## PRESIDENT'S PROCLAMATION

 CALLING EXTRA CONGRESS





President Wilson today announced his decision to arm American ships immediately for the purpose of protecting the lives and prop-

erty of Americans on the high seas.

- In a formal statement issued at the White House the President simultaneously issued a proclamation calling for an extra session of Congress to begin April 16 to render "support he will need in all matters collateral to the defense of our merchant marine.
