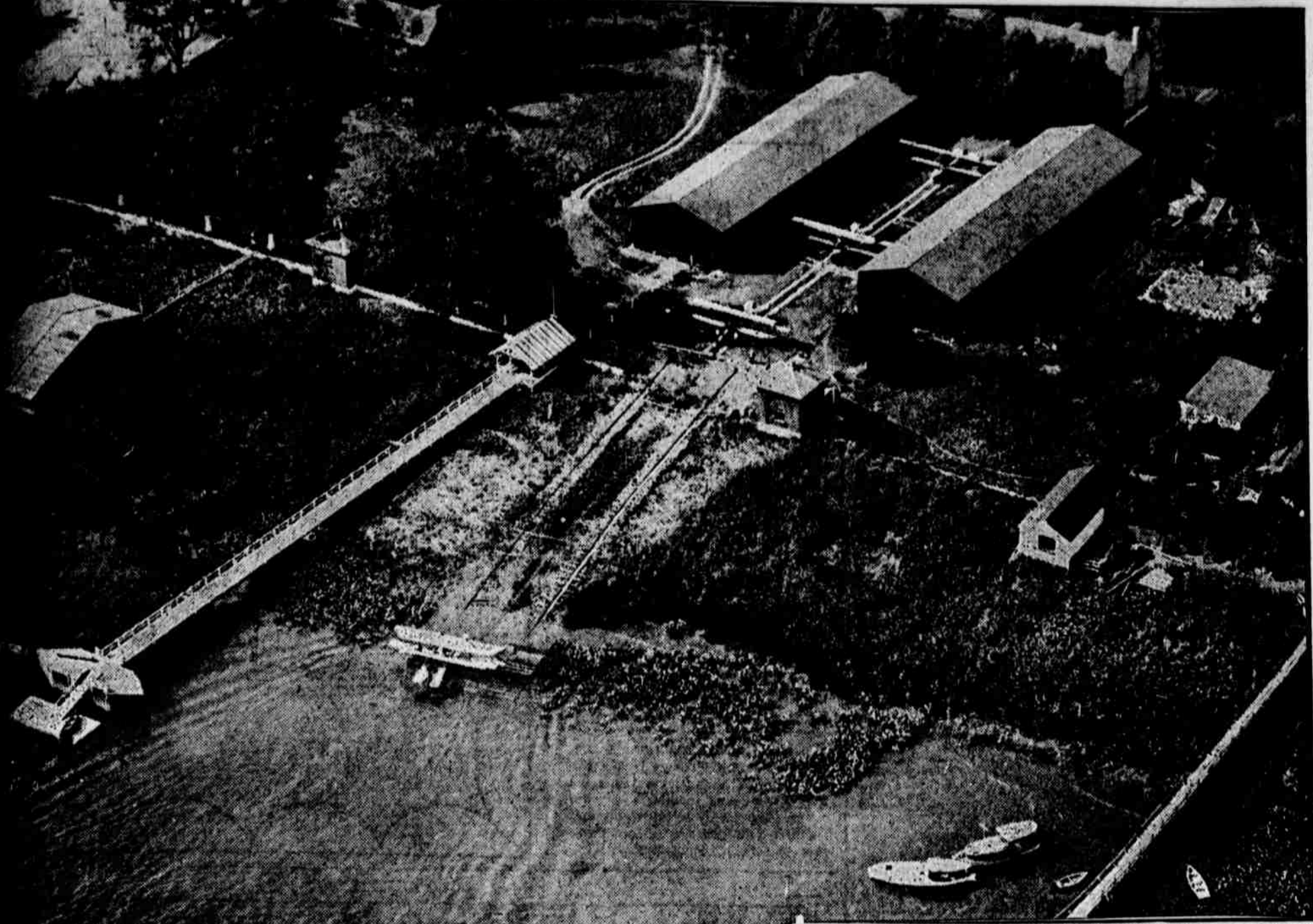

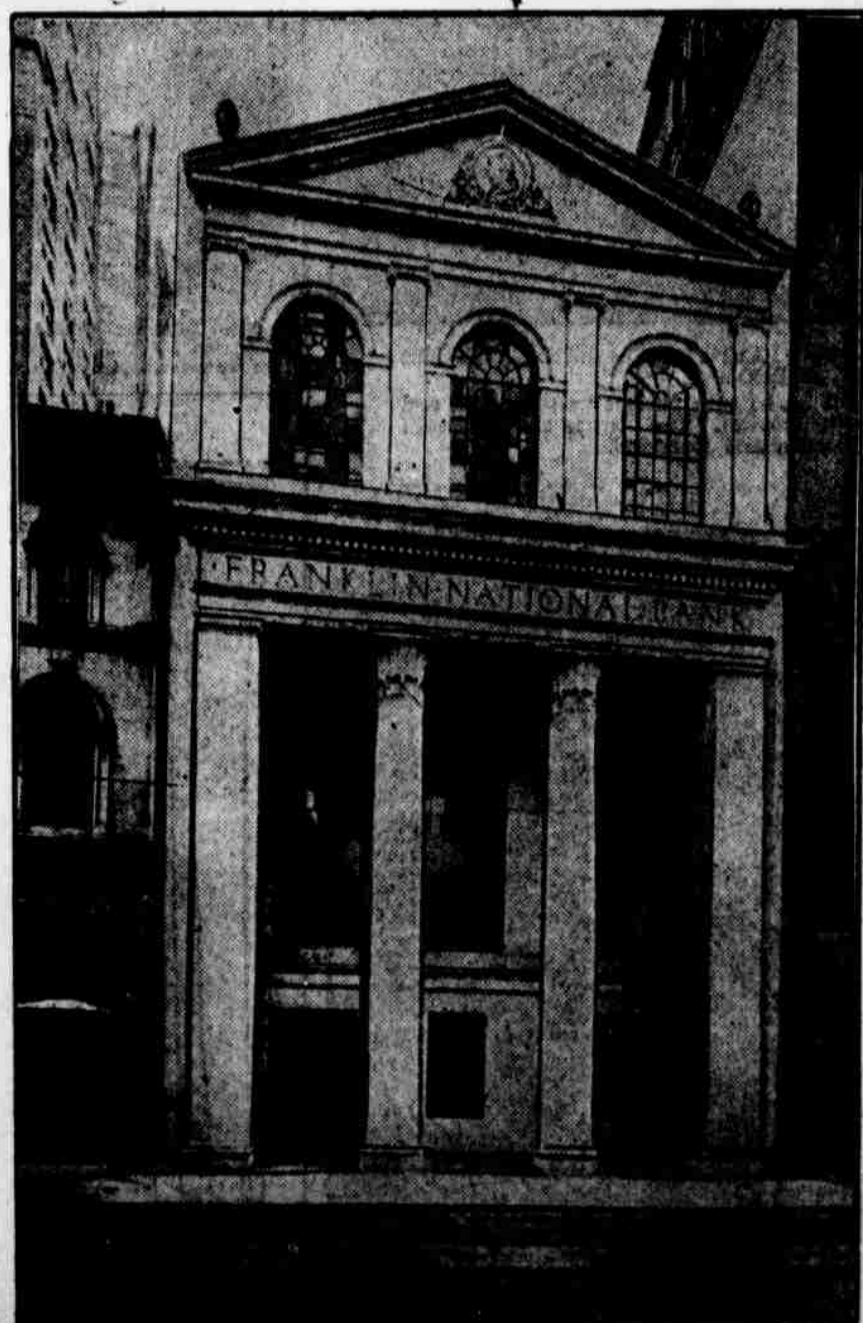
A FUTURE EYRIE OF UNCLE SAM'S WAR EAGLES

William F. Denny as Herod and Clare G. Fenerty as Athias in the production by St. Joseph's College Dramatic Association in the Metropolitan Opera House next week.



