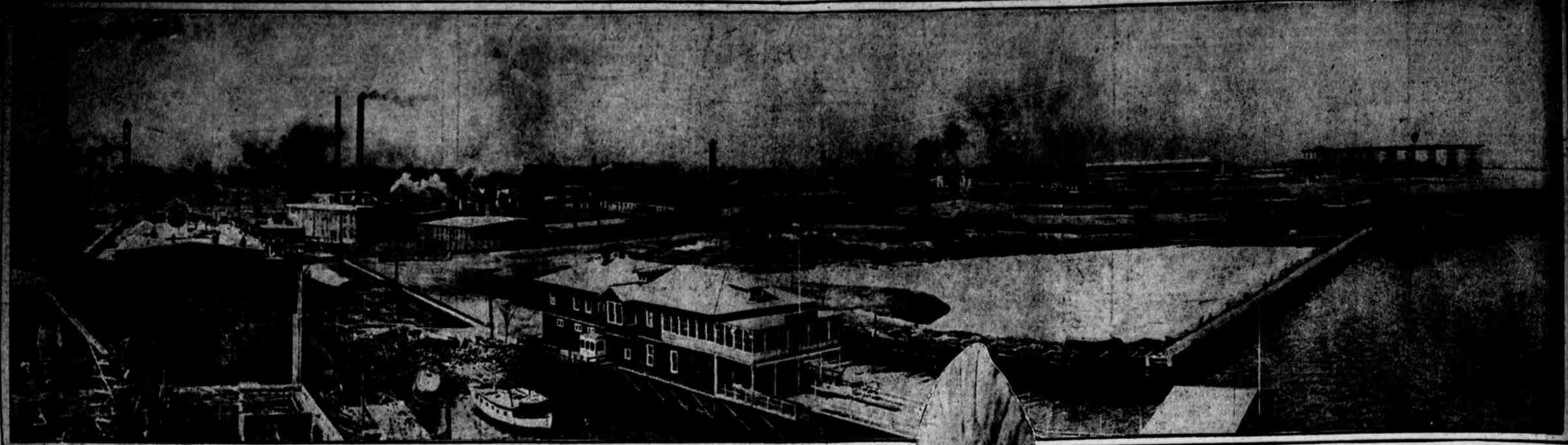

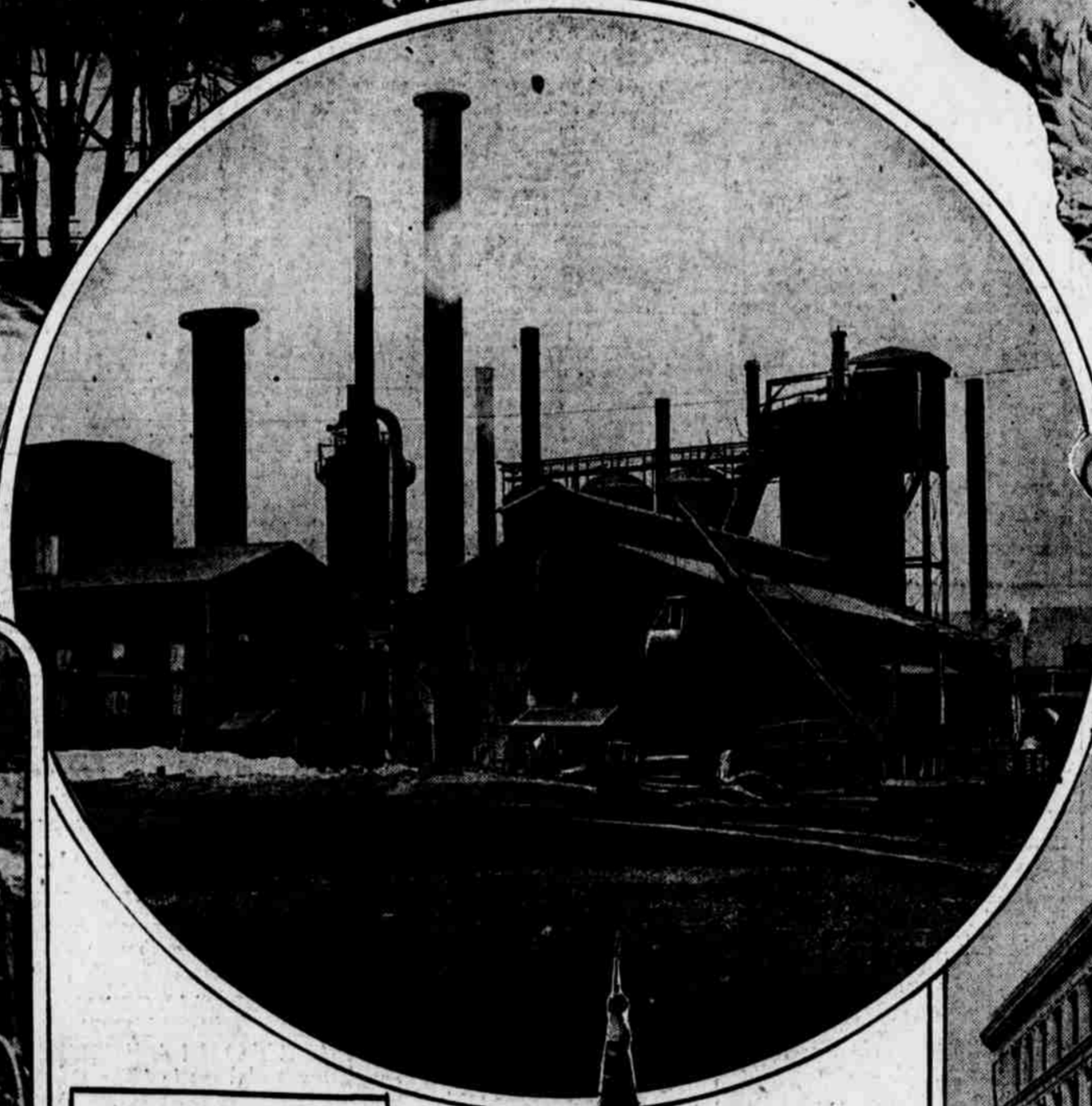


A GLANCE ALONG THE WATER FRONT SUFFICES TO SHOW WHY CHESTER PROSPERS

