Conferees Fix Scheme for Republic-Bankers Require Washington Guaranty

NEW LONDON, Sept. 16.—Satisfied of the ability of the Mexican commission to induce American bankers to float a loan of \$100,000,000 or more, the American com-missioners are prepared to submit a pro-posal for the establishment of a practical financial protectorate over Mexico. The plan is this:

To guarantee the payment of the in-terest and principal on a Mexican loan. To establish as a collateral issue a sion to supervise the expenditures in the rehabilitation of Mexico.

This border patrol, under the present plan, would be officered for the most part by American military men, and made up of Mexicans qualified for the positions.

The Mexican commissioners still are hopeful of negotiating a Mexican loan in this country, but the American commissioners are positive American bankers will not attempt to sell a Mexican loan, unless payment is guaranteed by the United States Government.


