

BOYS' LIGHTHOUSE CLUB SEES MARVEL OF POOL

City Playhouses to Be Erected When Orphans' Court Grants Permission

WILL OF RICHARD SMITH

Fidelity Trust, Executor, Plans to Carry Pleasure to Children in New Building Scheme

There'll be sandpiles an' roller skates an' merry-go-rounds! There'll be the story hour when all the folks who live in books will creep out of their pages into the twilight and talk to the real live people who come to listen!

This may sound like a kid's Utopia, but it is not. It is a real live place that is going to spring up right in the heart of Philadelphia's slums just as soon as the Orphans' Court grants the Fidelity Trust's petition for permission to spend \$600,000 for the building and maintenance of a number of city playhouses.

The situation was outlined today by Mr. William Gest, president of the Fidelity Trust, executor for the will of Richard Smith from whose estate the basis of the playground will come.

Richard Smith's plans "The will of Richard Smith, the type-founder," said Mr. Gest, "provided for the erection of the Monumental Memorial in West Fairmount Park and for the Children's Playground in East Fairmount Park.

The idea is to bring the playgrounds to the children rather than to make the children go to the playgrounds, as they do now to the Children's Playground in Fairmount Park.

The children's playhouse in Fairmount Park is a two-story Colonial building, designed by the architect James A. Hendrick. Exterioy and interiorly it affords every conceivable amusement that the heart of a boy or girl could wish for.

"D—Nature," exclaimed a famous artist once. He pulled down the curtain and painted masterpieces by gaslight. Something of the sort happens in the movies. For instance, this new Metro picture is quite top-notch in lighting, photography and all the accessory details it doesn't even have a human spot in us. But a lot of that is, after all, the fault of us who demand variety rather than a thrill, in our moving pictures. Beside the nice and clever camera work and the like, "The Harriade" contains a few unreal but tellingly melodramatic situations, possesses the stunner-like Mabel Taliaferro. Unlike most photoplay stars, she is simple, unassuming, winsome, delicate. It also possesses the best character actor to date—Barry O'Griffith's play—In the role taken by Frank Currier. This remarkable "registering" face helps to make the story of a married man who thought her father's enemy more likely than it really is.

The Chestnut Street Opera House has changed its mind about "The Crisis," and has substituted "Womanhood; or, the Glory of a Nation." This latter piece, written by Cyrus Townsend Brady and J. Stuart Blackton, is a Vitagraph production. Hushed whisperers convey the information that it deals with preparedness. "For the present," warbles the press representative, "the nature of the absorbingly interesting dramatic tale is not revealed, but it is anticipated that the treatment that has been given by the authors to a subject of vital importance." It opens next Monday afternoon.

Robert Harron, one of the most mobile of the young motion-picture players and the former Griffith protegee, has signed with the ambitious Goldwyn firm. Mr. Harron, who will be Mae Marsh's leading man, has already begun work for the Goldwyn-Selwyn interests under the direction of John W. Noble. These and many other remarks greeted William A. Curwen of 40 Church lane, last night, when he was tied hand and foot by volunteer members of the audience, tied in a sack with all his clothes on and thrown into the swimming pool at the Boys' Club of the Lighthouse, Howard and Somerset streets.

Curwen then, in the twinkling of an eye, in some mysterious and secret manner, untied his hands and feet, slipped out of his strait clothing, out of the sack and appeared on the surface in his bathing suit. Curwen is as much at home in the water as he is on land. He is now thirty-three years old and has been swimming, making records and winning prizes, ever since he was a boy. He began his swimming in his native country, England, and when he was ten years old held all records for English schoolboys from fifty yards to a quarter mile for many years.

In 1904 he entered the ranks of the professional swimming instructor. Since coming to the United States he has trained scores of America's best swimmers. Miss Olga, world's champion swimmer, and champion in the United States up to a quarter mile, and Middle Atlantic A. W. championship, was one of his pupils.

The demonstration last night was the first event of a three-day celebration of the centennial anniversary of the Boys' Club of the Lighthouse. This organization has more than 1000 members. It has had 8000 members, most of whom are now too old to be in the Boys' Club. B. D. Kiees is in charge of the Boys' Club.
