

MAYOR WILL DISCUSS TRANSIT LEASE FEB. 1

Will Address Message to Councils—Asks Public to Consider Proposal

Mayor Smith will bring the question of rapid transit squarely before the public in a special message to Councils, which he announced he was preparing to present before February 1.

Whether or not he will go into details as to the situation of the Philadelphia Rapid Transit Company's proposed lease, the Mayor did not say, but his message will deal with the financial features of the transit company's proposed agreement to operate the city-built high-speed lines.

The proposal is now in the hands of the public and it will be studied carefully by the public and discussed freely. I probably will have no comment to make on it until after the public has had an opportunity to discuss matters which I will try to have ready by February 1.

The Mayor's message, however, will probably be in the nature of a preliminary report which Director Twining of the Department of City Transit is preparing.

Director Twining started to prepare his analysis of the H. E. P. proposal today. He conferred with representatives of Board Bacon & Isaacs, the consulting engineers, who will assist him in his report on the engineering features of the Transit company's proposition.

The Director's report will not be completed or made public until the end of February. In the meantime, the Mayor will ask the public to consider every feature of the proposition.