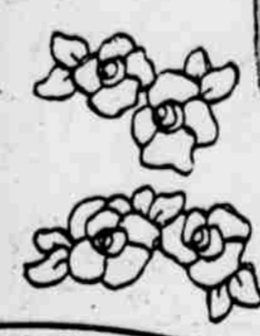

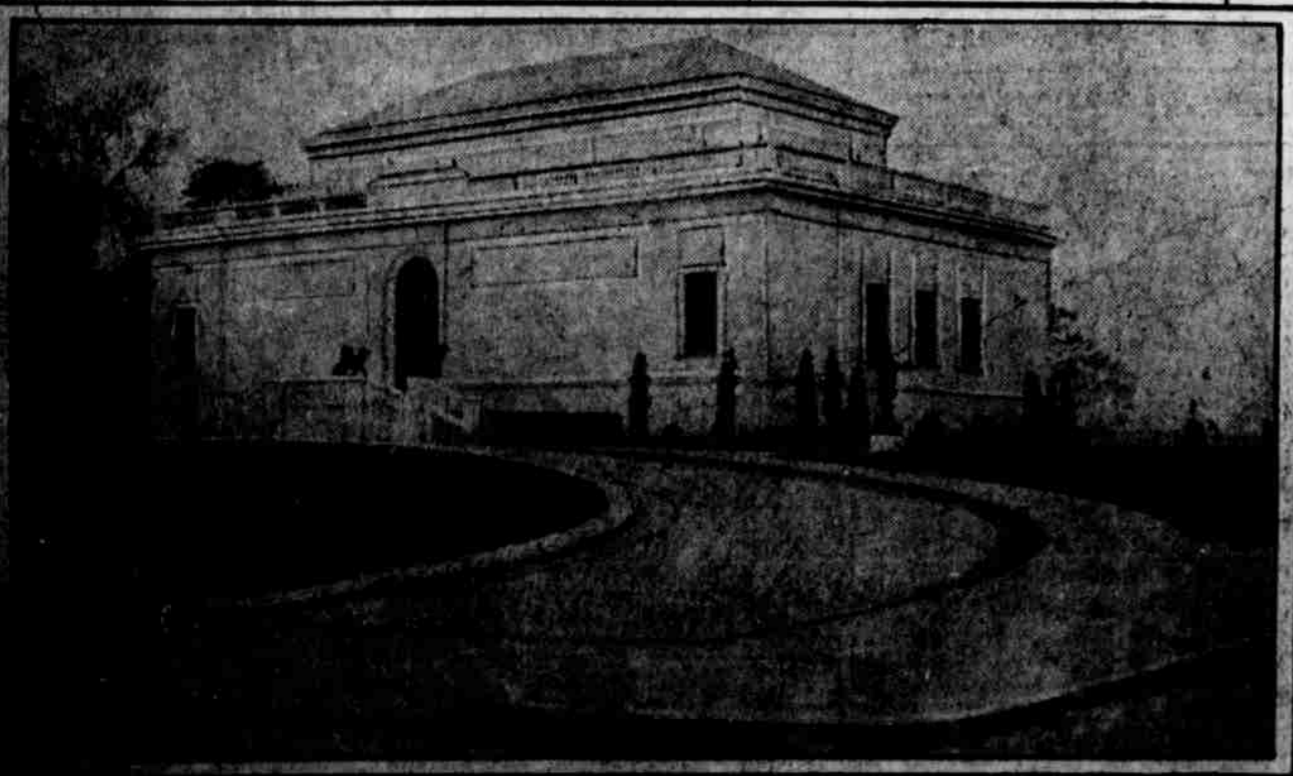
A NURSERY OF THE BAPTIST MINISTRY

Mayor W. S. McDowell, with Charles B. Mould at left and James