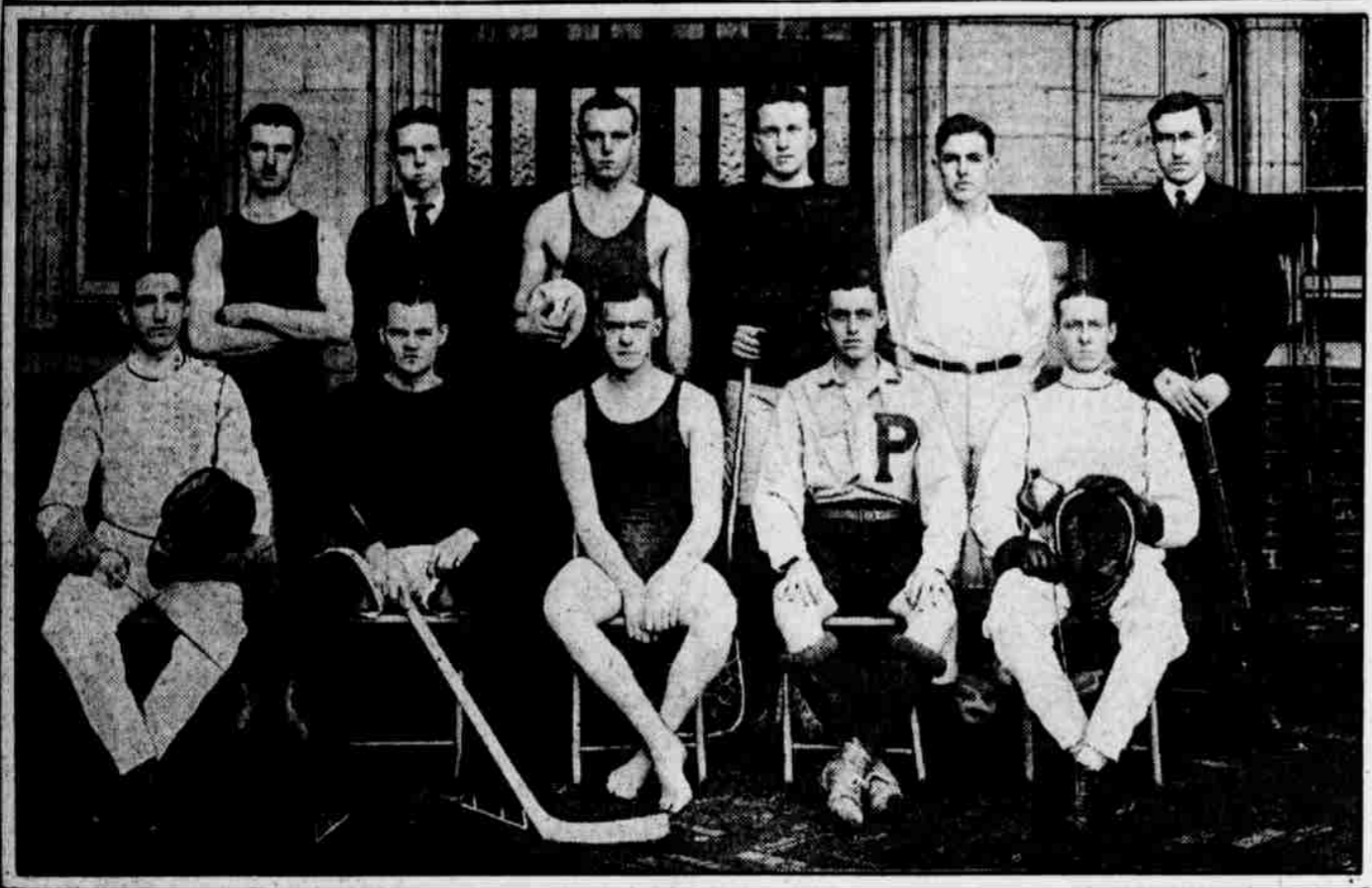

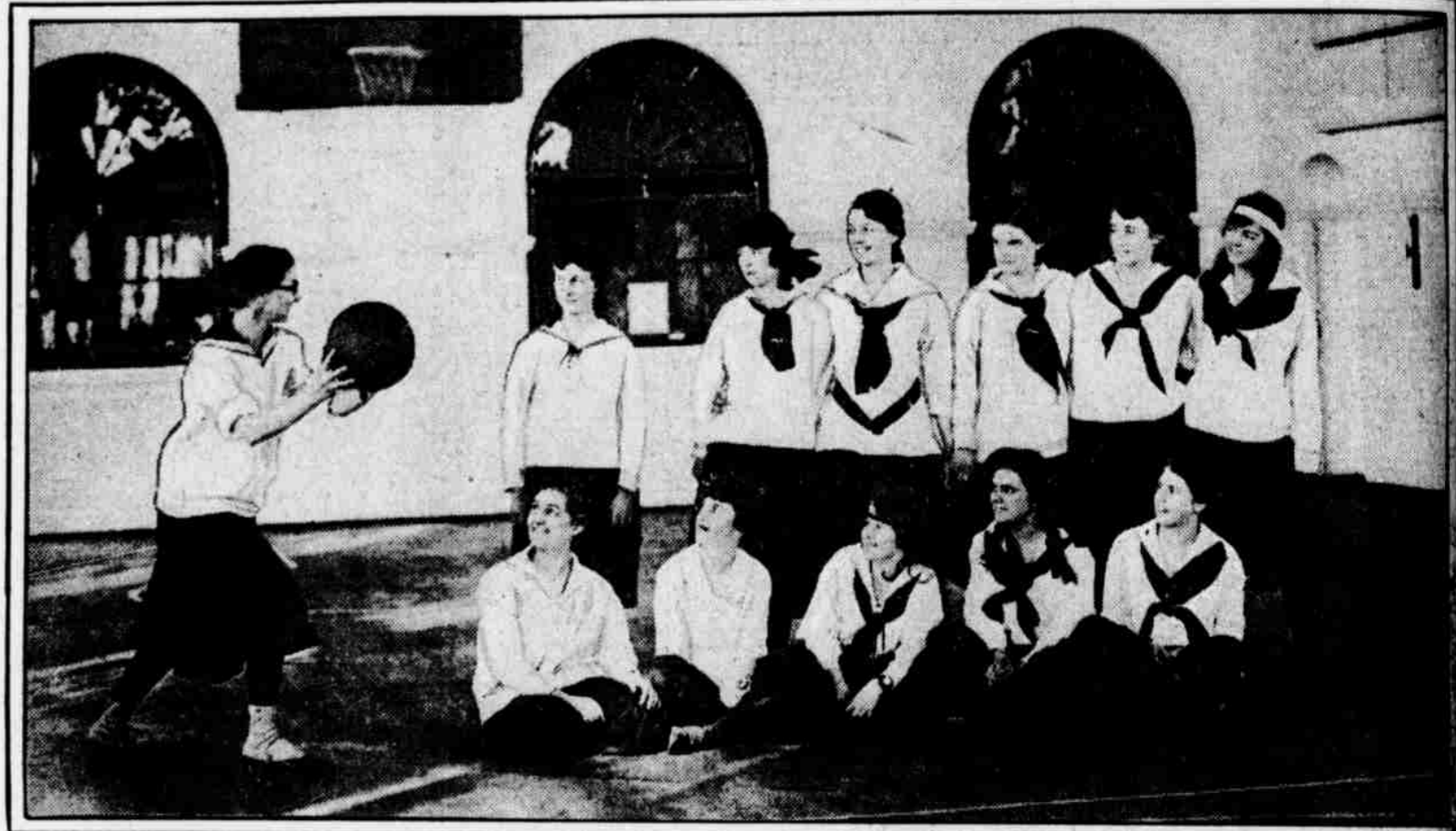
BOATHOUSE ROW REPORTS "DECKS CLEARED" FOR THE REGATTA SEASON
Headquarters of the various rowing clubs along the Schuylkill are patronized daily by ambitious oarsmen eager for aquatic honors.



