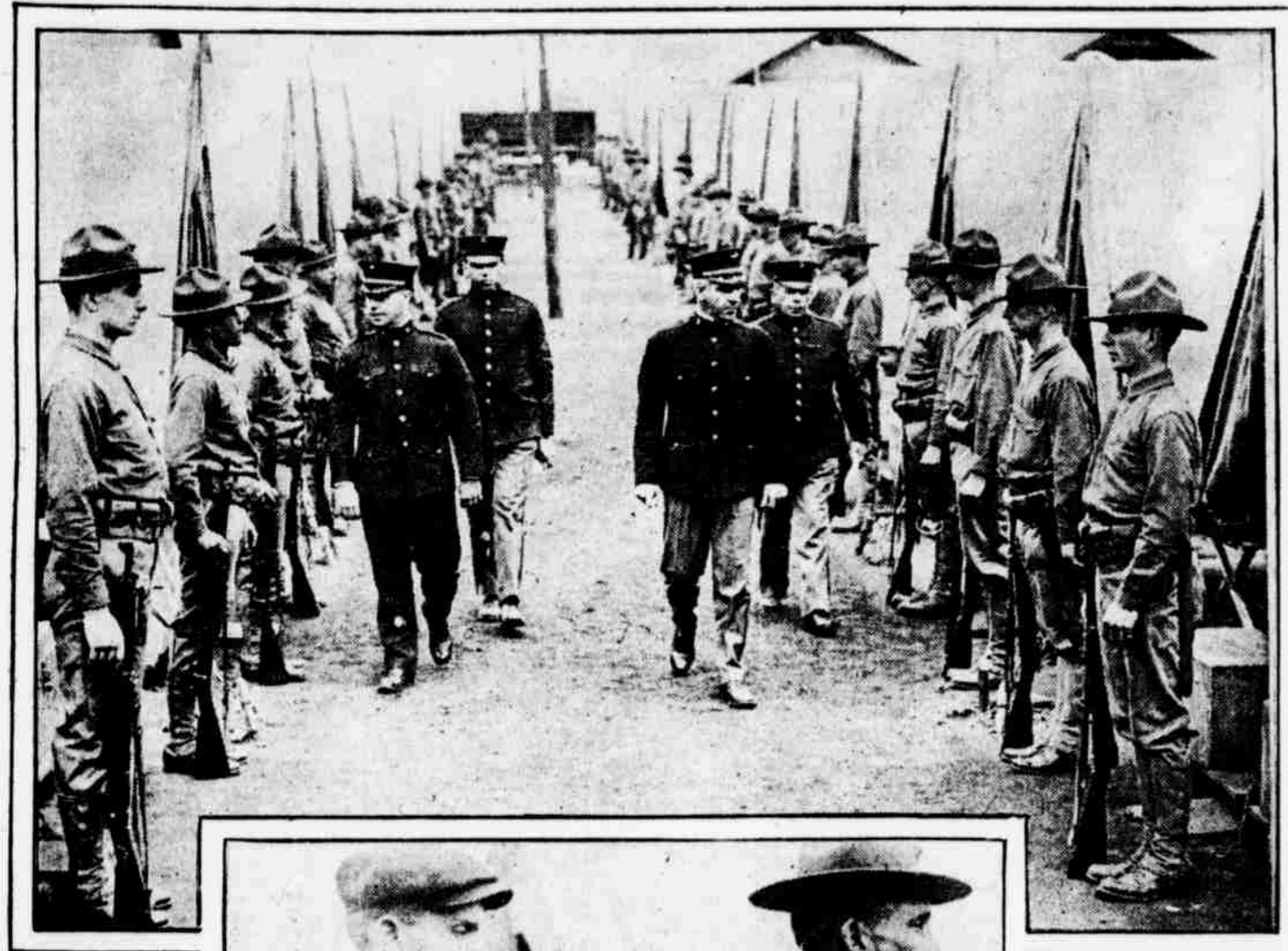


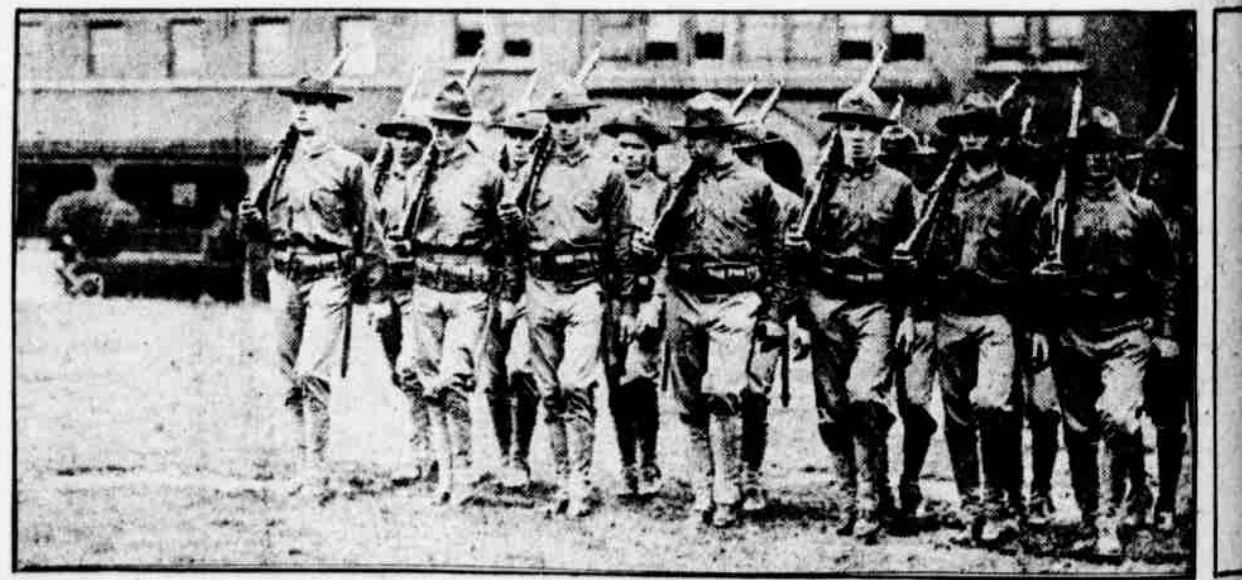
