Four scholastic basketball teams, leaders in the High School League, have each lost one game in the series played to date. The Central High School team, which has defeated most every team against South Philadelphia, beat the Crimson and Gold yesterday at the Germantown High School gymnasium. The Crimson and Gold won, 31 to 18.

This overwhelming victory was not expected by the cage followers. South Philadelphia had scored four straight victories and was the favorite. The downtown contestants—those from Germantown and Jackson streets—began to consider them this Central High win; but it did not dislodge the leaders from their positions.

The open floor and changed conditions, coupled with the fact that Central High is a top-notch team and that the North Broad street athletes were playing at the top of their game, proved Southern's commanding. At half-time Central had commanding lead, 13 to 8. This gave Captain Mouradian's squad a confidence which helped to nail the verdict in the second half of play.

Central Players Excel

Mouradian and Trautman excelled for Central, while the Crimson and Gold, under Hance and Baumstein, scored four field goals. Frankford and Germantown made two as well as fifteen out of twenty-three foul goals. It was his consistent foul goal scoring that held Central to the fore. Bunnin, of South Philadelphia, was not lacking in foul goal shooting ability, for he made even a better average, scoring 14 out of a possible 20 points.

It was a roughly contested game and referee George Cartwright had to warn players on both teams. The game was decided by the foul goals scored, for Central made nearly half the points in this manner and South Philadelphia got 14 out of 18 points from the chalk-line. The Southerners were away off form in their field goal throwing, for Bunnin and Douders each made one two-pointer and that accounted for Southern's tally in field goals.

Germantown Academy Improving

Germantown Academy's basketball players started their 1917 season in the cage much later than many of the other schools in this section. In spite of a rather late start, the Mambins youngsters are showing signs of improvement. Fruthovsky and Kent are doing especially well, and present indications point to numerous successes for the Mambins youngsters.
