

READY TO ENLIST
Wireless Operators Will Offer Services to U. S. on Call

COLLINGSWOOD, N. J., March 28.—With the aid of Secretary Redfield last night, the continuing issuance of licenses to amateur wireless operators and the initiation of such plans would be closed, the 200 or more operators of this vicinity began preparations for possible war service.

These stations are all owned by young men who have taken up wireless as a hobby, but who have developed so rapidly through their organization that many have become experts. Many of them have been carrying on normal operation of wireless equipment, but they have conducted research work and in several instances have perfected appliances which are in use by experts, including Government stations.

Check on Amateur Wireless
WASHINGTON, March 28.—Issuance of licenses for amateur wireless apparatus has been suspended by Secretary Redfield. Virtually none of the amateurs has sending stations at this time, and only a few have been licensed by the Government being called upon to perform certain duties in war.

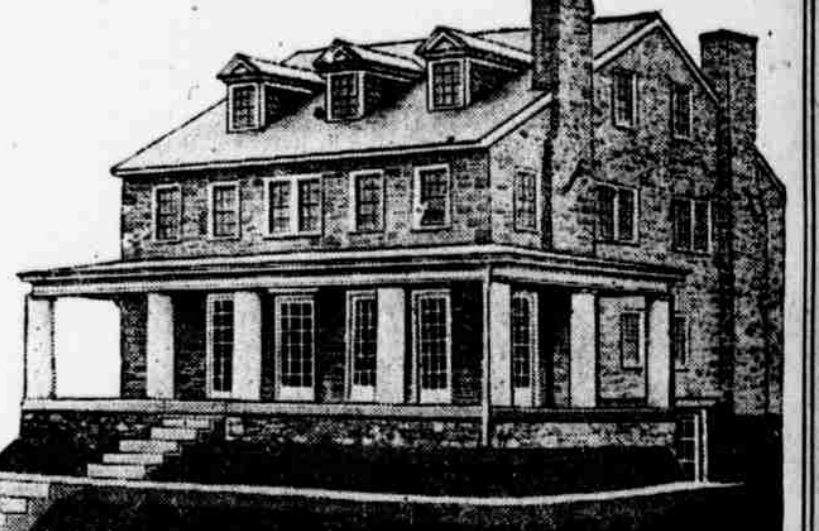
