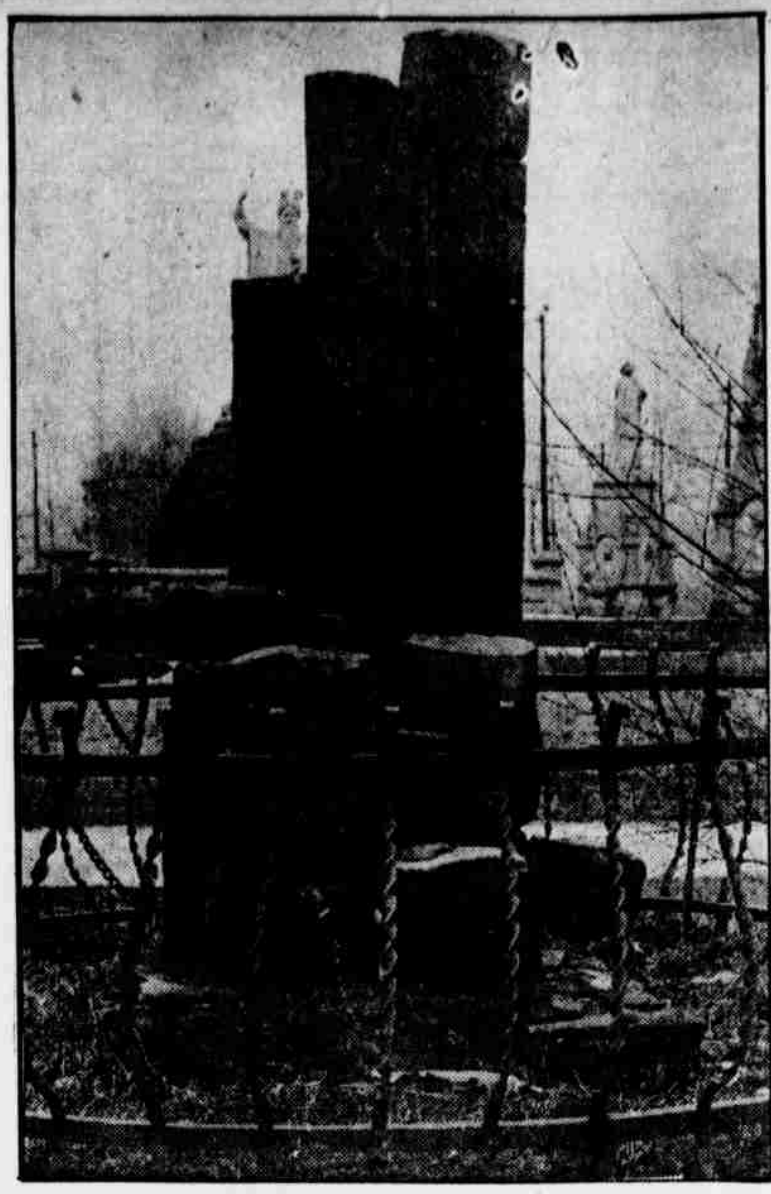




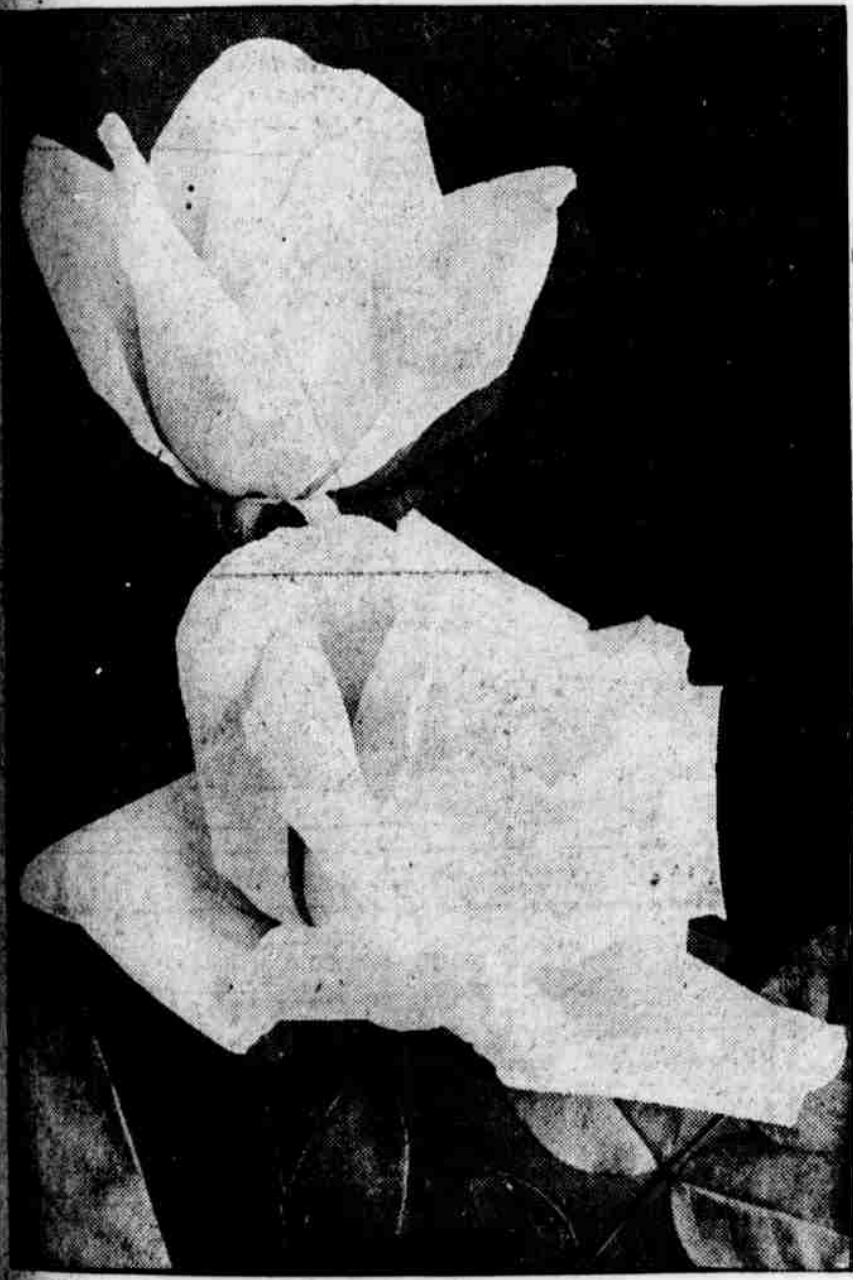
FOUR OF A KIND, AND EVERY ONE A PAT