Merrick at right. On the right, the Delaware River Steel Company plant.



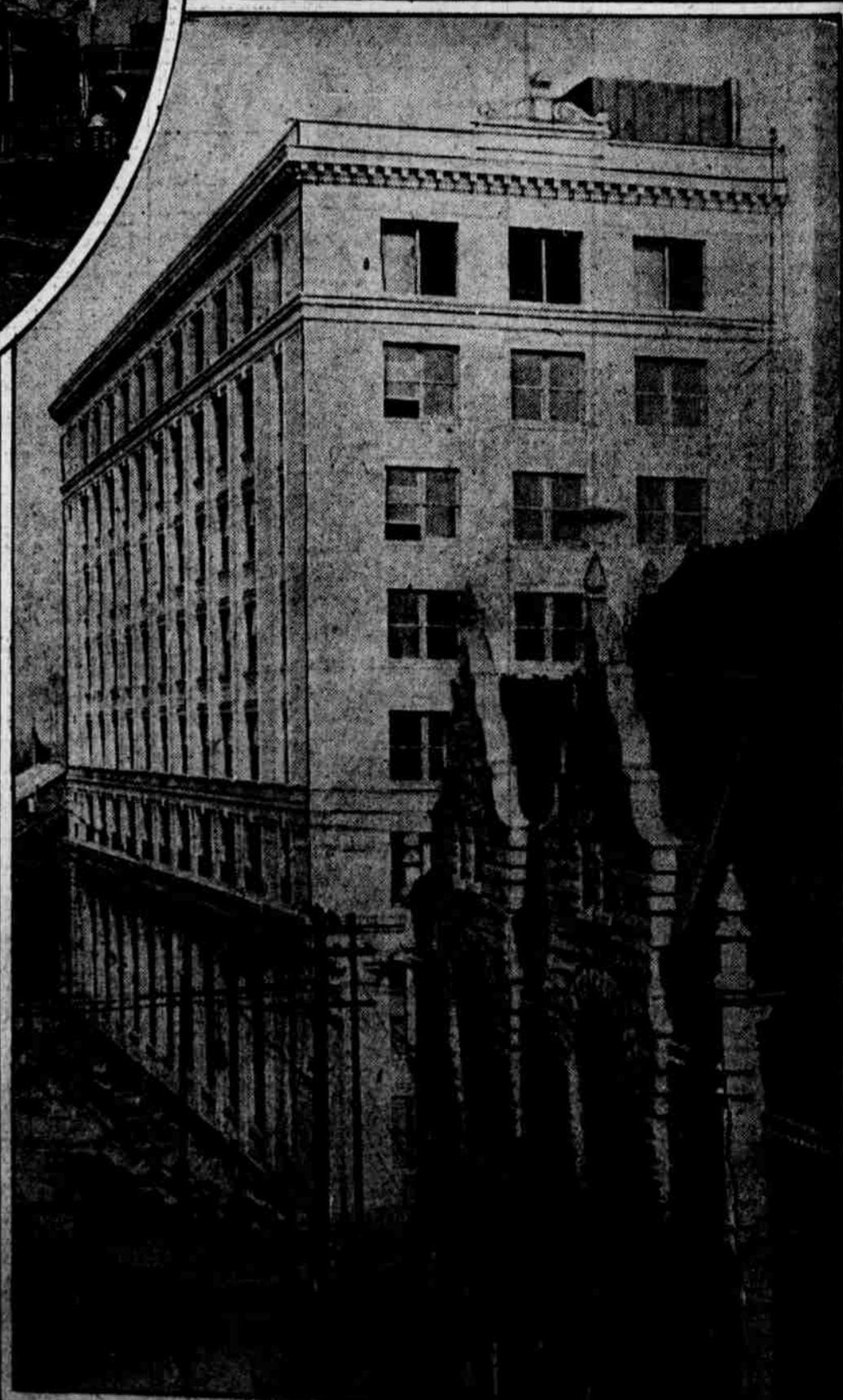
BIRD OF FREEDOM SYMBOLIZES CHESTER'S PREPAREDNESS
