Into a snucepain put three tablespoons butter and half the quantity of flour, and when it is mixed thoroughly add the system liquor and a corresponding amount of cream finith may be used if preferred. A pinch of soda added will prevent curding. Stir constantly until the sauce thickens, season, then add the oysters, and when the edges begin to curl add very slowly the well-beaten yolks of two eggs, stirring briskly. Hemove from the fire immediately, put three or four oysters in each heated patter shell, pour the sauce in and around it, place the lid on the shell and serve at once.


