ANNUAL SAFE-CRACKING AT GLENOLDEN STATION

Burglars' Fortieth Visit Earlier Than Usual—Several Hundred Dollars Taken

The annual visit of segment to the Glenolden station of the Pennsylvania Railroad was made at an early hour today, much earlier, in fact, than any of the thirty-nine previous calls.

When stationmaster Kirk arrived at the station this morning he noticed that the window facing the railroad tracks was open. When he entered the station he found his office in confusion.

The door had evidently been pried off with a section jimmy. Money and papers belonging to the Pennsylvania Railroad, Adams Express and the United States Post-office had been taken.

No one was able to state the exact amount taken from the safe. It is known, however, that it contained several hundred dollars.

So quietly and skillfully did the burglars work that they were unheard by any one in the town. The home of Dr. William E. Elgin is only 150 yards away from the station. It is considered probable that the thieves worked when a long freight train was passing the station, shortly after midnight.

This is the fortieth robbery of the station at Glenolden that has occurred in as many years, according to Joseph H. Patterson, who for thirty-eight years was postmaster of the town.

A combined investigation by railroad and private detectives and Government agents is being made today.
