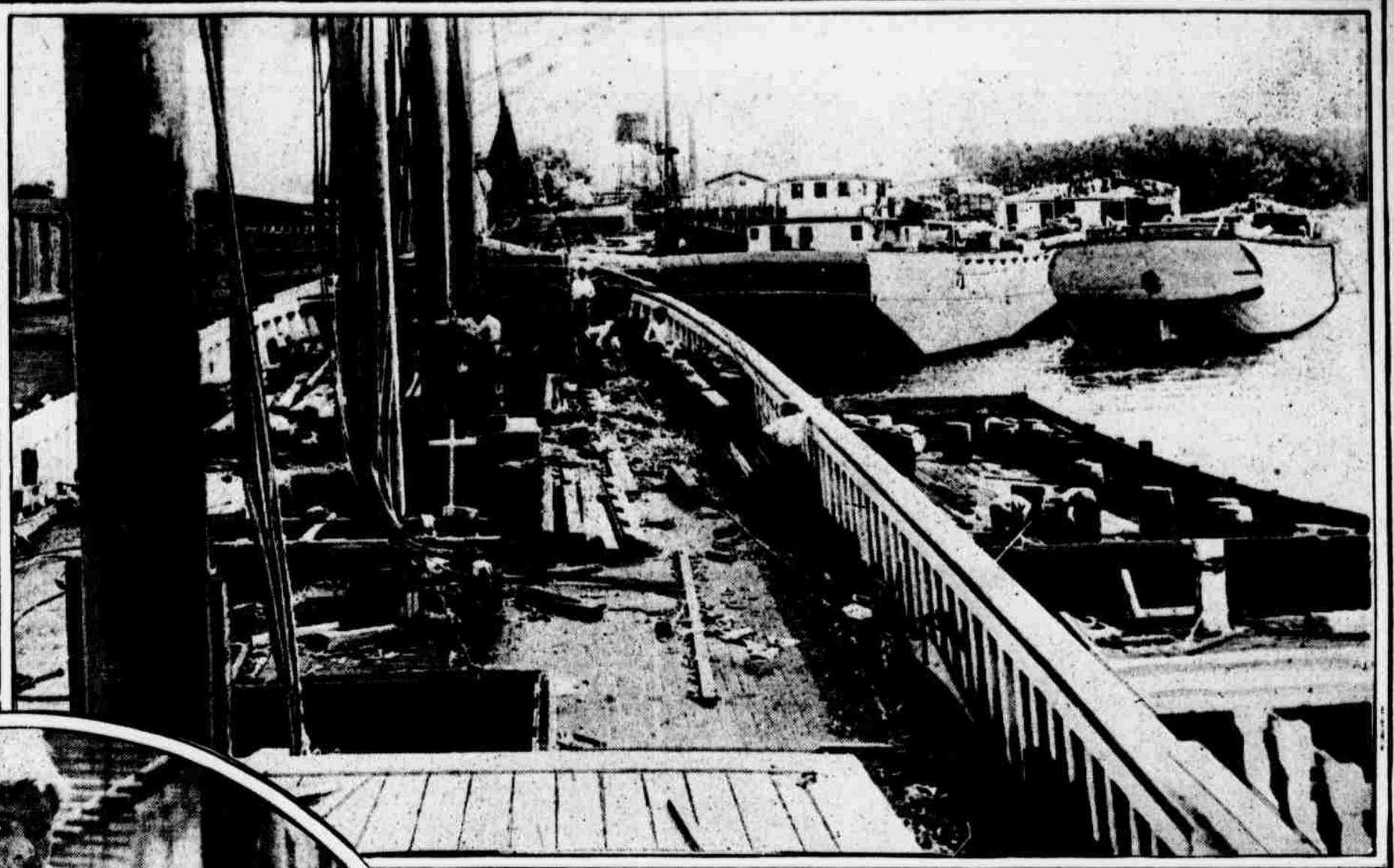


YOUNG AND OLD, WITH PATRIOTIC ARDOR, STRIVE TO SUPPLY THE NATION'S NEED

Wooden ships are being built by hundreds for merchant service, and yards on the Delaware are doing much of the work.

