

BUSINESS IN STOCKS SMALL HERE; TRADERS SHOW LITTLE INTEREST

Opinion in Street Is That Railroad Strike Will Be Averted. Majority of Changes in Prices Fractional

FEARS OF R. R. STRIKE HIT WHEAT BAD LOW

Bullish Effect of Algonquin Sinking Is Soon Offset—Ends Above Lowest

CHICAGO, March 14.—Fears of a strike on the railroads were responsible for pronounced weakness in the wheat market today. Business was curtailed somewhat by the news that the Algonquin had been sold.

Covering caused the market to finish above the bottom. After having been high as \$1.33 1/2, May dropped to \$1.25 1/2, closing at \$1.27 1/2. Yesterday, after a rise to \$1.31 1/2, it moved up to \$1.36, fell to \$1.31 1/2, ending at \$1.32 1/2.

Receipts at interior points were fairly heavy while clearance was light. The market at Liverpool was dull and easier on increased arrivals.

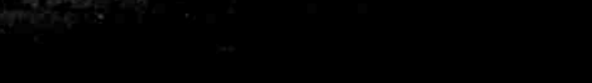
