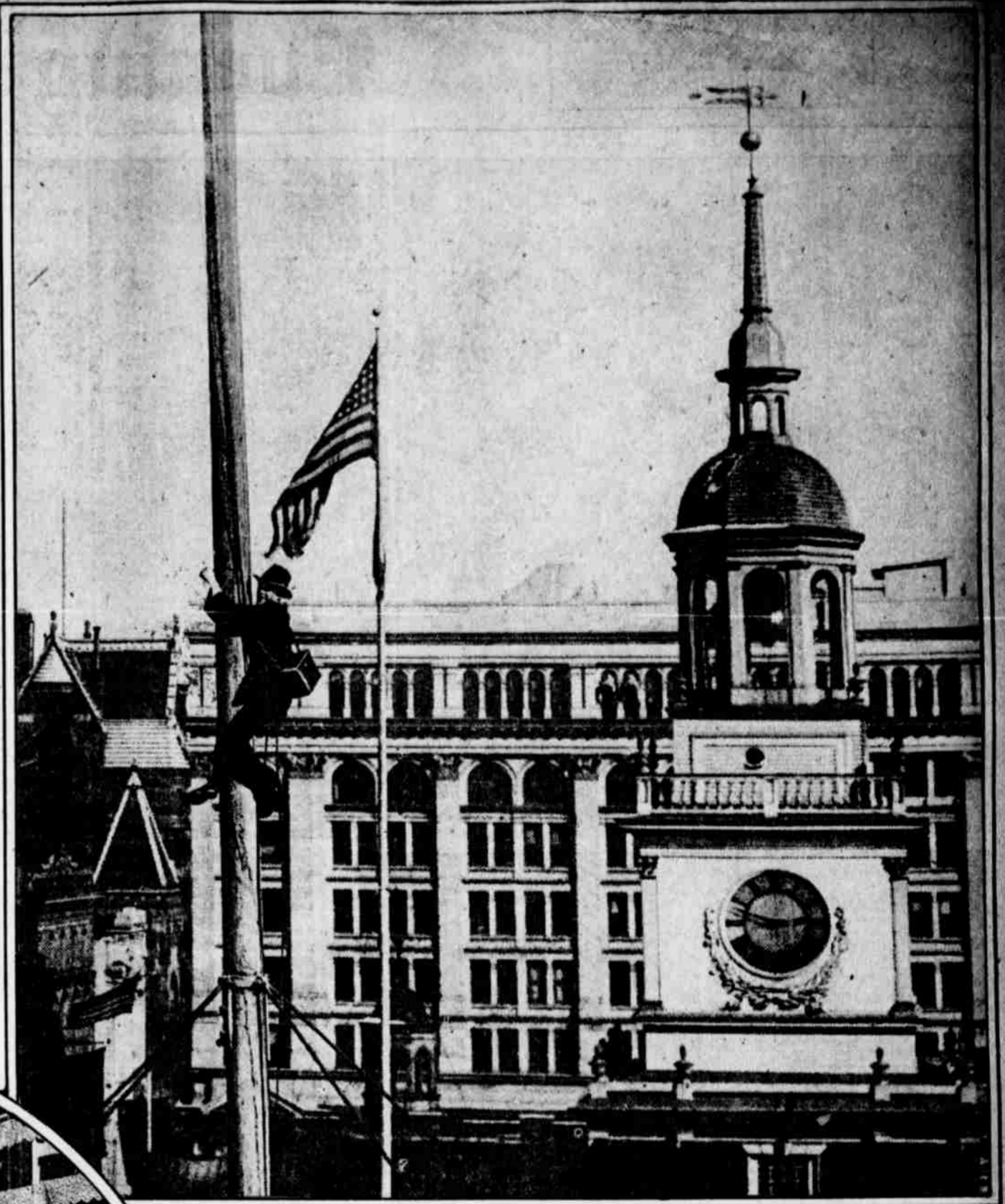
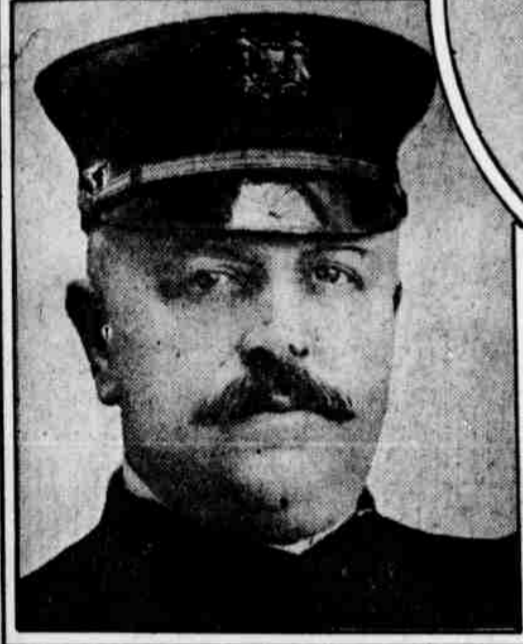


IT IS ALMOST POSSIBLE TO REACH FRANKFORD BY ELEVATED TODAY  
The superstructure along Kensington avenue has been erected to a point south of Ontario street and only a few blocks from Frankford Creek.



