Bank Adds \$100,000 to Capital WASHINGTON, May 5.—The Comptroller of the Currency announced the approval of an increase of capital from \$300,000 to \$400,000 by the Ninth National Bank of Philadelphia. He announced also an extension of the charter of the Moshannon National Bank of Phillipsburg, until May 4, 1937, and the liquidation of the First National Bank of Felton, Del. The liquidation of the latter institution was the liquidation of the old institution being succeeded by Felton Bank.
