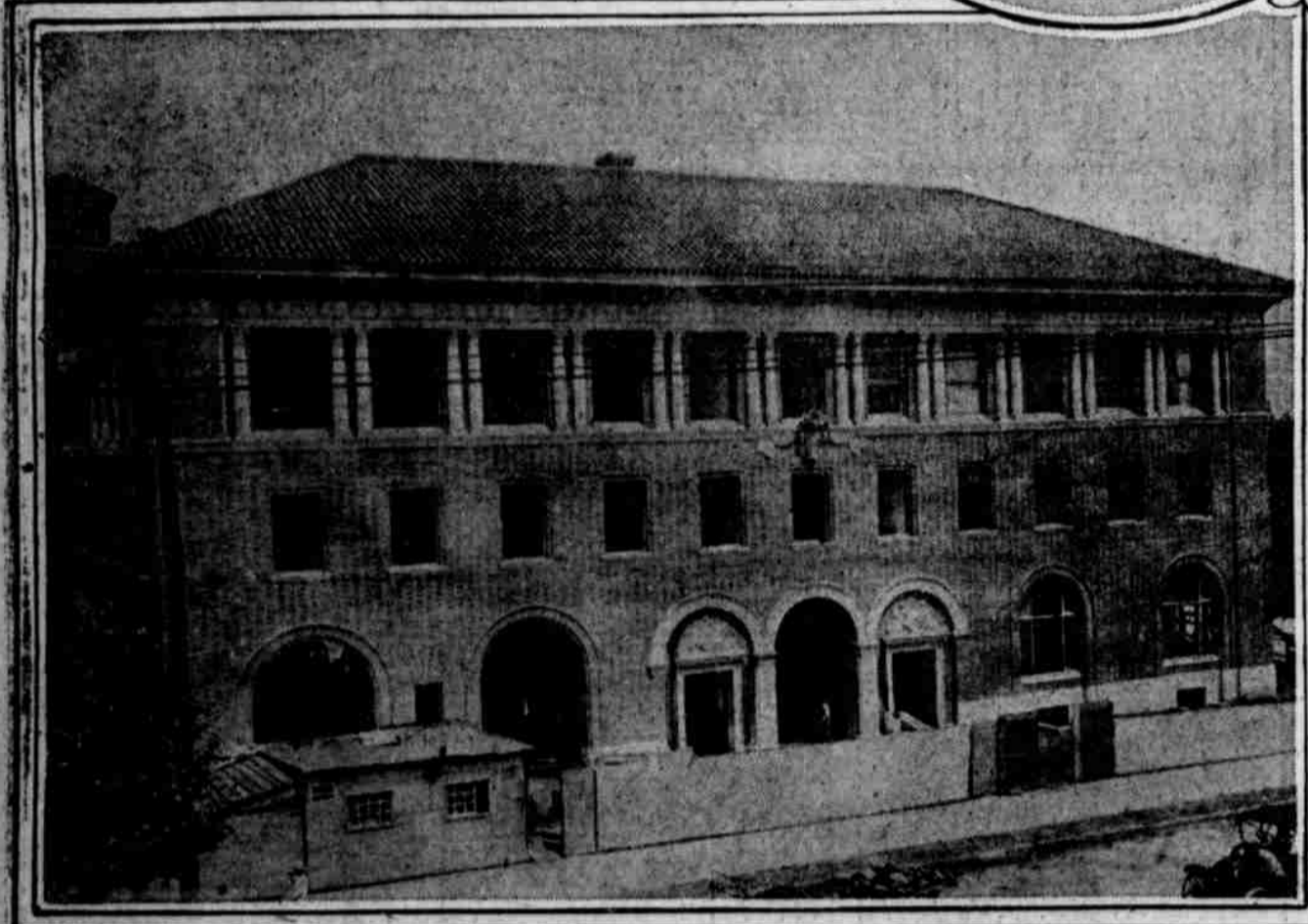

ENTRY OF ITALIAN CAVALRY INTO GORIZIA



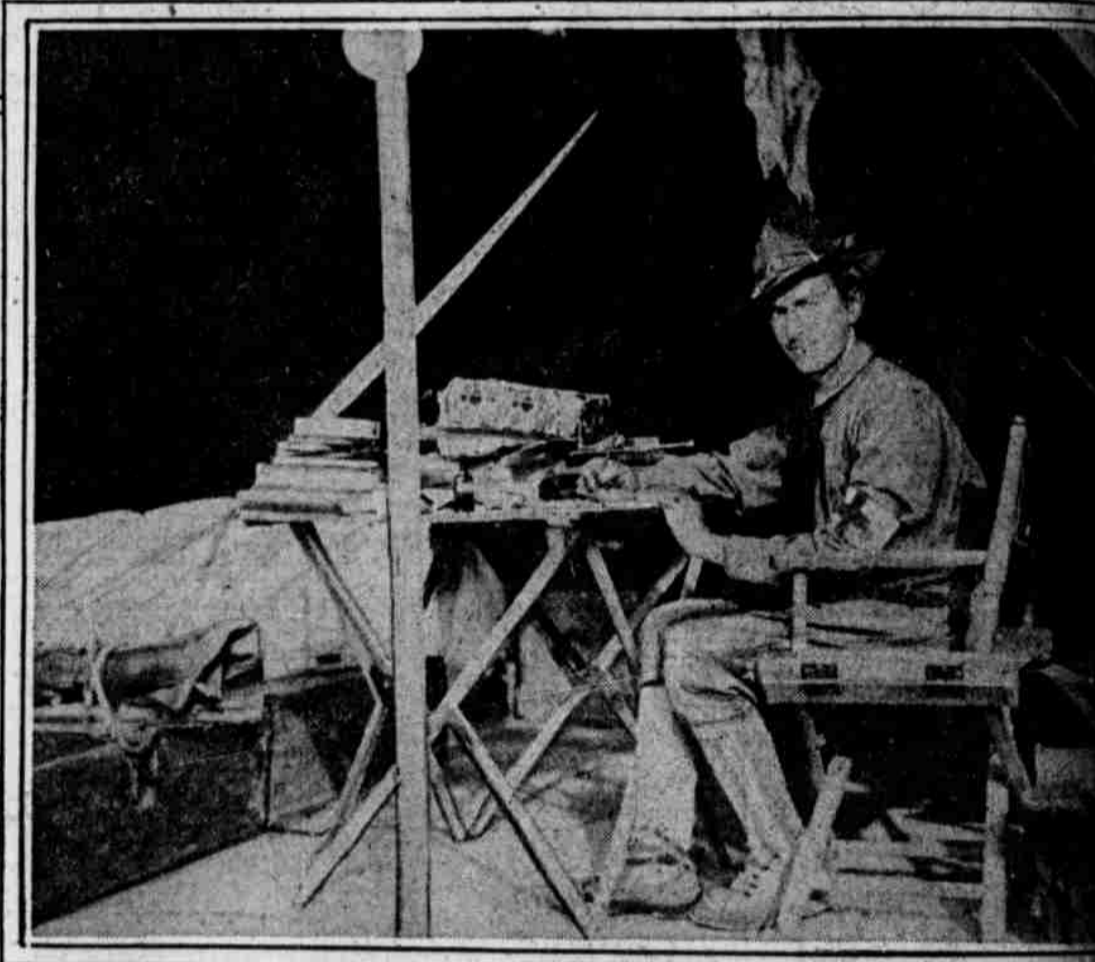
