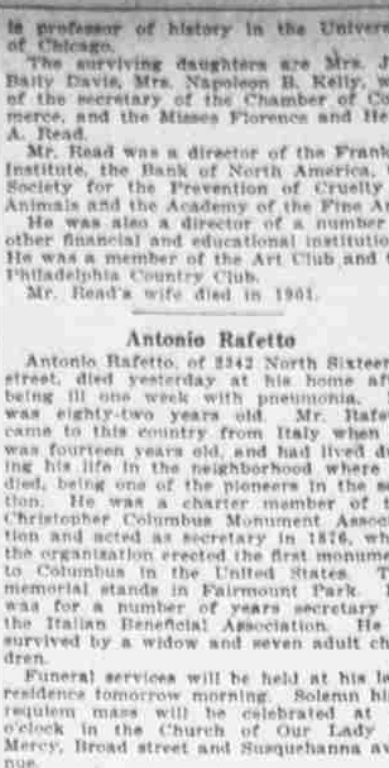


W. F. READ, TEXTILE MANUFACTURER, DIES
