# **PREPARATION FOR CROWD AT DERBY**

Grand Stand and Paddocks to Be Enlarged for Big Kentucky Event

SCHEDULED FOR MAY 12

LOUISVILLE, April 27.—In order to take care of the enormous crowd that is expected to turn out to witness the running of the Kentucky Derby May 12. Colonel Matt J. Winn is making many notable improve-ments at Churchill Downs.

The principal improvements have to do with the enlargement of the grand stand and paddock space, so as to afford the crowd plenty of elbow room and avoid congestion, The fence that formerly served as the boundary between grand stand and paddock enclosures has been removed, thus making the entire space one enclosure. Churchill Downs will enjoy the distinction Churchin Downs will enjoy the distinction of being the only race track on the conti-ment not charging admission to the pad-dock. Several thousand benches have been constructed, and these will be placed on the paddock lawns for the accommodation of those unable to secure seats in the grand stand. It has been decided to increase the price of admission Derby Day to \$2. On all other days the charge will be the same as hereto. fore. Increased space for the pari-mutuel de-partment is another item that has engaged the attention of the management. It is being planned to have seventy ticket sellers and a like number of cashiers working Derby Day, which number is expected to be large enough to take care of the wants of the speculatively inclined.