EXCLUSIVE PHOTOGRAPHS TAKEN INSIDE NAVY YARD SINCE BEGINNING OF THE WA

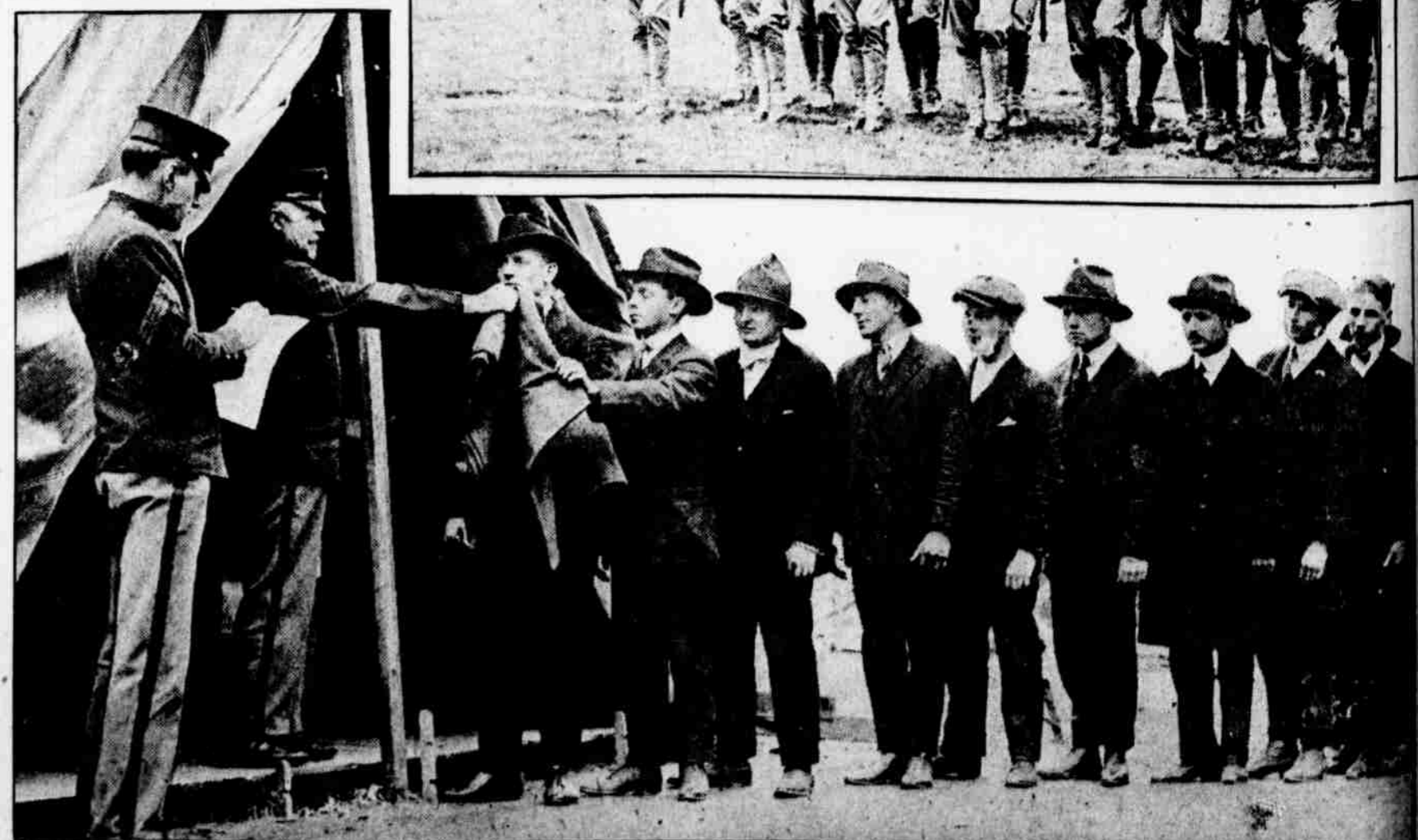