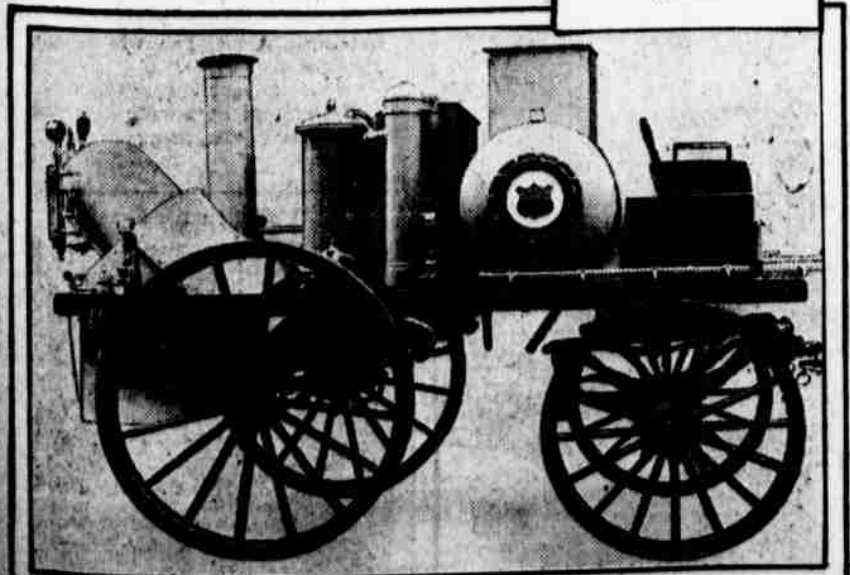


BOY SCOUT OFFERS HIS PET TO GUARD CITY WATER WORKS

The British lion is converted into a docile cavalry mount by this South Philadelphia band of youngsters.

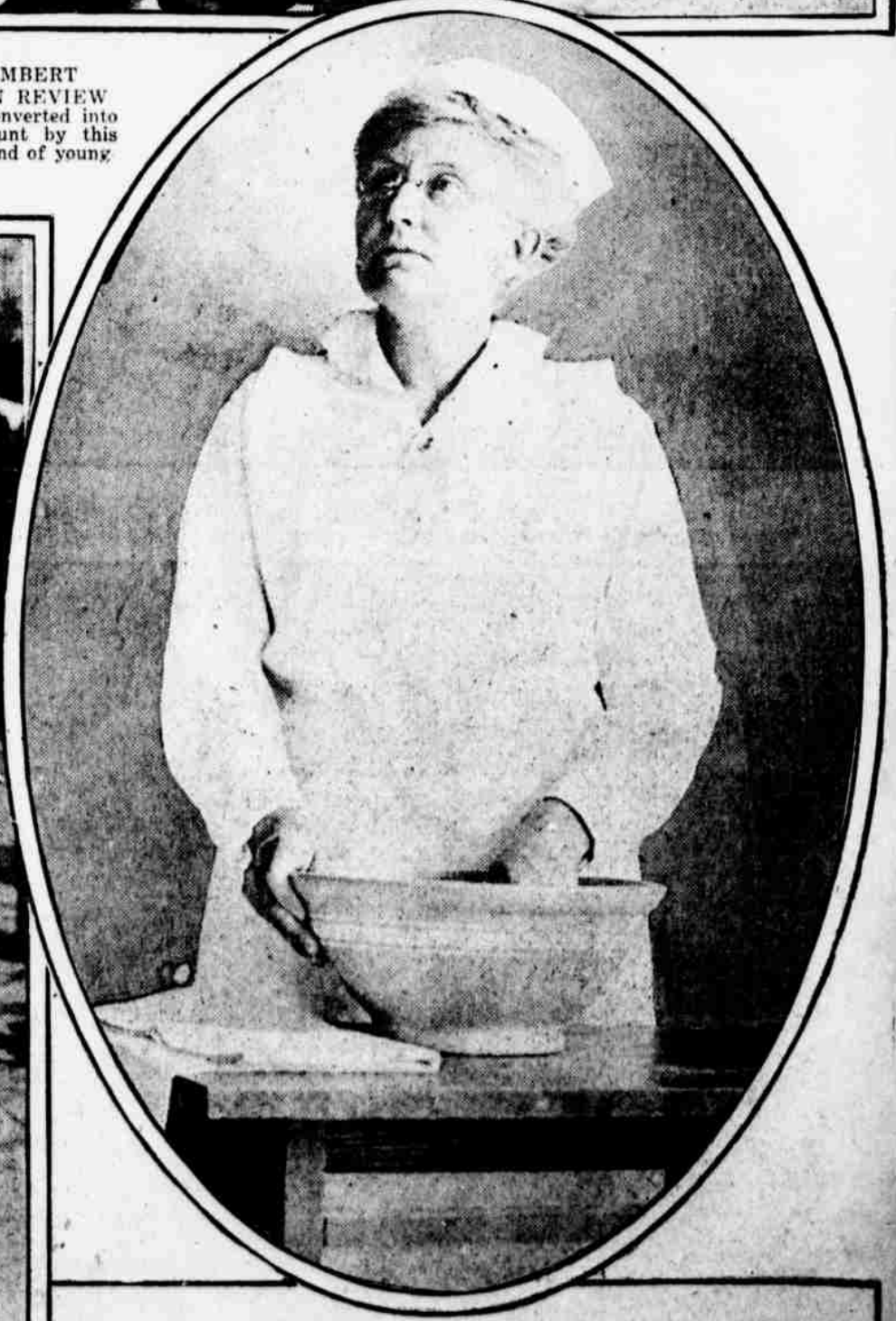
YOUNGEST "GENERAL" IN THE VOLUNTEER SERVICE