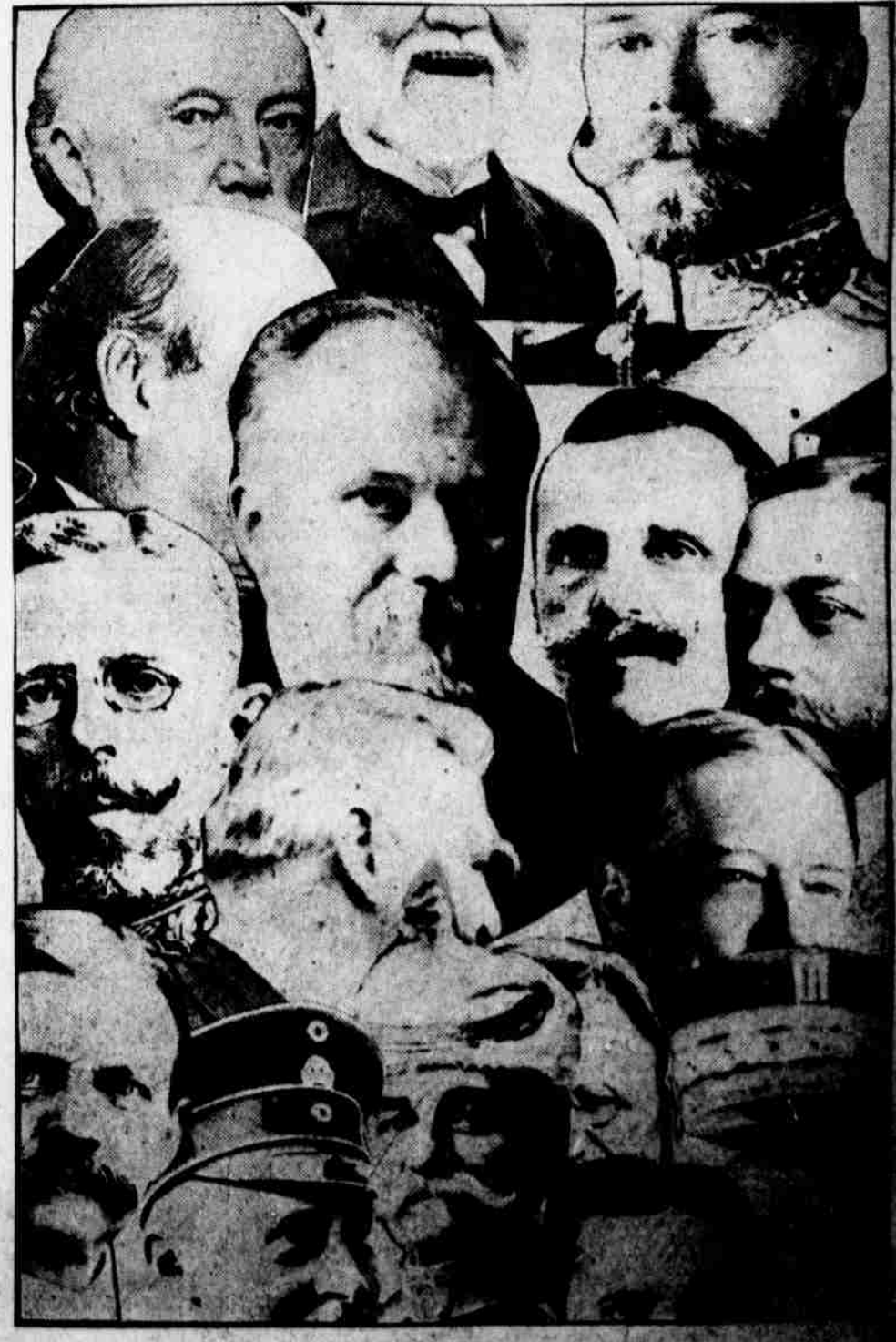
MR. AND MRS. GEORGE SUNDAY ENJOY THE SEASHORE BREEZES
