His honor was surrounded by a considerable entourage who came to see him cast his ballot at Broad and Cumberland streets.



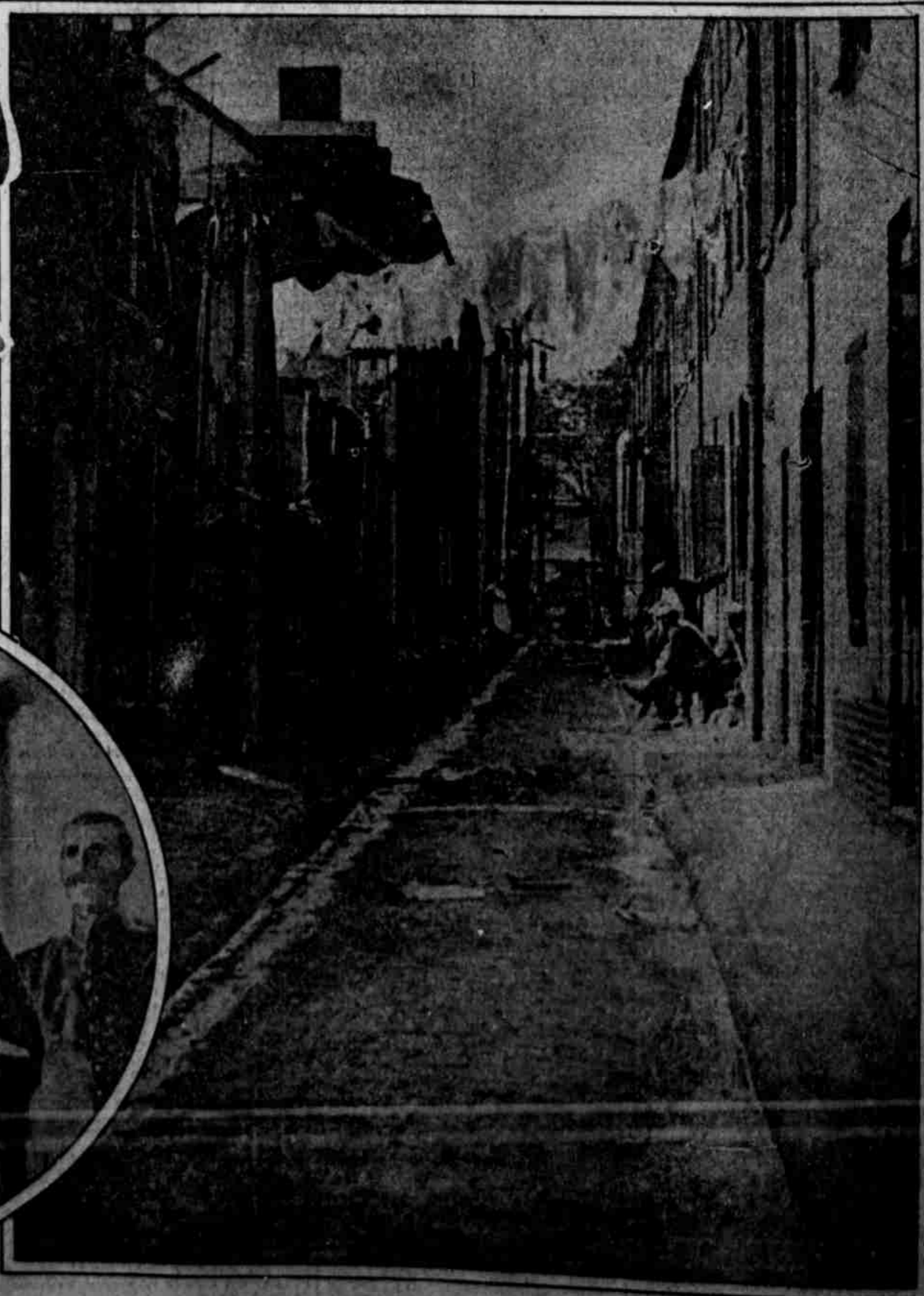
"UNCLE DAVE" LANE INSPECTS BALLOT
