

CAUGHT PROWLING NEAR BRITISH MUNITION SHIP

Prisoner's Nocturnal Visits to Washington Avenue Dock End in His Arrest

A man who was seen prowling around the British steamship Queen Elizabeth, upon which ammunition is being loaded, at Pier 48 on the Delaware River near Washington avenue was arrested early today as a suspicious character.

The prisoner gave the name of William Tully. He is about forty-five years old and said he was a native of Ireland, but refused further to divulge his life history.

The Queen Elizabeth will sail shortly for England with ammunition consigned to the Allied Governments. No firearms were found on the prisoner when he was searched at the station house.
