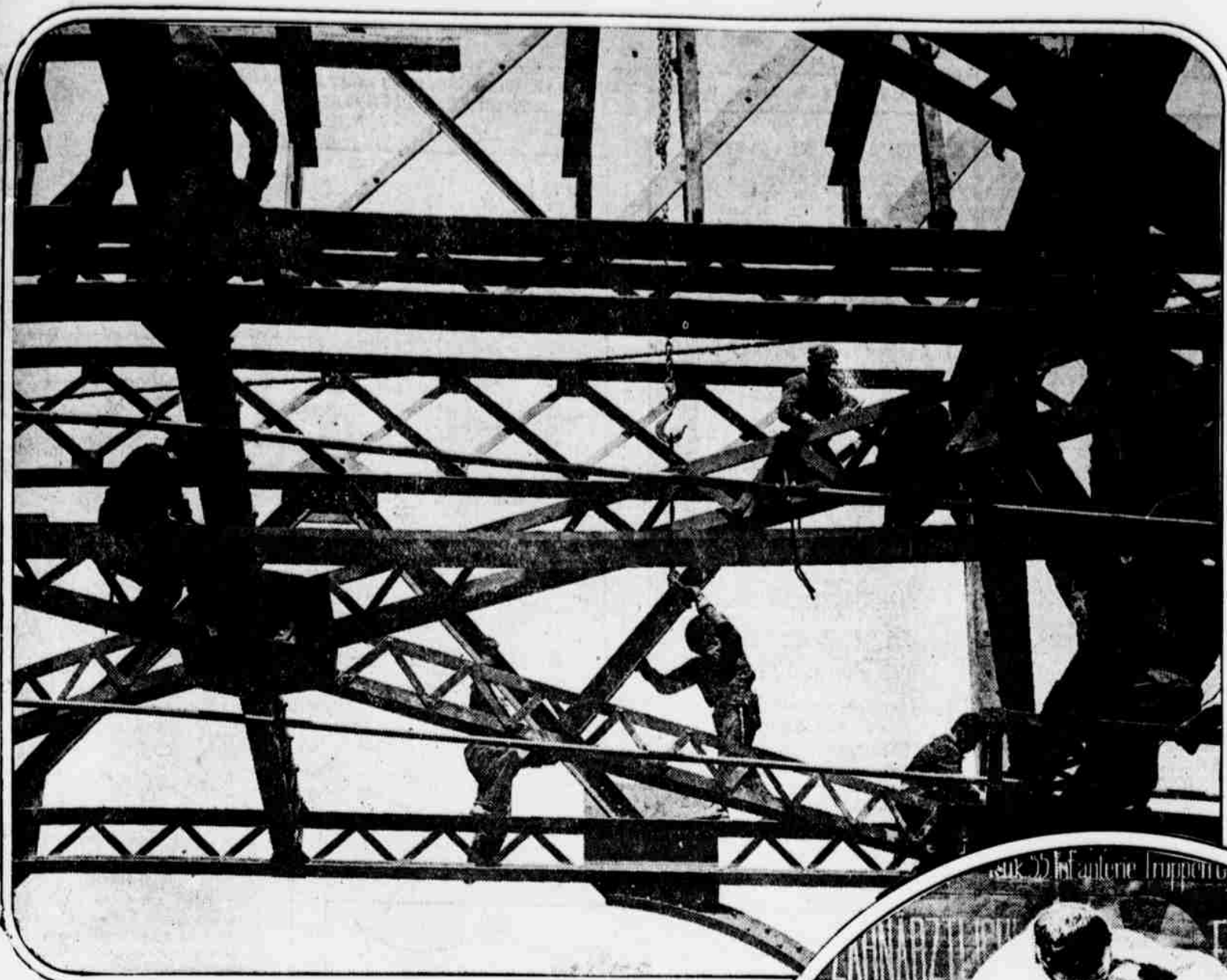


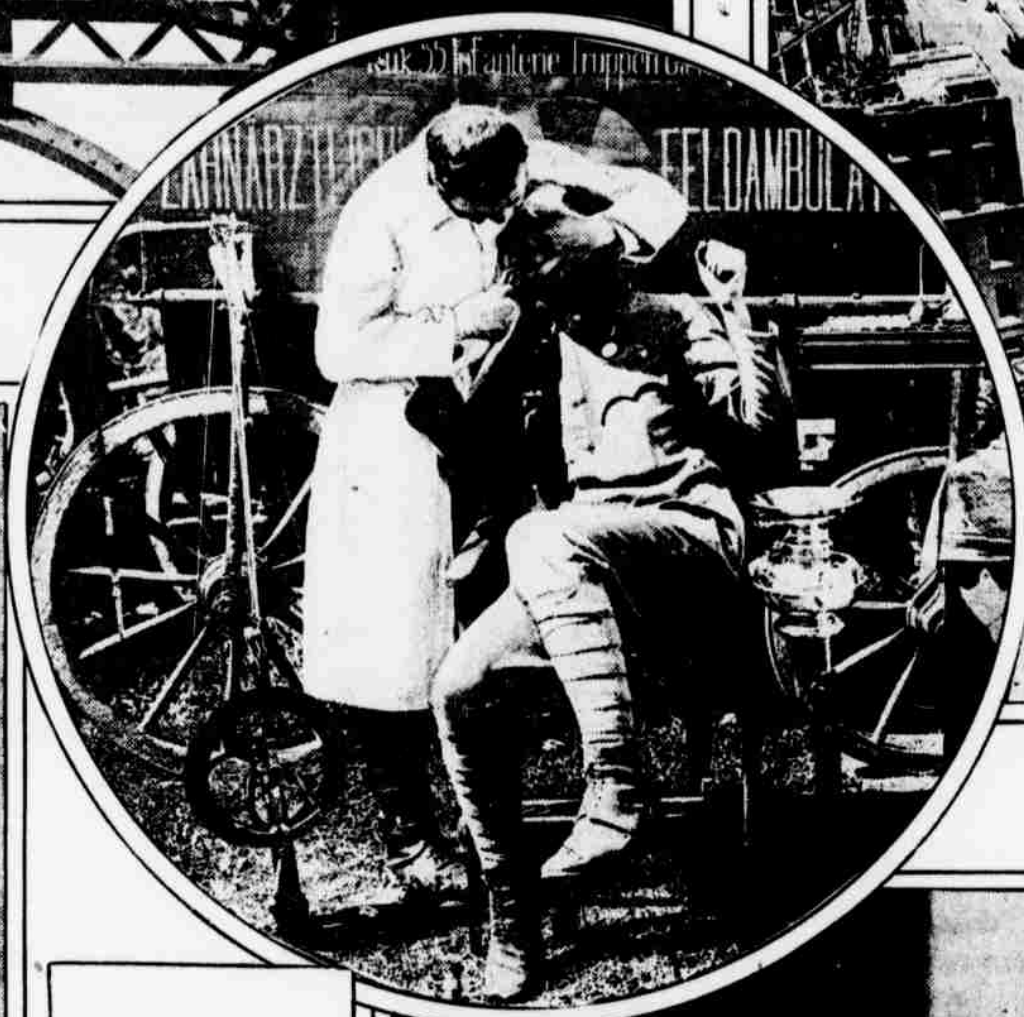

An EVENING LEDGER photographer made his way to the roof of