau.

AUSTRIAN AIRMEN SHELL ITALIAN ADRIATIC COAST; BOMBS HIT AIRSHIP SHED

VIENNA, Sept. 12. — An Austrian air squadron made an effective raid upon the Italian coast Monday night, the Admiralty announced today.

On the night of September 11-12 an Austro-Hungarian naval air squadron attacked the airship shed at Gese, the Palomara railroad station and the de- fensive batteries at Albona.

Following is the statement on operations in the Balkans issued by the War Office: On the Struma front no change in the situation was reported.

Italian troops are engaged in a battle in the direction of Butkovo and Derna. On both sides of the Vardar allied artillery violently bombarded Bulgarian organizations north of Macakovo and Maladag.

On our left wing the offensive operations of the Serbian army continue actively despite sharp resistance by the

enemy. Northwest of Covic, the Serbians occupy an important position after a conflict which resulted in heavy losses for the enemy.

TEUTONS FAIL TO RELIEVE RUSSIANS' PRESSURE NEAR HALICZ AND ON MOUNTAINS

PETROGRAD, Sept. 12.—Teuton efforts to weaken the tightening grip of the Russians on Halicz resulted in complete failure yesterday. The War Office announced today that the Russians had frustrated attempts by their foes to cross the Bystritsa River to the south of Jesopol, one of the outlying defenses of Halicz.

RUSSIANS CAPTURE CAUCASUS VILLAGE IN SNOWSTORM; TURKS BEAT BACK FOE NEAR OGNOTT

LONDON, Sept. 12.—Sweeping forward in a snowstorm, the Russian troops in the Caucasus captured yesterday the mountain south of Piridant and the heights along the River Masladarakal. In the Ognott sector the Turks thrust back the forces of the Grand Duke Nicholas and recaptured their former positions.

Caucasus front.—Our detachments captured the pyramidal mountain south of the village of Piridant and occupied the heights on the left bank of the river Masladarakal.

Snow fell in the mountains and there was frost.

The Turkish announcement of September 10 says: Turkish forces pushed back the en-

emy and occupied the heights south of Deschenda, on the Persian frontier. Caucasus front.—In the Ognott sector, on September 8, the enemy attacked repeatedly, but was completely repulsed.

DEATH IN DEFECTIVE CASTING

Causes of Quebec Bridge Disaster Officially Determined

QUEBEC, Sept. 12.—Failure of a casting was responsible for the disaster of Monday when the central span of the new bridge across the St. Lawrence collapsed. It was officially stated today.

Careful examination by the Board of Engineers and our own engineers indicates that the center span of the Quebec bridge was lost through the failure of a casting on a lifting girder on which the span had been resting with a greater load for the last six weeks.

DEAD WOMAN IDENTIFIED

Special Policemen Successfully Canvass City With Photographs

Special policemen yesterday went to the morgue and obtained a photograph of an unidentified woman who had been found dead in an alley near 415 South Second street on Sunday night.

Each took the photograph to the southern section of the city and started a systematic canvass of every house in the vicinity of the place where the body was found.

CENTER COUNTY GRANGERS GIVE SUFFRAGE BIG BOOST

11,000 Hear Cause of Women Urged in Annual Outing

STATE COLLEGE, Pa., Sept. 12.—Eleven thousand persons today joined in a mighty demonstration for equal suffrage at the annual Center County Grange Encampment at Center Hall. This day was set apart by the Grangers, who are here for a ten-day outing, for a fitting observance of the woman's rights movement to which the National and State grange are dedicated.

Wagon Hits Motorcycle; Rider Hurt

The patrol wagon of the Front and Master streets police station ran into a motorcycle shortly before noon today while answering an alarm of fire. On the motorcycle were Herman Wuckert, 24 years old, Birch and Richmond streets, driving, and Frank Oppicker, 21 years, 702 Richmond street, on the rear seat.
