DESERTS SAWDUST AND MOVIES FOR DRAMA

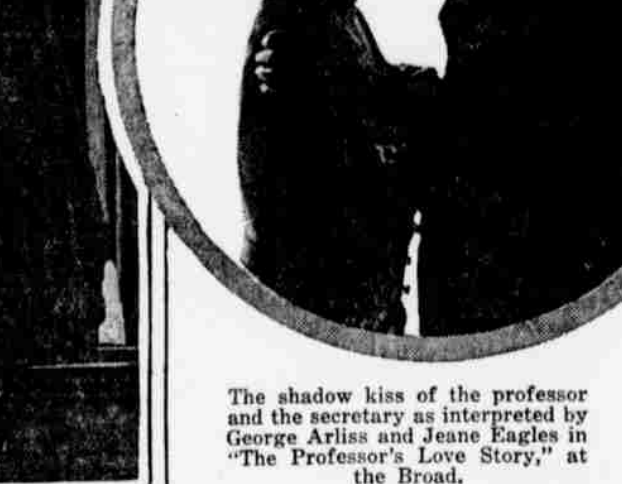