the Bell Telephone Building to "take" the great municipal undertaking from a different vantage point.



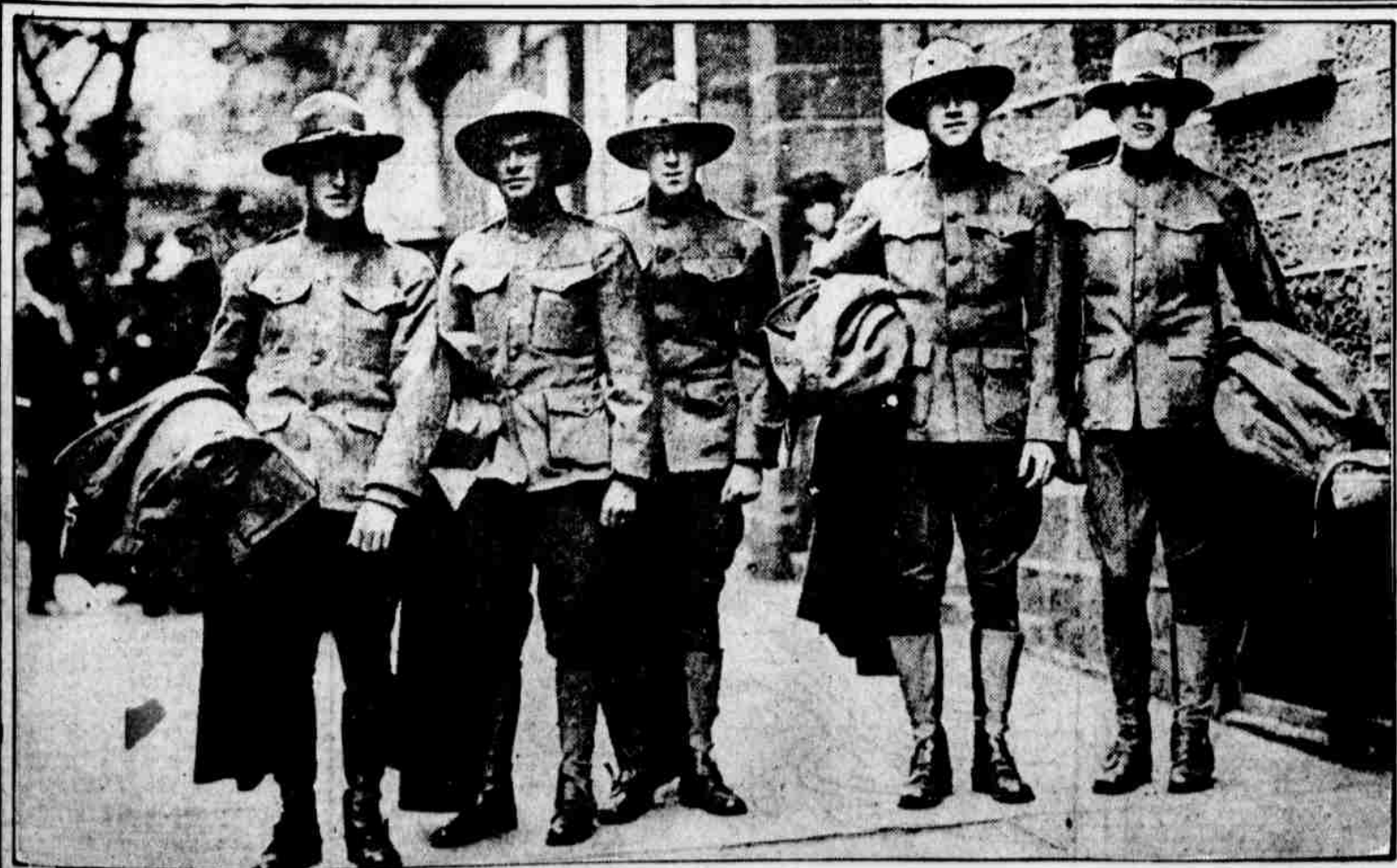