NEW POLICE STATION AND FIREHOUSE FOR NORTH PHILADELPHIA

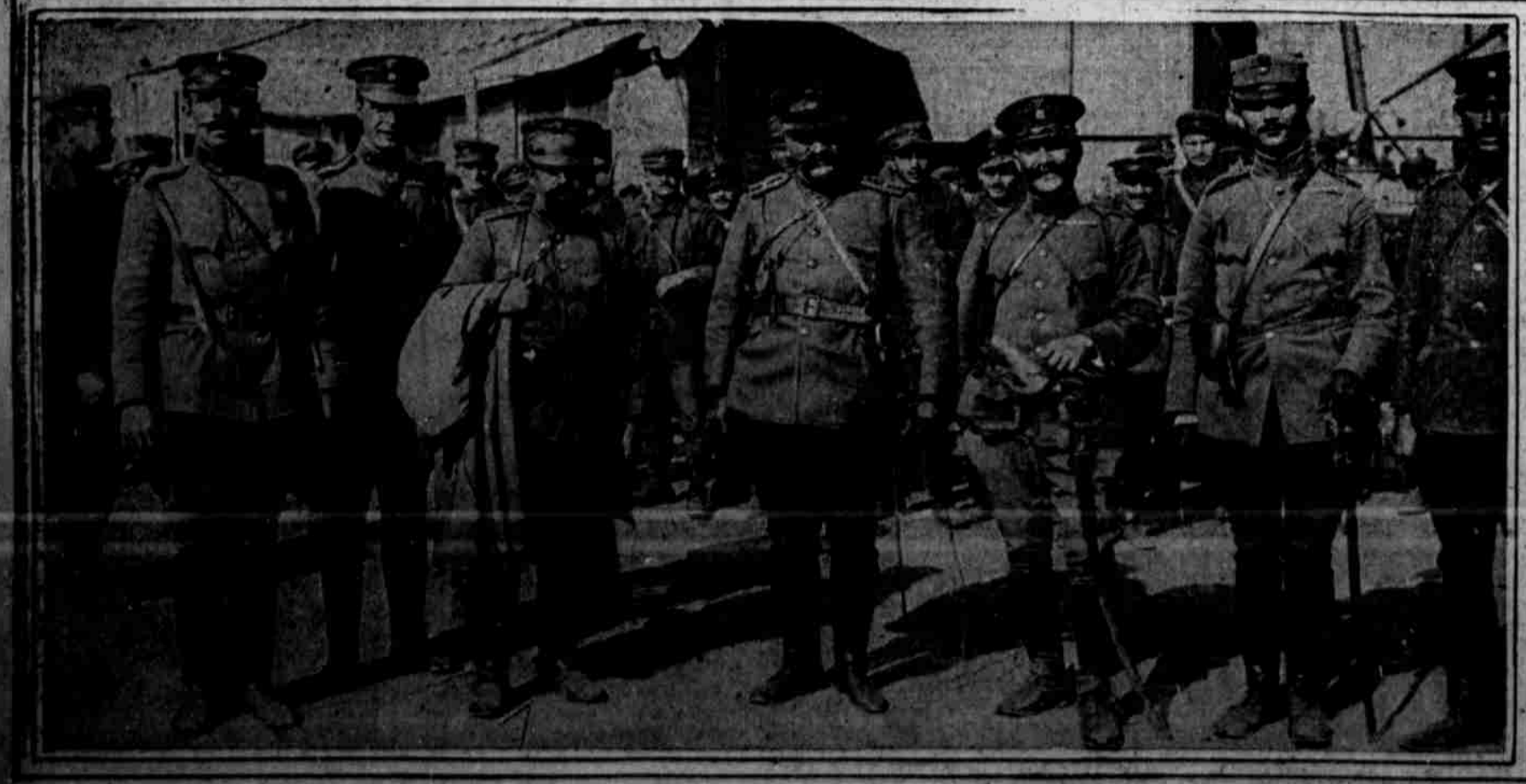


OLDEST WORKER AT THE STATE CAPITOL