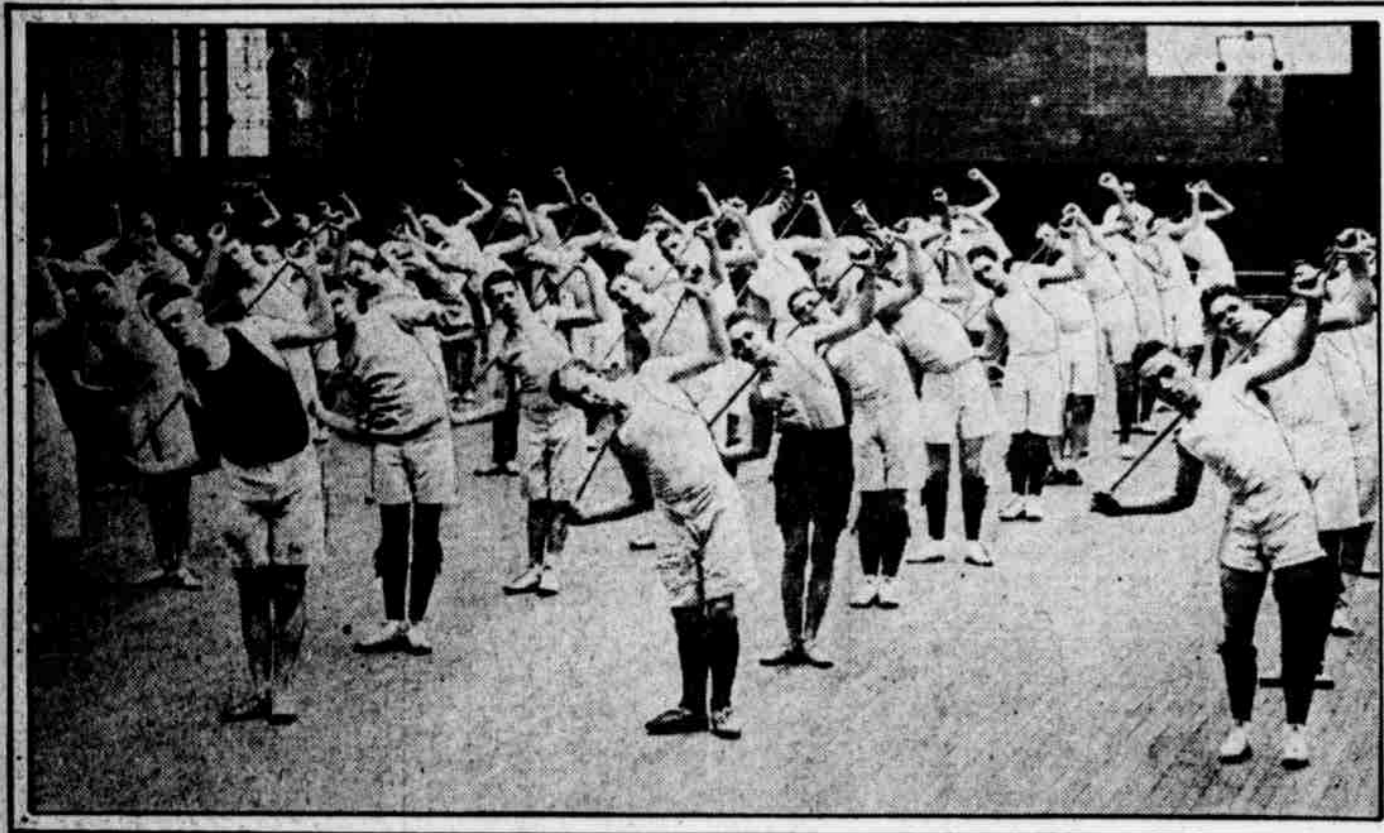