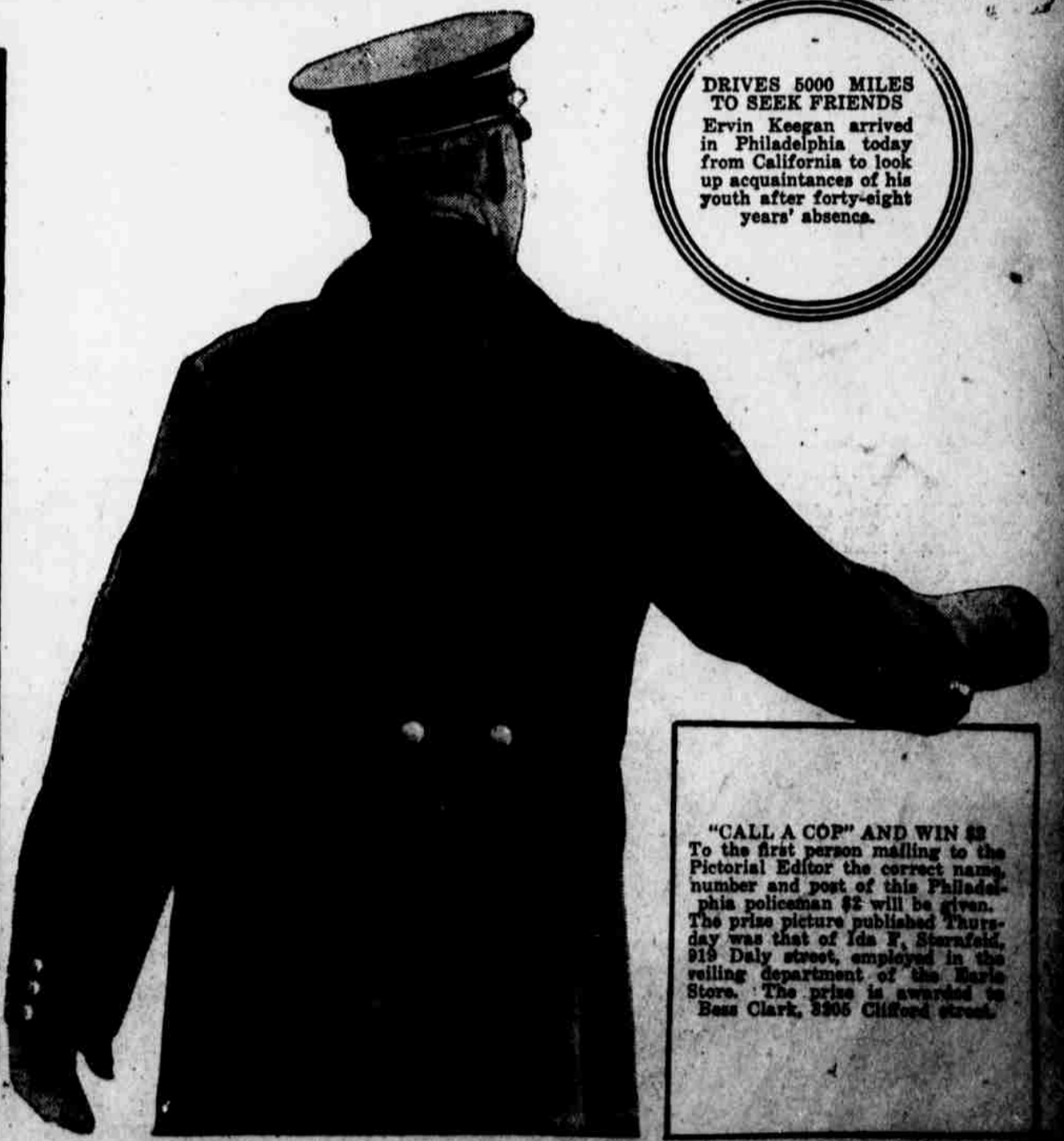
FLORAL QUEENS OF THE FESTIVAL