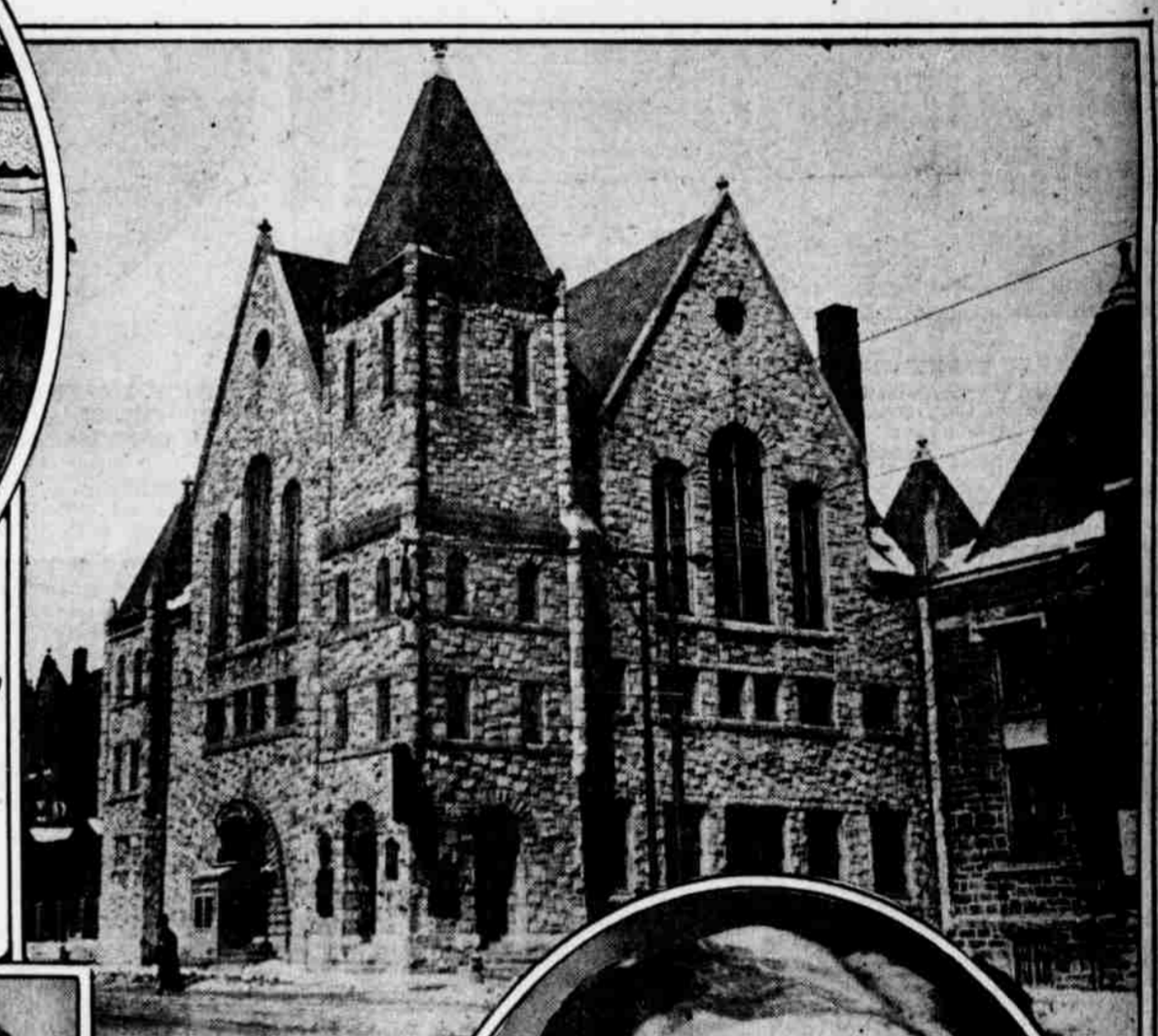
WHAT CARES THE PHOTOGRAPHER SO LONG AS HE ATTAINS HIS PRIZE

