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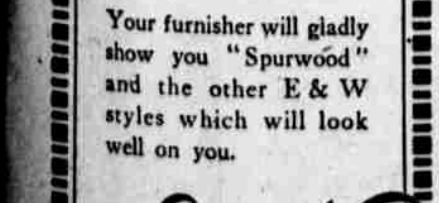

WASHINGTON, 6 Aprile. Finalmente anche la Camera dei Rappresentanti, dopo una lunga e vivace discussione nella quale chiunque volle poter essere udito, ha approvato la notte scorsa, alle 3 a. m. la risoluzione già approvata dal Senato dichiarando la guerra alla Germania.

P. R. T. ENDS DELAY IN FRANKFORD "L"

After Six Months' Hold-Up Re-novs Spreading of Surface Tracks on Avenue

After more than six months of delay the Philadelphia Rapid Transit Company has resumed the work of spreading the Frankford avenue surface tracks between Unity and Bridge streets to make way for the foundations of the Frankford elevated.

Senator Vare was awarded the contract for the "L" foundations on February 5, 1916. He was scheduled to begin work on March 20 and have his section completed by April 29, 1916. Director Twining notified the Transit Company that it would be necessary for it to spread the tracks in order for the foundation work to proceed, and at the Director's request Councils appropriated \$16,000 to reimburse the company.

The Transit Company finally began the work of spreading the tracks early last fall. After completing about 500 feet from Church to Unity street, work was suddenly stopped for the reason, the company officials said, that a switch which was ordered from the steel mills had not arrived.
