IR ORDERS FOR STEEL ELAY COMPLETION OF FRANKFORD ELEVATED

Work Held Up by Lack of Material, Freight Embargoes and Tangle in Labor Situation

EARLY START UNAVAILING

On the last day of this month the ryankford elevated line should stand combined from Front and Callowhill streets by Dyre street and Frankford avenue, according to the terms of the specifications of

War orders which tied up the steel mills, slow shipments on account of freight embergoes and minor labor troubles were among the difficulties which combined to delay the completion of the major portion of the Frankford line several months beyond the time originally set.

The work on the foundations of the "L" began September 7, 1915, which was slimest a week ahead of the time given in the contract. The showness of the steel mills in making their initial delivery more than made up for the early start on the foundations. The steel work was scheduled to begin April 1 of this year, but it was two weeks later before the first carload of steel strived from the plant of the Phoenix Bridge Company and it was another week before the first column was set in place.

While the McClintic Marshall Company, which holds the contract for the work, unforeseen difficulties piled up so rapidly that several times it was compelled to lay off its entire force of men to await deliveries by the steel mills.

At the present time in order to make of for the delays the steel work has been stributed among six steel mills, six asmily shops, two cast-iron mills and two undries. There is little probability, hower, that the "L" as far as Dyre street in be completed within two or three onths.

Meanwhile, the contractor will be penamed \$50 for every working day he must