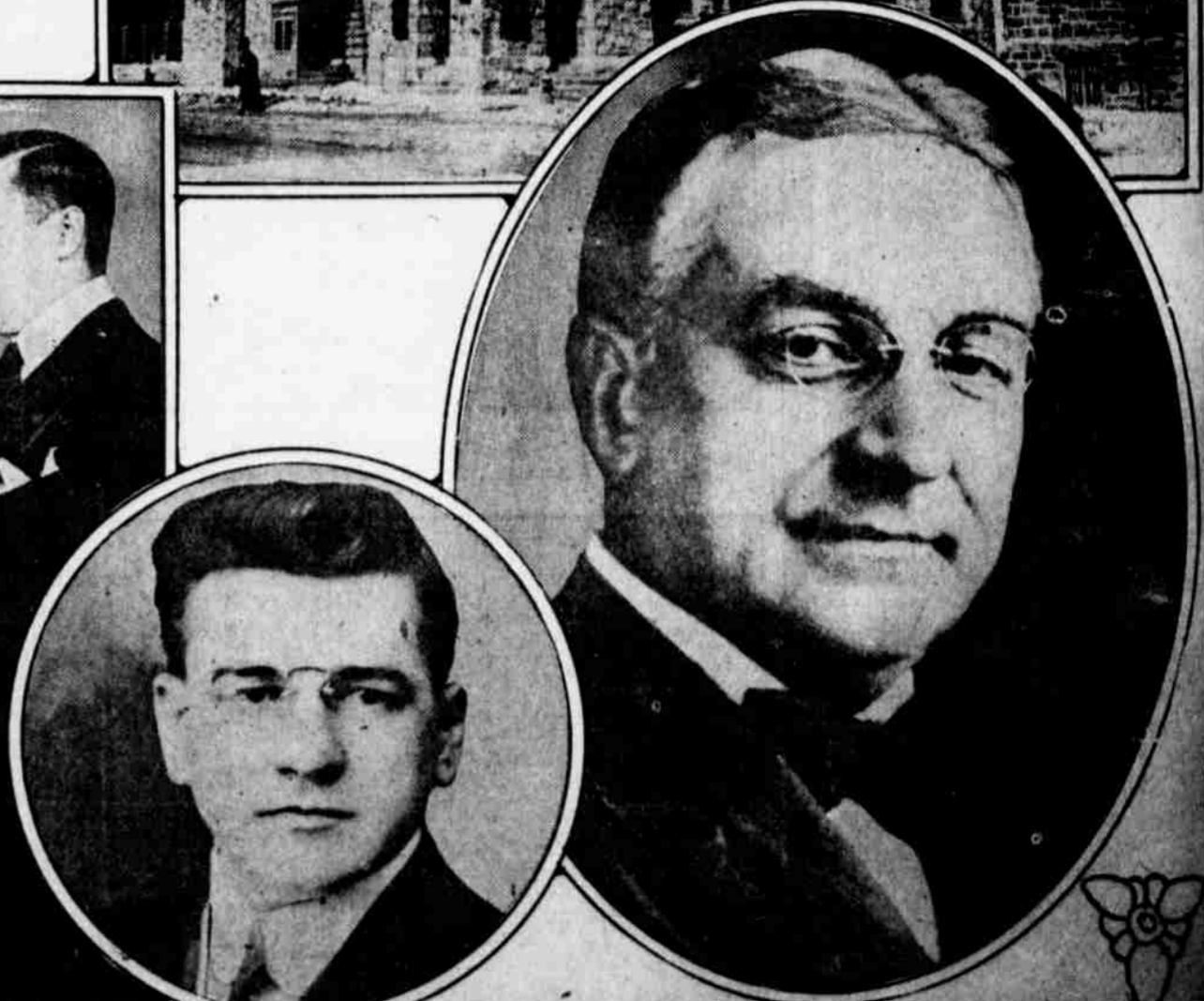
SHE STILL KEEPS STORE AT NINETY-FIVE YEARS
