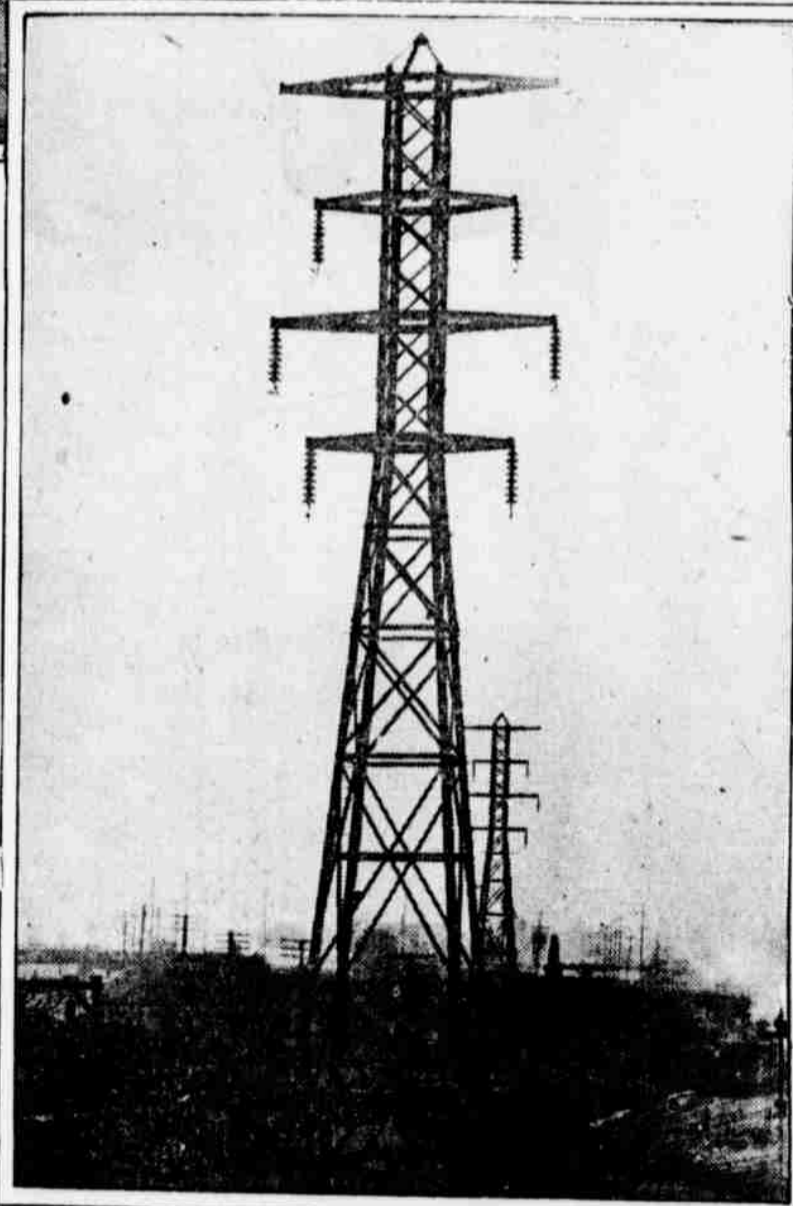




WEST PHILADELPHIA WOMEN PREPARE FOR POSSIBLE WAR
