SOCIALISTS IN U. S. HELPING GERMANS

Stokes Tells Lansing Some Urge Russians to Make Peace

THREAT OF PROSECUTION

WASHINGTON, May 4.—German socialists in this country who attempt to force or influence a separate peace between Russia and Germany will be dealt with to the full extent of American law, if their crimes can be proved.

The State Department indicated as much unmistakably today, following publication of allegations by J. G. Phelps Stokes, wealthy Socialist, that some of the German wings of the American Socialists are trying to force such a peace.

American law provides for dealing with such action as extremely treasonable.

The government has noted the Stokes accusations and will endeavor to ascertain whether any of the men Stokes names, or any others, are trying to manipulate such a peace through their Russian contacts.

That one radical, Morris Einstein, a Socialist laborer, excited two days ago for Russia to stir up the Russian radicals against Elihu Root, chairman of the proposed American mission, was learned today after Joseph Kades How, ambassador to a Socialist, called at the State Department to discuss a plan for universal peace.

How revealed that other Socialists had been making frantic efforts to communicate with their comrades in Russia. How recommended to the State Department that a Socialist and a suffragist be included in the mission to Russia.

Incidentally he indicated that radicals are opposed to Balfour, and he showed literature which his organization is printing against Balfour. How himself disapproved too harsh criticism of Elihu Root.

The State Department frowned upon How's propaganda for peace and, it is known, is displeased with the propaganda How and others of the Socialist group are now circulating.

The new censorship will be applied rigorously to prevent men Stokes named from communicating with the Russian Socialist leaders.

Authorities still claim that Russian internal troubles ultimately will vanish, and that the Russian army will stand steadfast against the Germans.

BERGER BALKS AT ROOT ON RUSSIAN BOARD

MILWAUKEE, Wis., May 4.—Victor L. Berger, Socialist newspaper editor, today declined to become a member of the American commission to Russia. His name was recently mentioned in this connection.

"I do not believe that Elihu Root, a well-known representative of American plutocracy—and the persecutor of Rudowitz and Potvin; the Russian revolutionists who escaped to America—is the right man to advise the Russian democracy and especially the Russian Social Democracy; what to do in this world crisis," says Berger's letter to a member of Congress.

ROCHAMBEAU ESCAPES ATTACK BY SUBMARINE

Torpedo Misses Big French Liner, En Route Home, by Ten Yards

PARIS, May 4.—The French liner Rochambeau, recently arrived at a French port, narrowly escaped a torpedo fired by a German submarine,

according to one of her passengers today. The torpedo passed a bare ten yards astern. The Rochambeau immediately fired a dozen shells at the submarine. Whether or not they found their mark is not known.

As soon as the submarine was sighted the Rochambeau's officers sounded the alarm and all passengers were hurried to the lifeboats. There was no panic.

Patrol vessels arrived at the scene within twenty minutes, but did not sight the undersea craft.

Only the Rochambeau's speed apparently saved her from a "hit" by the submarine.
