

**CALIFORNIA BOYS' BAND
PLAYS AT CITY HALL**

Young Musicians Who Won Prize at Exposition Give Concert in Mayor's Office

ON TRIUMPHAL TOUR

Will Visit Places of Historic Interest During Their Sojourn Here

The California Boys' Band, an organization of thirty-eight boys ranging in age from fifteen to seventeen years, students in the Columbia Park Boys' Club of San Francisco, came to Philadelphia today from Washington where they had played for President and Mrs. Wilson at the White House. They were escorted to City Hall by the Wanamaker Cadets and greeted by Mayor Smith on their arrival.

Ushered into the Mayor's big reception hall, they gave a short concert that filled the big building with resounding music. Everybody in the hall stopped work to listen and many gathered about the corridors on the Mayor's office floor.

The boys, dressed in military uniforms, black suits and white caps, are touring the country as a reward for their application to study in competition with 122 organizations of trained musicians. They won the Isador prize at the Panama-Pacific exposition for the best rendition of music. The band was one of the chief attractions at the fair.

While in Philadelphia the members of the band will be the guests of various business and professional organizations. They will visit points of interest in and about the city. They will play for members of the Union League at a luncheon arranged especially for their reception.

The itinerary calls for a trip to Valley Forge, an inspection of the various educational institutions of this city and a visit to the Baldwin Locomotive Works, where they will be the guests of Alva B. Johnson. They will also play for the University of Pennsylvania and the students of Girard College.

The boys came to Philadelphia directly from Washington, where they gave the special exhibition of their skill before the President. Congressional delegates from California, as well as members of both branches of the House, highly praised the band. President Wilson, after listening to several selections, said the technique displayed by the boys was worthy of the highest commendation.

The boys are making the tour under the leadership of Major Sydney S. Pelzotto, founder of the Columbia Boys' Club and one of the leading educators in the State of California.

The members of the band are as proficient in calisthenics and singing as they are in rendering musical airs.

GEORGE M. DALLAS

Former U. S. Circuit Judge Succumbs After Long Illness

Former United States Circuit Judge George Mifflin Dallas died yesterday morning, at the age of seventy-eight years, after a long illness, at his home, 1514 Pine street. He was born in Pittsburgh, February 7, 1839, but from his infancy resided in Philadelphia. His father was Trevanion B. Dallas, a cotton manufacturer. The family of Judge Dallas is one of the most distinguished in Pennsylvania. George M. Dallas, an uncle of George Dallas, was vice president of the United States during the Administration of President Polk, and was also Mayor of Philadelphia, Senator from Pennsylvania, and was twice the nation's representative in foreign countries, first as Minister to Great Britain and later to Russia.

Judge Dallas presided over the United States Court of the Third Circuit for seventeen years. He was appointed by President Harrison on March 17, 1892, and on March 11, 1909, sent his resignation to President Taft, his advancing age being given as the reason for his wish to be relieved of his responsibilities. One of his opinions that attracted wide-spread attention, and with which Judge George Gray concurred, was the decision in which Judge Dallas pronounced unconstitutional the commodity clause in the Hepburn act for railroad regulation.

For many years he was connected with the Law School of the University of Pennsylvania as professor of law of torts, evidence and practice. He later received the degree of LL. D. from the University of Princeton.

On October 22, 1867, he married Ellen Markoe Wharton, who died in December, 1908. He is survived by a son, Trevanion B. Dallas, and two daughters.
