# GRIFFITH TO RETURN TO 5-REEL FEATURES

According to a New York Interviewer, who had a long talk with D. W. Griffith, producer of "Intolerance," now running in the metropolis, and of "The Birth of a Nation," at the Cheatnut Street Opera House, this city, the director is going in for shorter motion pictures than those two epics which added lustre to his name.

Asked if his next production would be another supreme effort, he replied: "I hope not. I'm willing that some one else should try the experiment. I prefer to make some simple five-reel pictures; they do not tie up large sums of money." Before "The Birth of a Nation." His action in returning to less elaborate films may have a compelling influence on other directors, and may result in a general trend away from the spectacular and gigantic in cinematography.
